2. TEST METHODOLOGY

The tests documented in this report were performed in accordance with ANSI C63.10-2009, FCC CFR 47 Part 2, FCC CFR 47 Part 15, RSS-GEN Issue 3, and RSS-210 Issue 8.

4. CALIBRATION AND UNCERTAINTY

4.1. MEASURING INSTRUMENT CALIBRATION

The measuring equipment utilized to perform the tests documented in this report has been calibrated in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, and is traceable to recognized national standards.

4.2. SAMPLE CALCULATION

Where relevant, the following sample calculation is provided:

4.3. MEASUREMENT UNCERTAINTY

Where relevant, the following measurement uncertainty levels have been estimated for tests performed on the apparatus:

The EUT is 802.11 B/G/N 1X1 HT20, + BT4.0 (LE) + GSM1900/850 PHONE

The transmitter has a maximum peak conducted output power as follows:

5.3. DESCRIPTION OF AVAILABLE ANTENNAS

The radio utilizes an FPCB antenna, with a maximum gain of 1.23 dBi.

5.4. SOFTWARE AND FIRMWARE

Software version was 3.4.5-1887255-eng

The firmware used was I9060XXEAMJ5

5.5. WORST-CASE CONFIGURATION AND MODE

Radiated emission and power line conducted emission were performed with the EUT set to transmit at the channel with highest output power as worst-case scenario.

The fundamental of the EUT was investigated in three orthogonal orientations X,Y,Z, it was determined that Z orientation was worst-case orientation; therefore, all final radiated testing was performed with the EUT in Y orientation.

