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This device is designed for installation and use in the USA and Canada. For operation in other countries, please consult Nortel Networks for alternate product models.

This device contains one RLAN radio operating in the 2.4 GHz band and one RLAN radio operating in the 5 GHz bands.

Regulatory statements pursuant to CFR 47 Part 15 for the United States

This device complies with Part 15 of the FCC Rules. Operation is subject to the following two conditions: (1) this device may not cause harmful interference, and (2) this device must accept any interference received, including interference that may cause undesired operation.

General Installation Considerations

This device has been evaluated and found to be compliant to the requirements addressing RF exposure from radio frequency devices for an uncontrolled environment. The RF emissions of this device are below the FCC limits. However, it is nevertheless generally advisable that radio transmitting equipment should always be installed and used in a manner so as to minimise exposure during normal operation.

When installed in indoor or outdoor locations using approved antennas, the product shall be installed in a fixed location with a minimum separation of 20 cm from all persons during normal use and shall not be used with any accessories not listed as approved in this manual.

When installed in outdoor locations using approved external 5 GHz antennas, the product shall be installed in a fixed location with a minimum separation of 30 cm from all persons during normal use and shall not be used with any accessories not listed as approved in this manual.

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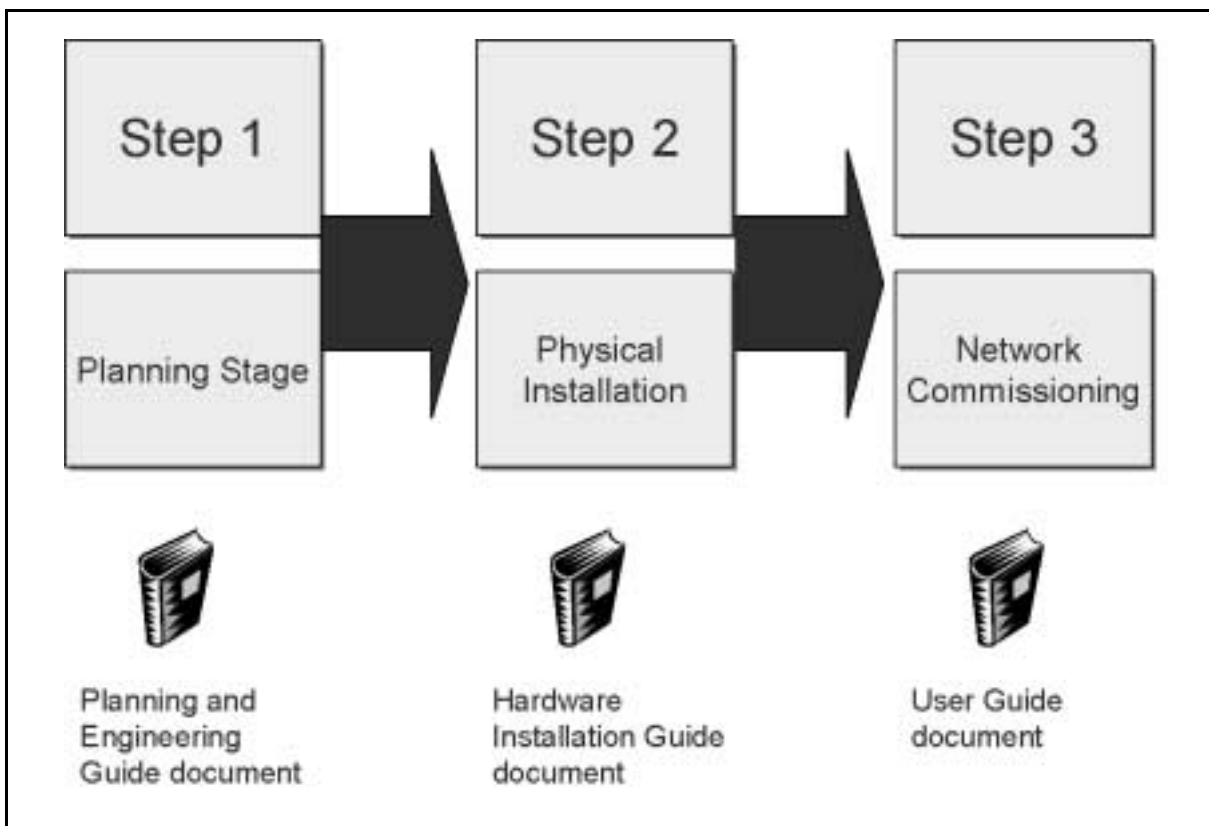

