1 INTRODUCTION

The StreetSounds STS-170-RADIO is a proprietary digital transceiver module that is permitted for use ONLY in AirNetix-designed hosts. It is not intended for sale to the general OEM market and will not be used in any non-AirNetix host. AirNetix is solely responsible for maintaining the certification compliance of any host design in which the module will be used.

AirNetix will ensure that all host devices include the following wording on the product label.

Contains FCC ID: 2AB8BSTS170RADIO and IC: 1944A-ST5170RADIO

NOTE: THE GRANTEE IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY CHANGES OR MODIFICATIONS NOT EXPRESSLY APPROVED BY THE PARTY RESPONSIBLE FOR COMPLIANCE. SUCH MODIFICATIONS COULD VOID THE USER'S AUTHORITY TO OPERATE THE EQUIPMENT.

2 FCC STATEMENTS

2.1 LIMITATIONS OF USE

Per FCC KDB 9963690 D01 the STS-170-RADIO includes the following limitations.

1. The module is limited to OEM installation ONLY
2. The OEM integrators is responsible for ensuring that the end-user has no manual instructions to remove or install module
3. The module is limited to installation in mobile or fixed applications, according to Part 2.1091(b).
4. The separate approval is required for all other operating configurations, including portable configurations with respect to Part 2.1093 and different antenna configurations.

2.2 CLASS B DEVICES:

NOTE: This equipment has been tested and found to comply with the limits for a Class B digital device, pursuant to part 15 of the FCC Rules. These limits are designed to provide reasonable protection against harmful interference in a residential installation. This equipment generates uses and can radiate radio frequency energy and, if not installed and used in accordance with the instructions, may cause harmful interference to radio communications. However, there is no guarantee that interference will not occur in a particular installation. If this equipment does cause harmful interference to radio or television reception, which can be determined by turning the equipment off and on, the user is encouraged to try to correct the interference by one or more of the following measures:

- Reorient or relocate the receiving antenna.
- Increase the separation between the equipment and receiver.

- Connect the equipment into an outlet on a circuit different from that to which the receiver is connected.
- Consult the dealer or an experienced radio/TV technician for help.

2.3 RF EXPOSURE AND SAFETY INFORMATION

This equipment complies with FCC radiation exposure limits set forth for an uncontrolled environment. This equipment should be installed and operated with minimum distance **30cm** between the radiator and your body. This transmitter must not be co-located or operating in conjunction with any other antenna or transmitter. Access to the internal module is reasonably restricted by the host packaging.

3 INDUSTRY CANADA SPECIFIC STATEMENTS:

This device complies with Industry Canada license-exempt RSS standard(s). Operation is subject to the following two conditions: (1) this device may not cause interference, and (2) this device must accept any interference, including interference that may cause undesired operation of the device.