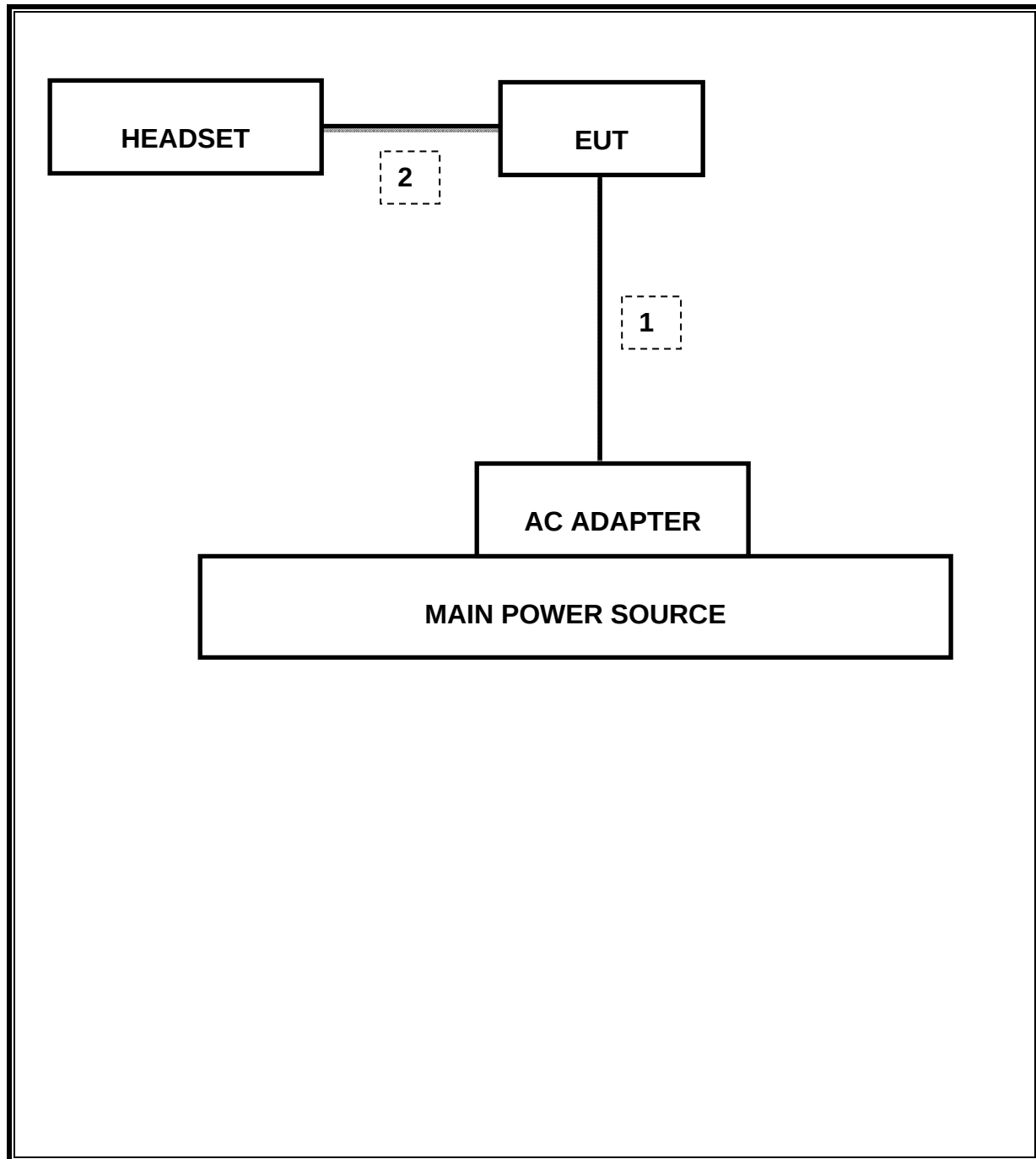

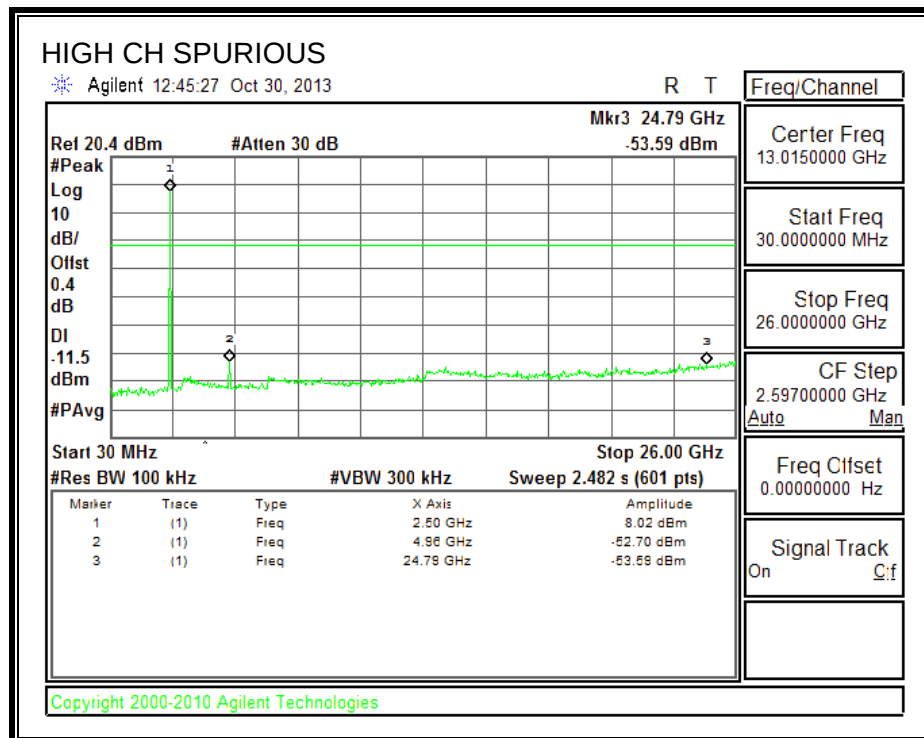
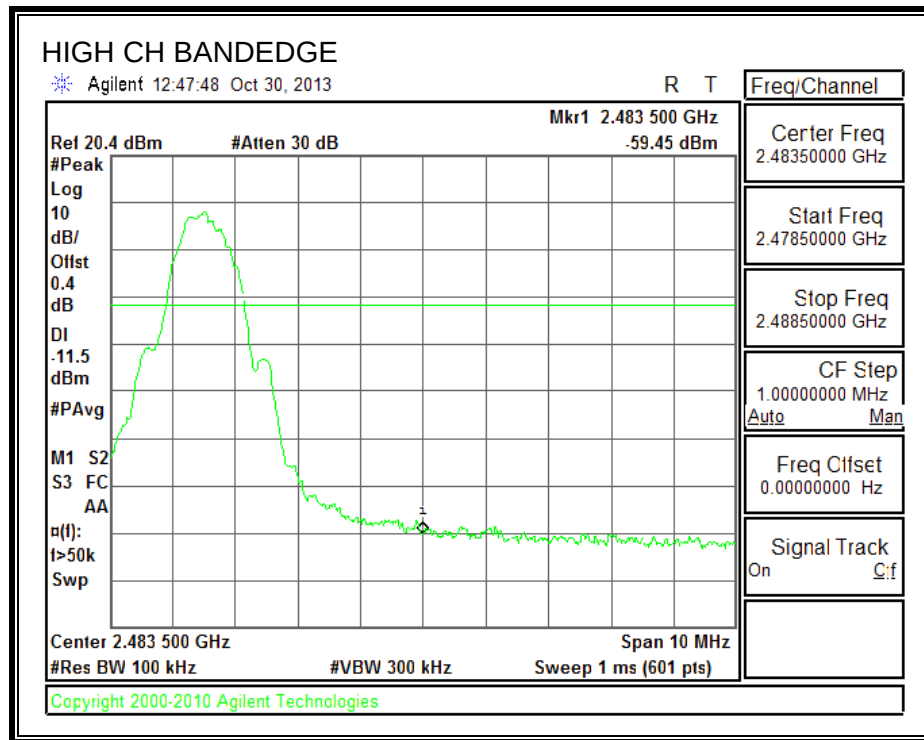
SPURIOUS EMISSIONS, LOW CHANNEL