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Installing the Wireless AP7220

This chapter provides an overview of the steps required to perform a physical installation of the AP7220 (Wireless Access Point 7220). It also outlines the pre-requisite steps that should already have been completed at the planning and engineering phase. For complete information about installing, configuring, monitoring, and managing the AP7220 in a Wireless Mesh Network, refer to “Related documents” on page 1-xii.

Before attempting installation, you should read through this entire section carefully.

Limitations and Restrictions

AP7220 Standard Package

The AP7220 base unit includes integrated 5 GHz antennas.

If you have purchased the NTE300AA package it includes the following items (see Figure 1-1):

- Wireless Access Point with attached power cable and integrated 2.4 GHz antennas
- 3/4 inch “T” type electrical junction box
- Installation guide (this booklet)

If you have purchased the NTE300BB package it includes the following items (see Figure 1-2):

- Wireless Access Point with attached power cable
- 3/4 inch “T” type electrical junction box
- Installation guide (this booklet)
- Two co-linear 2.4 GHz antennas
- Two antenna protective weatherproofing boots

The standard package contents for package NTE300AA and NTE300BB are shown in Figure 1-1 and Figure 1-2 (items mentioned may not be exactly as shown).

AP7220 Standard package contents (PIFA antenna) - NTE300AA

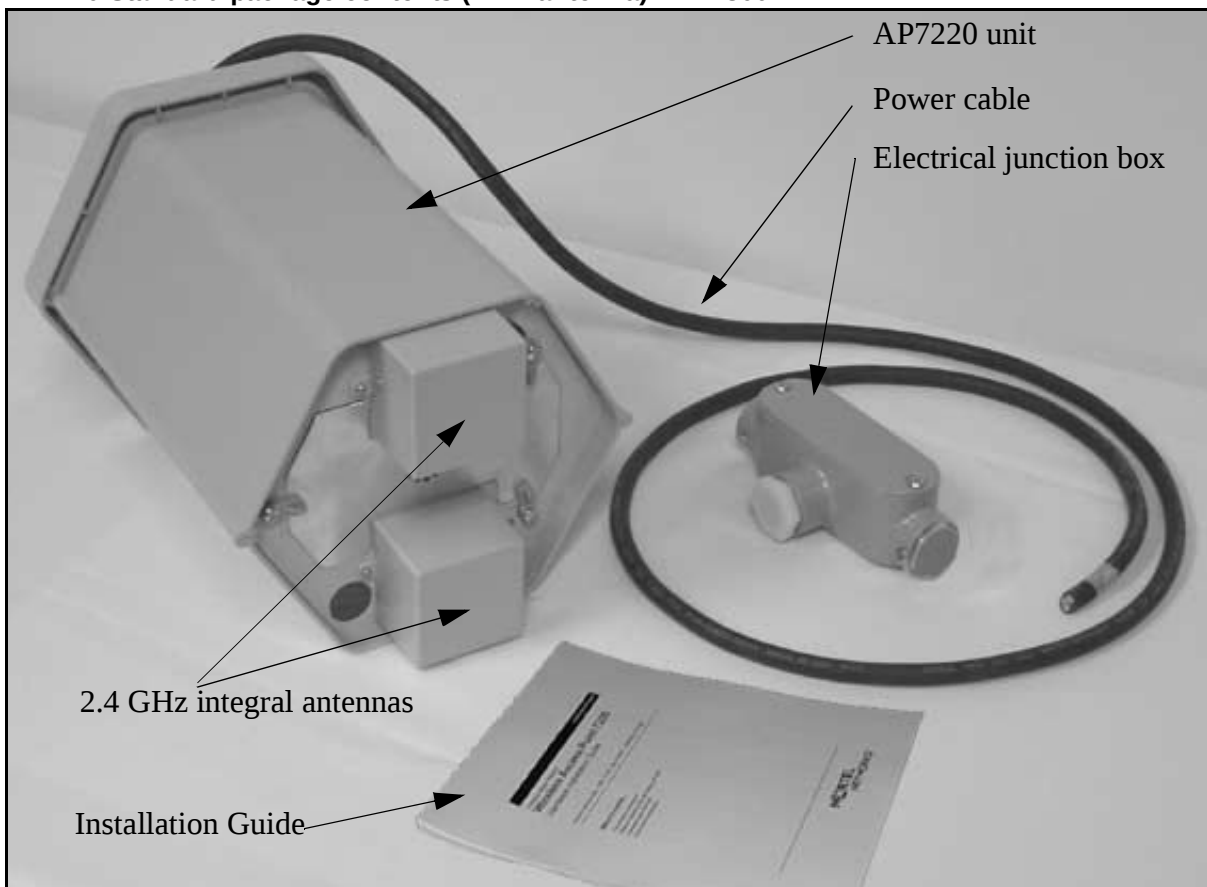
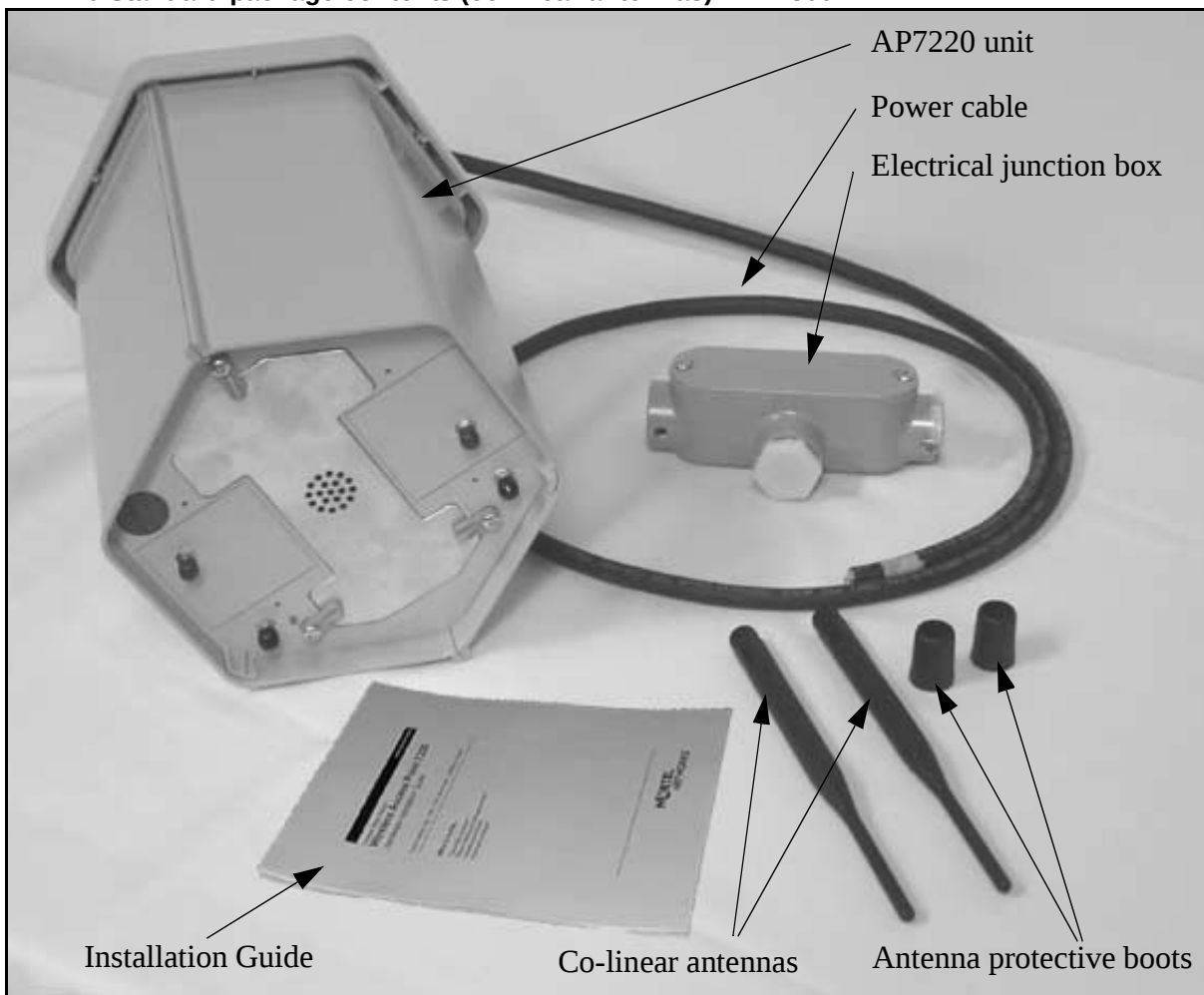

