The antenna is a **PCB Antenna** which permanently attached, and the best case gain of the antenna is **2.78dBi**. It complies with the standard requirement.



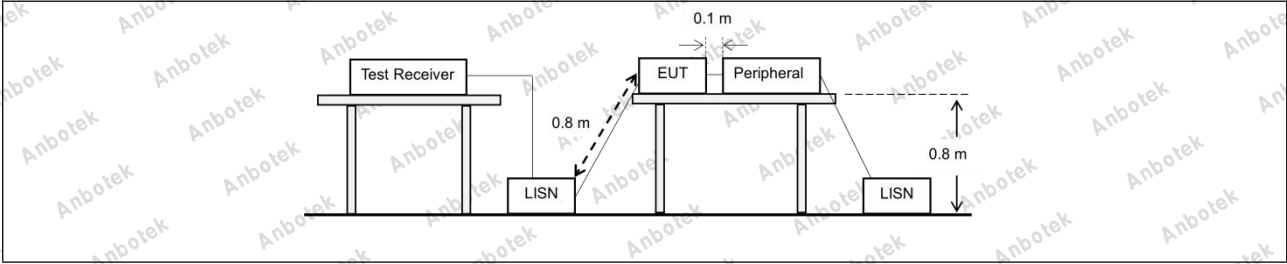