TEST PROCEDURE

The EUT is placed on a non-conducting table 80 cm above the ground plane. The antenna to EUT distance is 3 meters. The EUT is configured in accordance with ANSI C63.4 - 2009. The EUT is set to transmit in a continuous mode.

For measurements below 1 GHz the resolution bandwidth is set to 100 kHz for peak detection measurements or 120 kHz for quasi-peak detection measurements. Peak detection is used unless otherwise noted as quasi-peak.

For measurements above 1 GHz the resolution bandwidth is set to 1 MHz, then the video bandwidth is set to 1 MHz for peak measurements and add duty cycle factor for average measurements. Duty cycle factor = $10 \log (1/x)$. For this sample: DCF = $10\log(1/0.618)=2.08\text{dB}$ (Spectrum Analyzer round it up to 2.1dB)

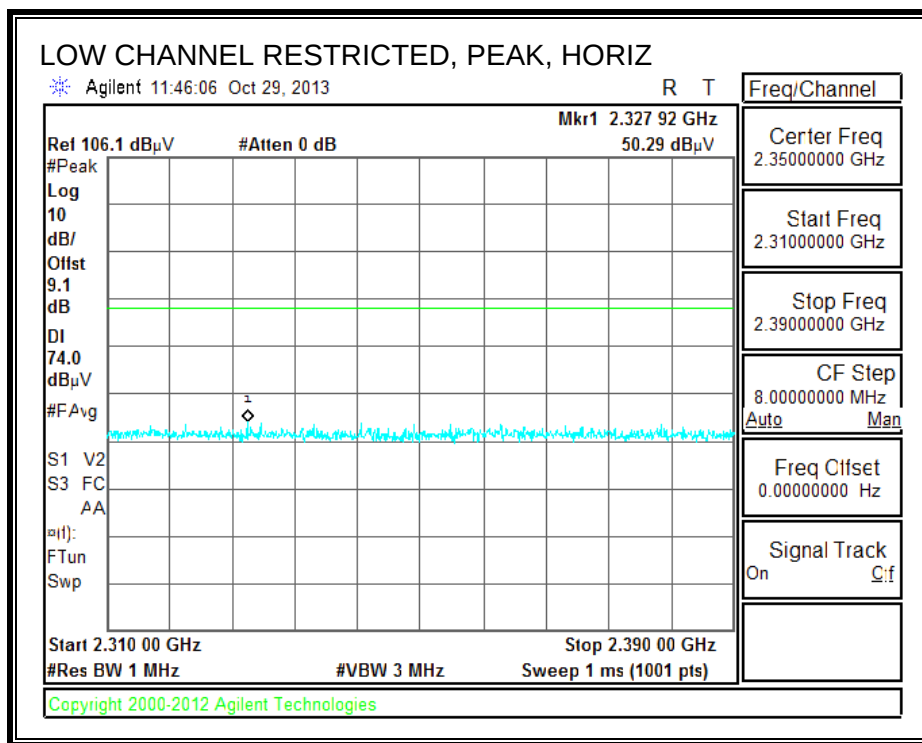
The spectrum from 30 MHz to 26 GHz is investigated with the transmitter set to the lowest, middle, and highest channels in the 2.4 GHz band.