Optional Accessories

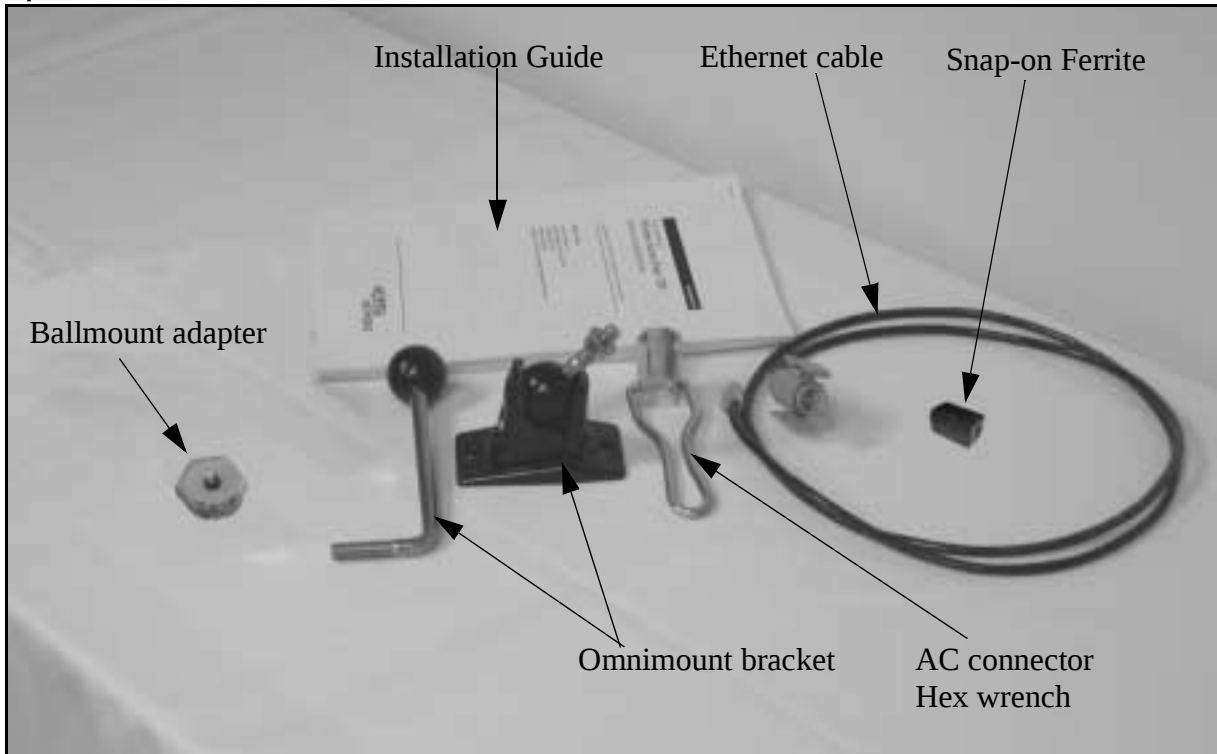
The following optional accessories are also available for ordering:

