


Insert USB receiver into a USB port on your computer. Wait up to 1 minute. Your mouse is now ready to use.

CHANGING THE BATTERY

- Open the cover
- Insert one AA battery following the polarity (+/-) marked

NOTE

- On some surfaces the use of a mouse pad may be necessary
- Turn the mouse OFF when travelling or not in use for long periods to conserve battery life

SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

- WinXP/ Win7/Win8/ Win10 etc.
- USB 2.0 port
- One AA battery (included)

Notes:

When the USB is connected to the computer, the vibration turns on. When the vibration abates, it needs a wired connection to charge.