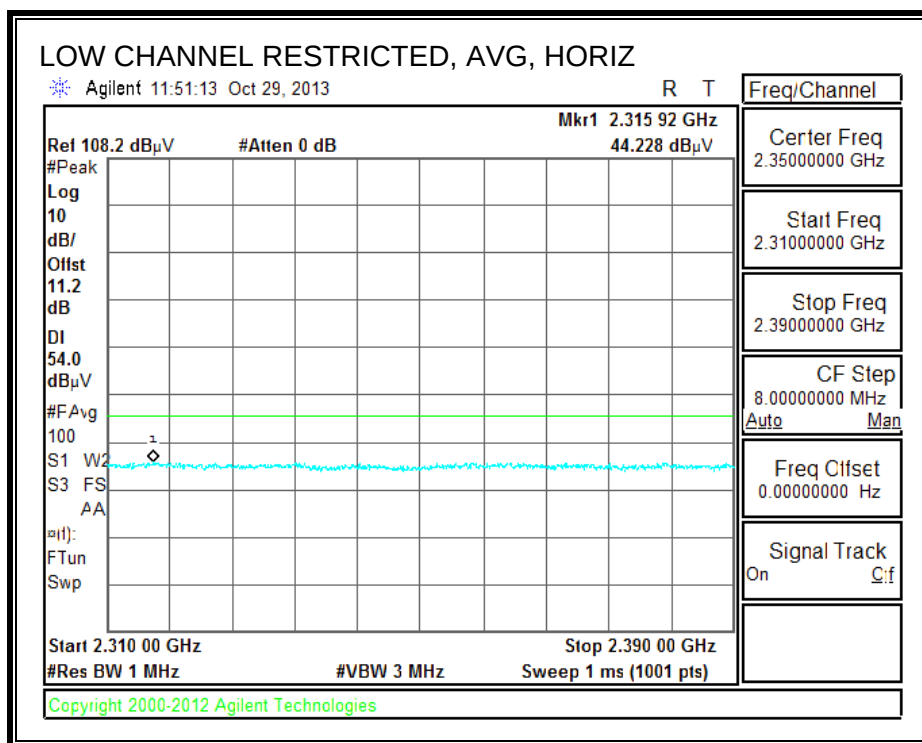
The spectrum from 30 MHz to 40 GHz is investigated with the transmitter set to the lowest, middle, and highest channels in each applicable band.

The frequency range of interest is monitored at a fixed antenna height and EUT azimuth. The EUT is rotated through 360 degrees to maximize emissions received. The antenna is scanned from 1 to 4 meters above the ground plane to further maximize the emission. Measurements are made with the antenna polarized in both the vertical and the horizontal positions.