- Omnimount* vertical and side mounting hardware bracket and Ball mount adapter
- Ethernet cables for indoor or outdoor options:
 - 25-metre connectorized CAT5 cable (indoor) or CAT5 outdoor-rated cable
 - 50-metre connectorized CAT5 cable (indoor) or CAT5 outdoor-rated cable
 - 100-metre connectorized CAT5 cable (indoor) or CAT5 outdoor-rated cable
- Snap-On Ferrite to be attached to Ethernet Cable upon installation (Steward, p/n: 28A2025-0A0 - Nortel CPC code: A0643364).
- AC Connector Hex wrench tool - for tightening AC power cable plug (Phoenix-Contact model QSS 19 order number 1670895)
- Approved external 5 GHz antennas:
 - 13 dBi Huber+Suhner* SPA5600140/14/0/V Planar Antenna
 - 18 dBi Andrew Corporation* #FPA5250D06-N
 - 23.6 dBi Andrew Corporation* #FPA5250D12-N (**Note:** Restricted to outdoor use only)

Installation Overview

Before installing the unit, review the “Limitations and Restrictions” and “Safety Guidelines” at the start of this chapter.

Installation involves the following tasks:

- Review “Installation Pre-requisites”
- Review “Physical Installation Requirements”
- Review “Installation Scenarios and Flowchart”

These tasks are described briefly below.

Installation Pre-requisites

The AP7220 is intended for installation as part of a Wireless Mesh Network. Before the AP7220 unit is installed and powered up, ensure that the procedures described in the Planning and Engineering Guide have been performed.

Physical Installation Requirements

The AP7220 unit is designed to be installed vertically with the baseplate facing down (in indoor or outdoor locations).

When installing the unit in an indoor location with approved antennas, choose a location that provides a minimum separation of 20 cm from all persons during normal operation.

When installing the unit in an outdoor location with approved antennas, choose a location that provides a minimum separation of 30 cm from all persons during normal operation.

Choose a location that minimizes the possibility of vandalism or accidental harm to the unit.

Choose a location that has line of sight with neighboring units.

Record the serial number and the location of each AP7220 unit. These records may be used for subsequent network management and maintenance.

Supplying Available Power

The AP7220 may be conveniently powered from sources available at the location of the installation. A continuous supply of power is required for continuous operation of the unit. Power can be supplied to the AP7220 from the following sources:

Mains AC Source

The AP7220 can be powered from AC supplies in the range 100V-240V and 45Hz-65Hz.

90V to 350V DC Source

The AP7220 can be powered by a DC input ranging from 90V to 350V.

Installation Scenarios and Flowchart

AP7220 mounting methods are determined by the characteristics of the location at which the AP7220 is to be installed.

The AP7220 unit is always installed vertically with the baseplate facing down. It can be installed using:

- side mounting methods
- vertical mounting methods

Using a side mounting method, the AP7220 can be installed:

- on the side of a post (such as a lamp post)
- on the side of a building

Using a vertical mounting method the AP7220 can be installed:

- below a curved post (such as a lamp post)
- below a ceiling

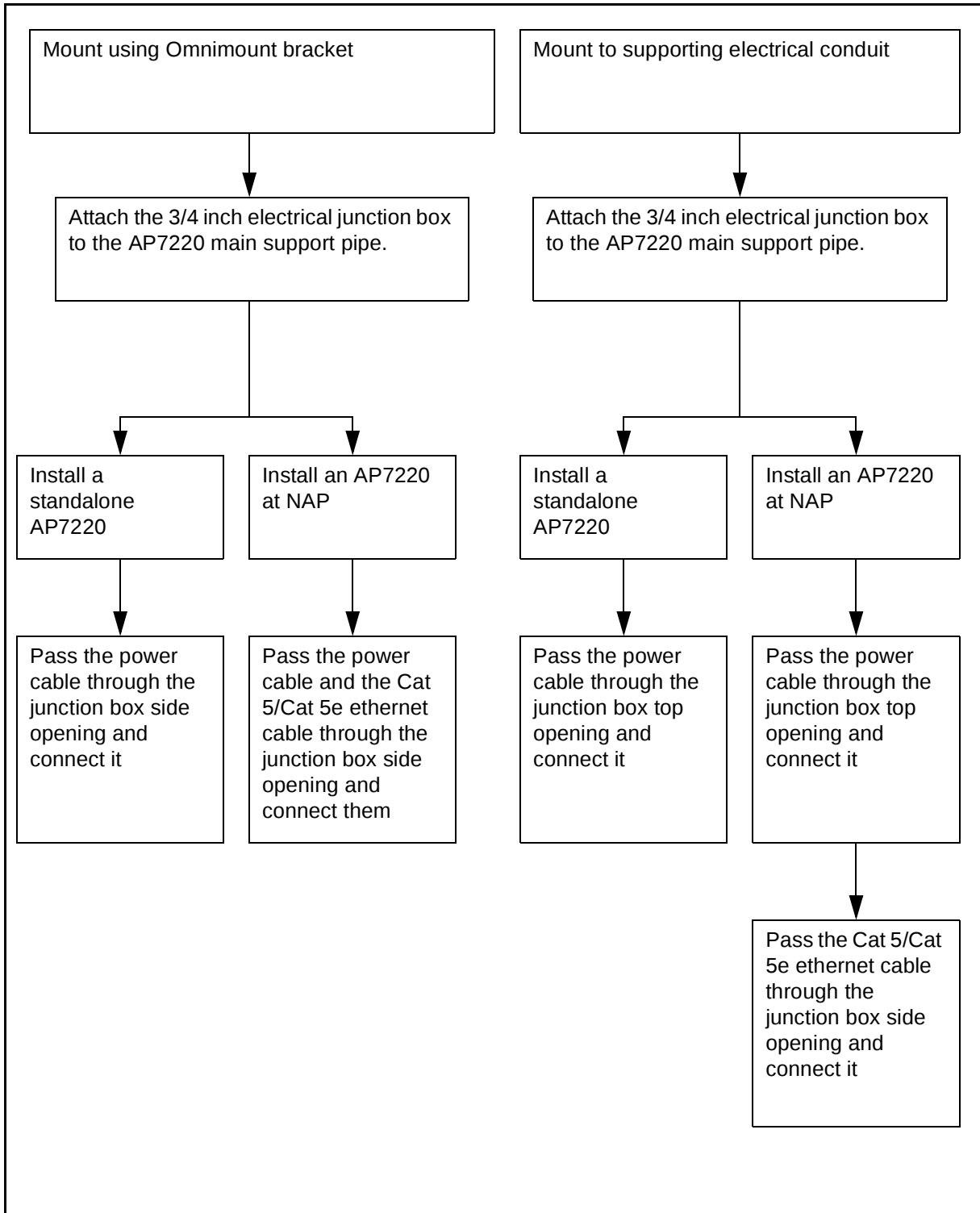
The flowchart shown at the end of this section details the sequence in which the AP7220 installation is to be performed. Use the flowchart to determine which procedures and tasks should be performed for your particular installation scenario.

The installation scenarios described in this manual are as follows:

- Standalone AP7220 mounted using Omnimount bracket
- AP7220 at NAP mounted using Omnimount bracket
- Standalone AP7220 mounted directly to supporting electrical conduit
- AP7220 at NAP mounted directly to supporting electrical conduit

The flowchart below consolidates the scenarios listed above into two basic installation scenarios based on mounting methods.