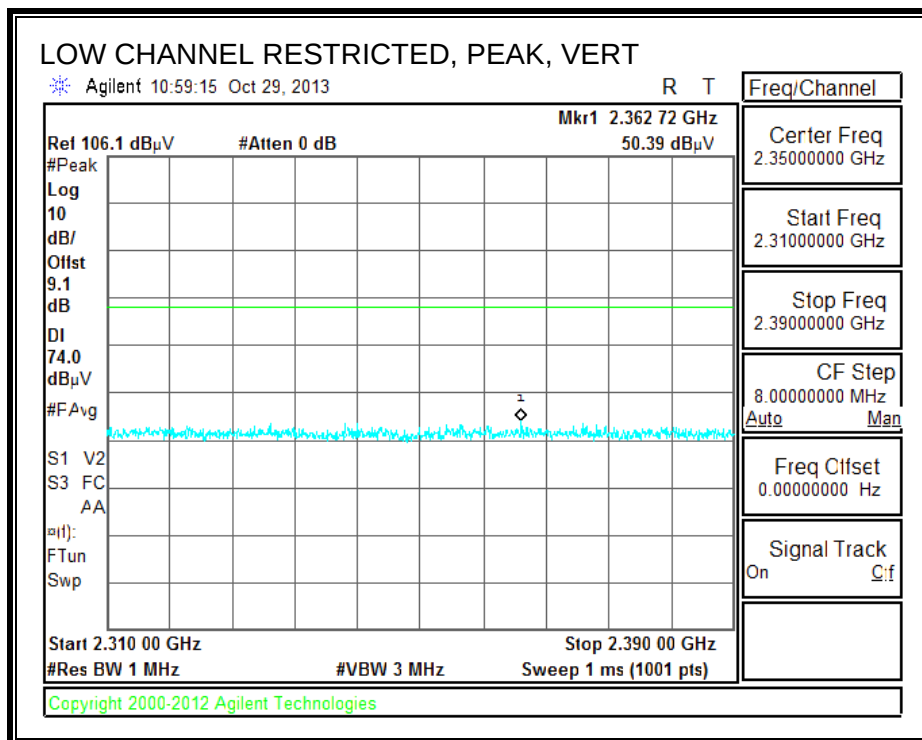

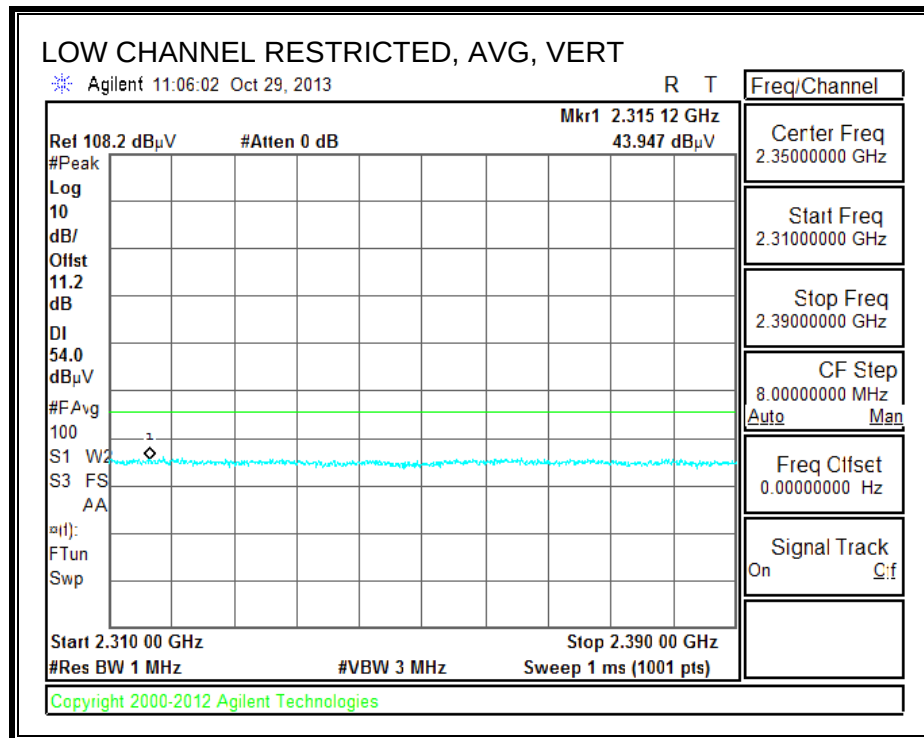
RESTRICTED BANDEDGE (LOW CHANNEL, HORIZONTAL)



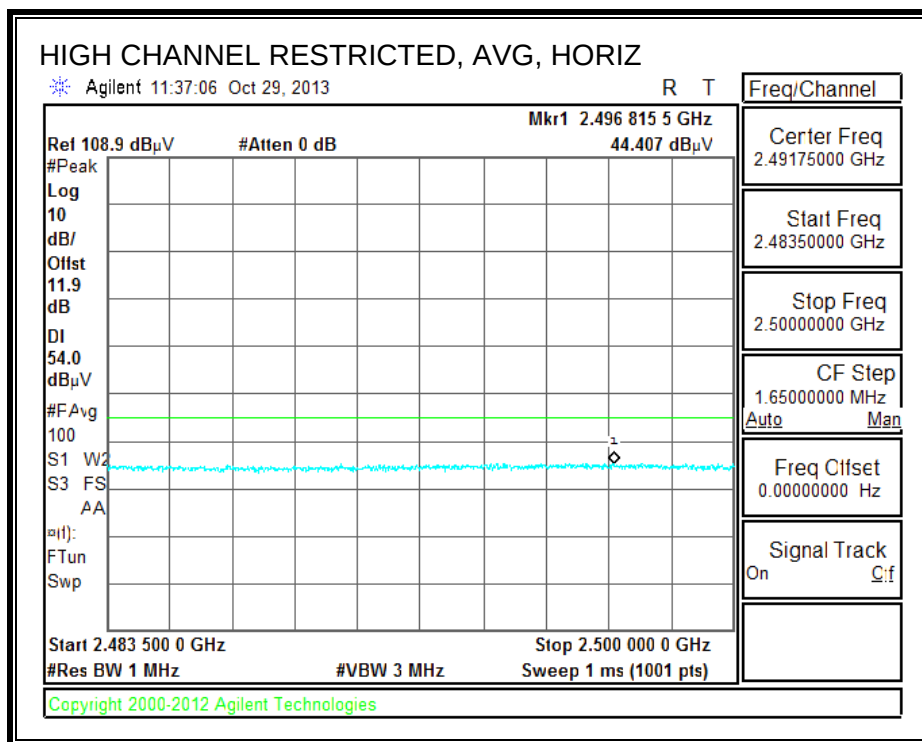
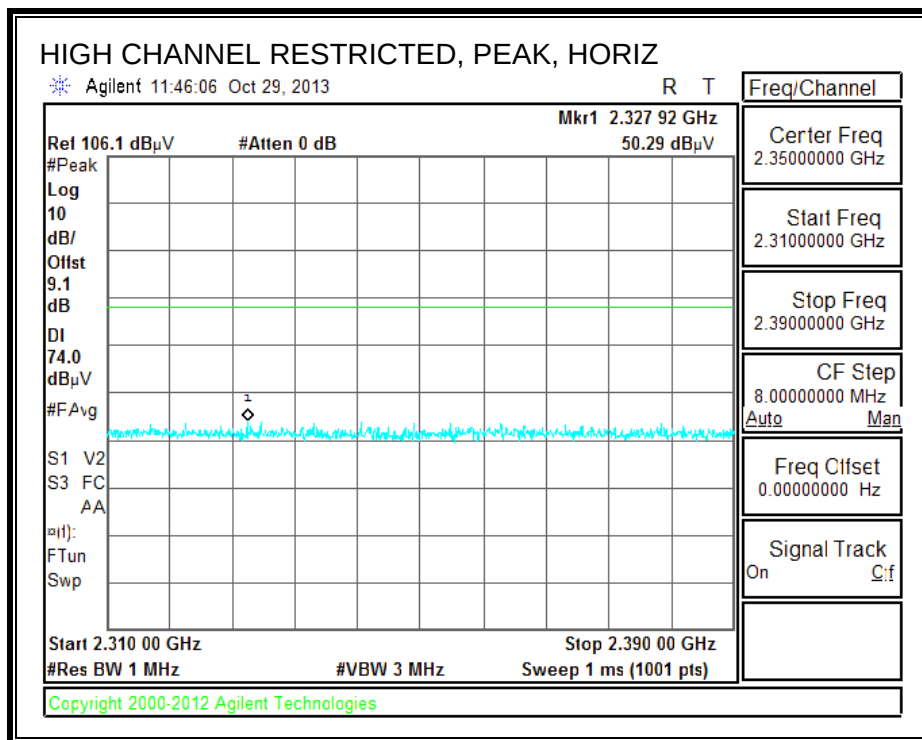


RESTRICTED BANDEDGE (LOW CHANNEL, VERTICAL)

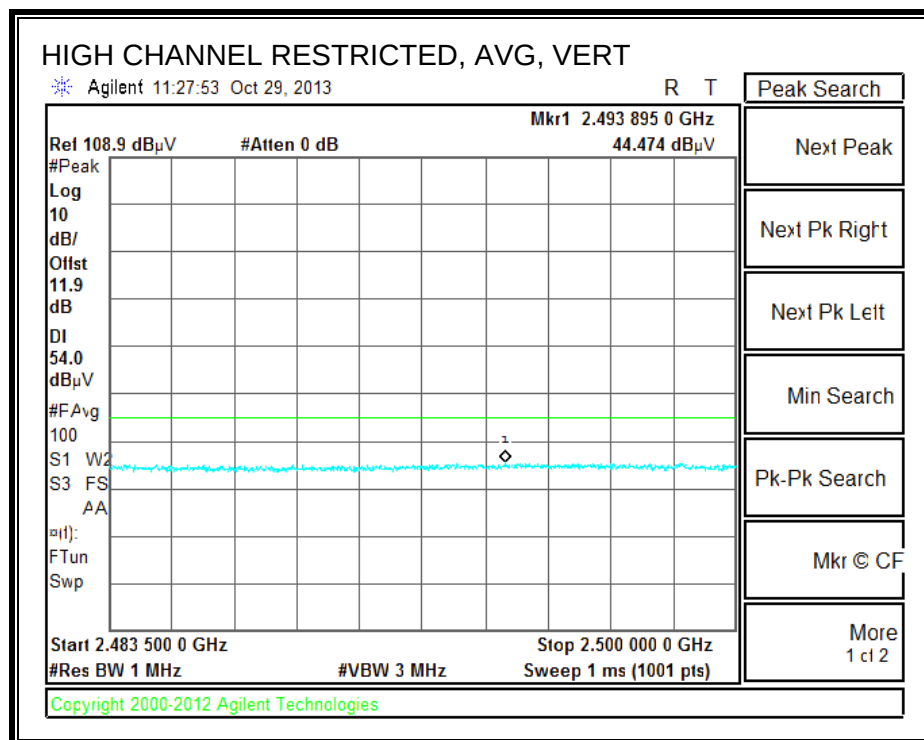
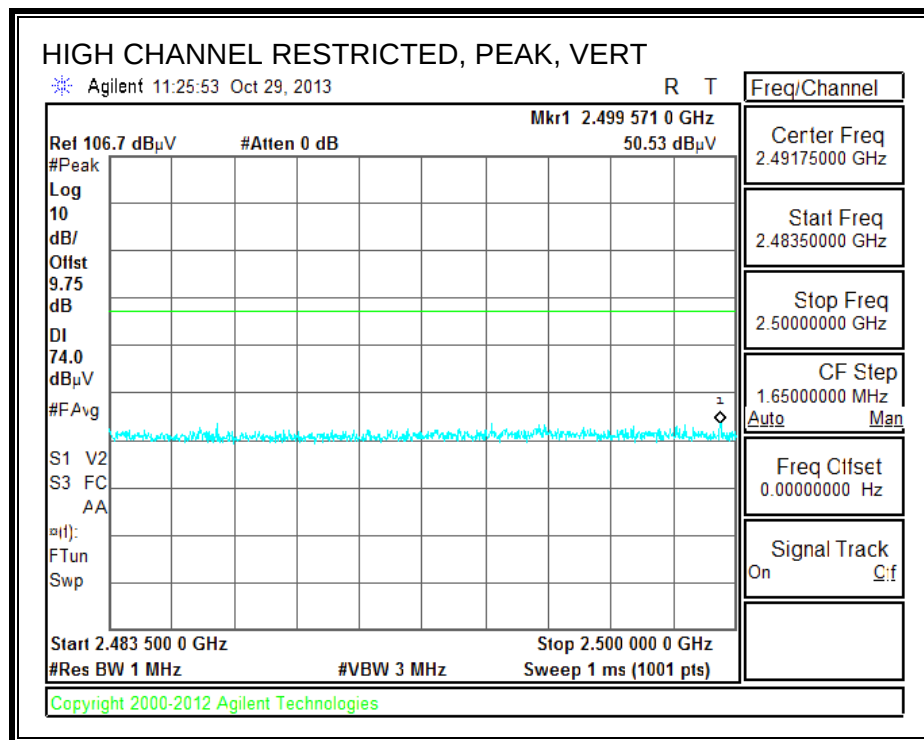




RESTRICTED BANDEDGE (HIGH CHANNEL, HORIZONTAL)

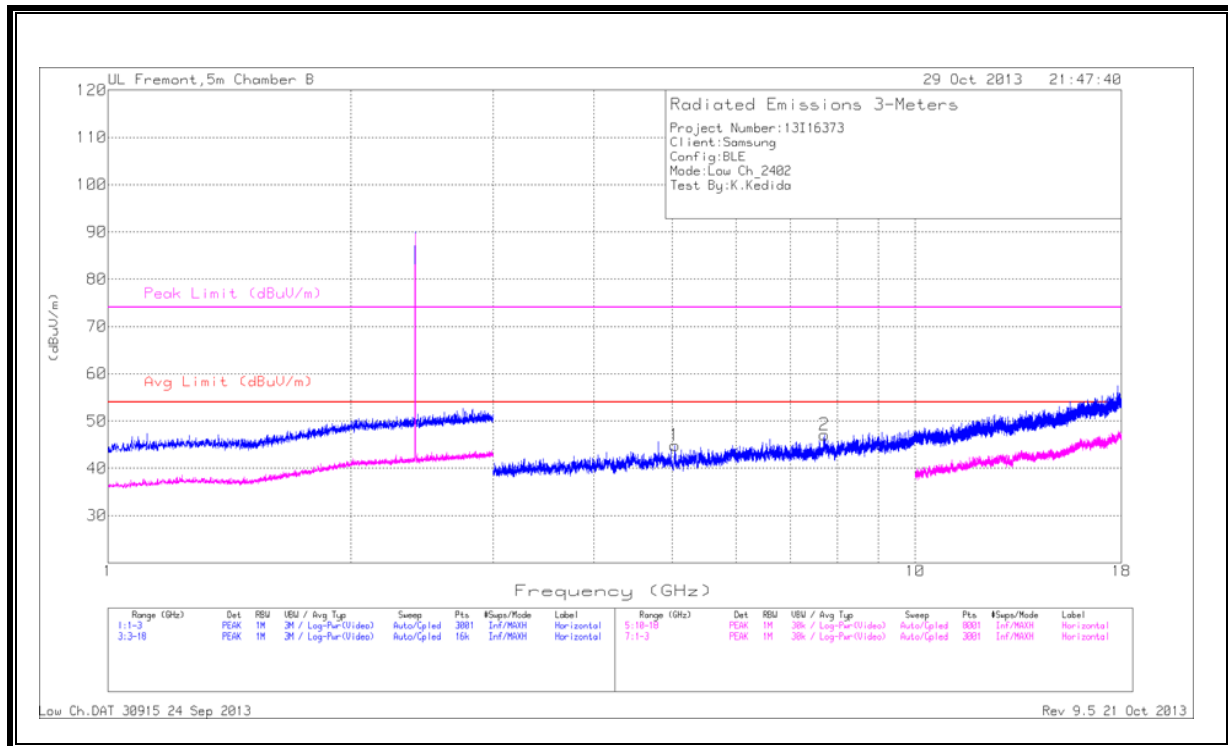

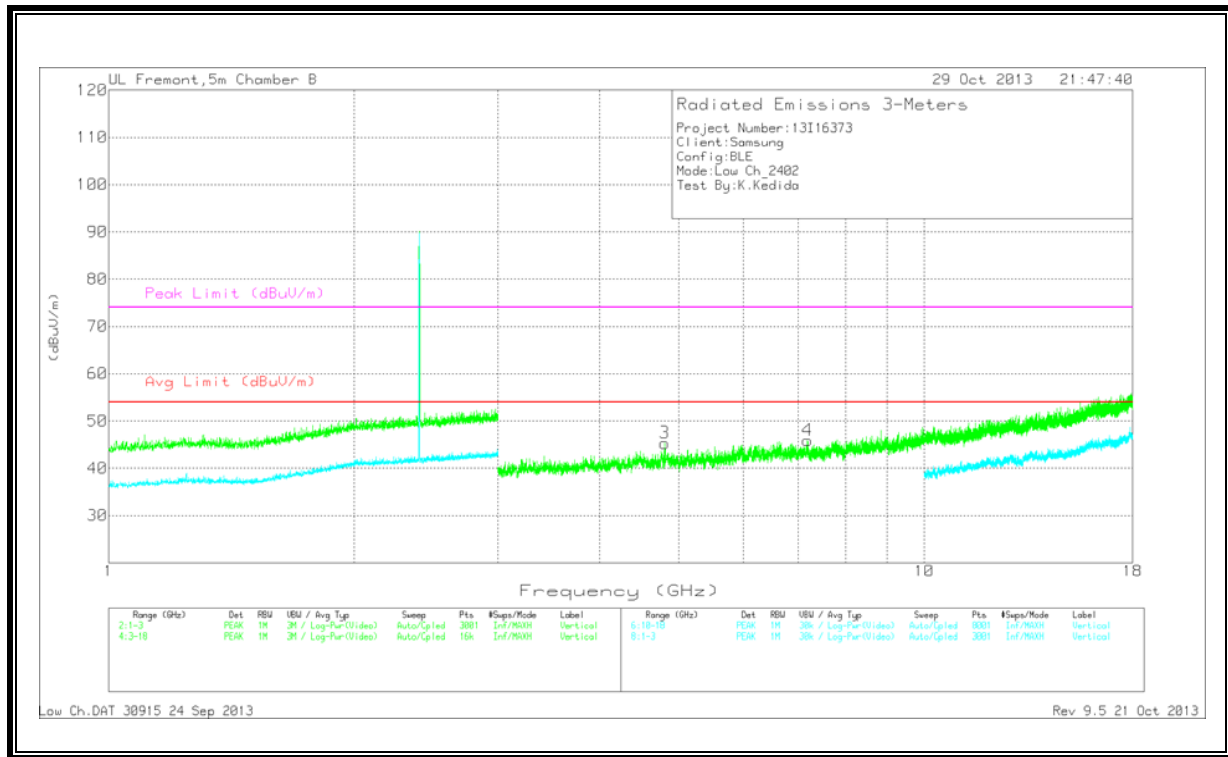
