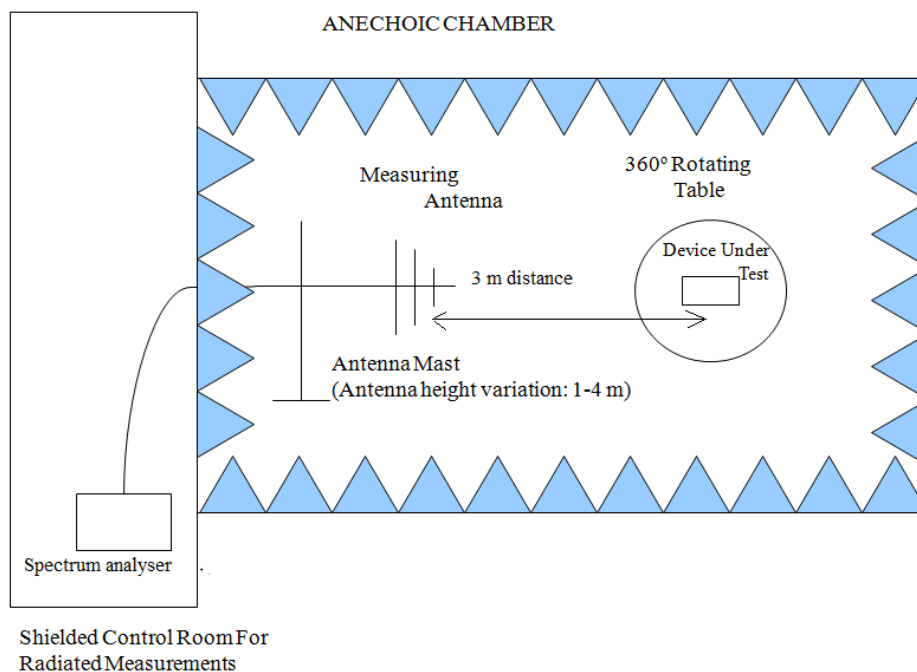

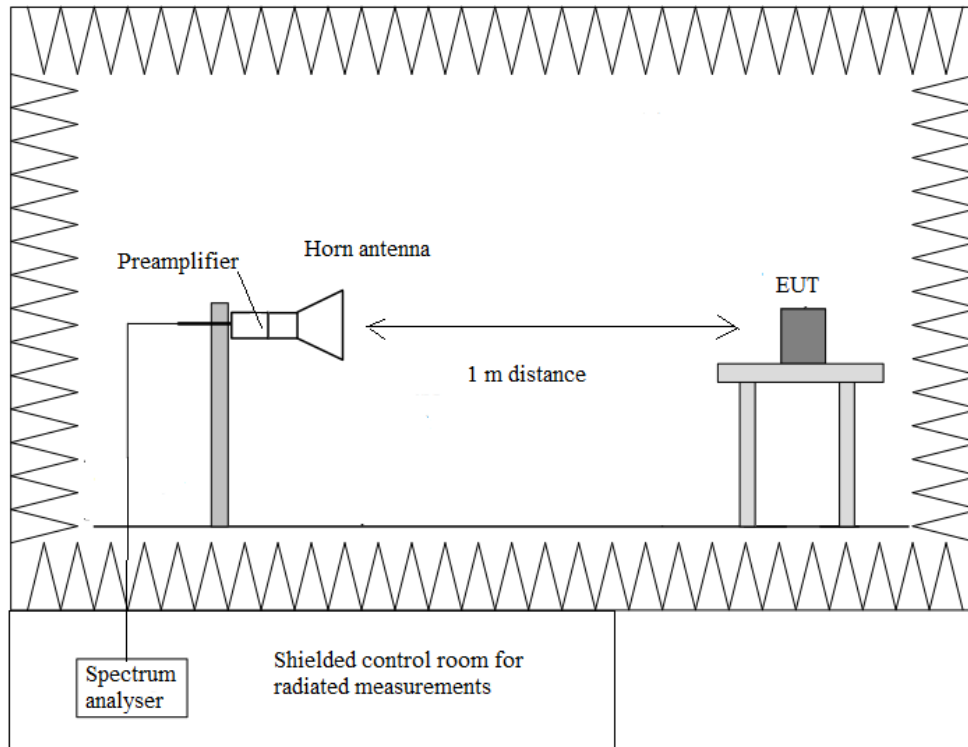

Radiated measurements setup $f > 1$ GHz



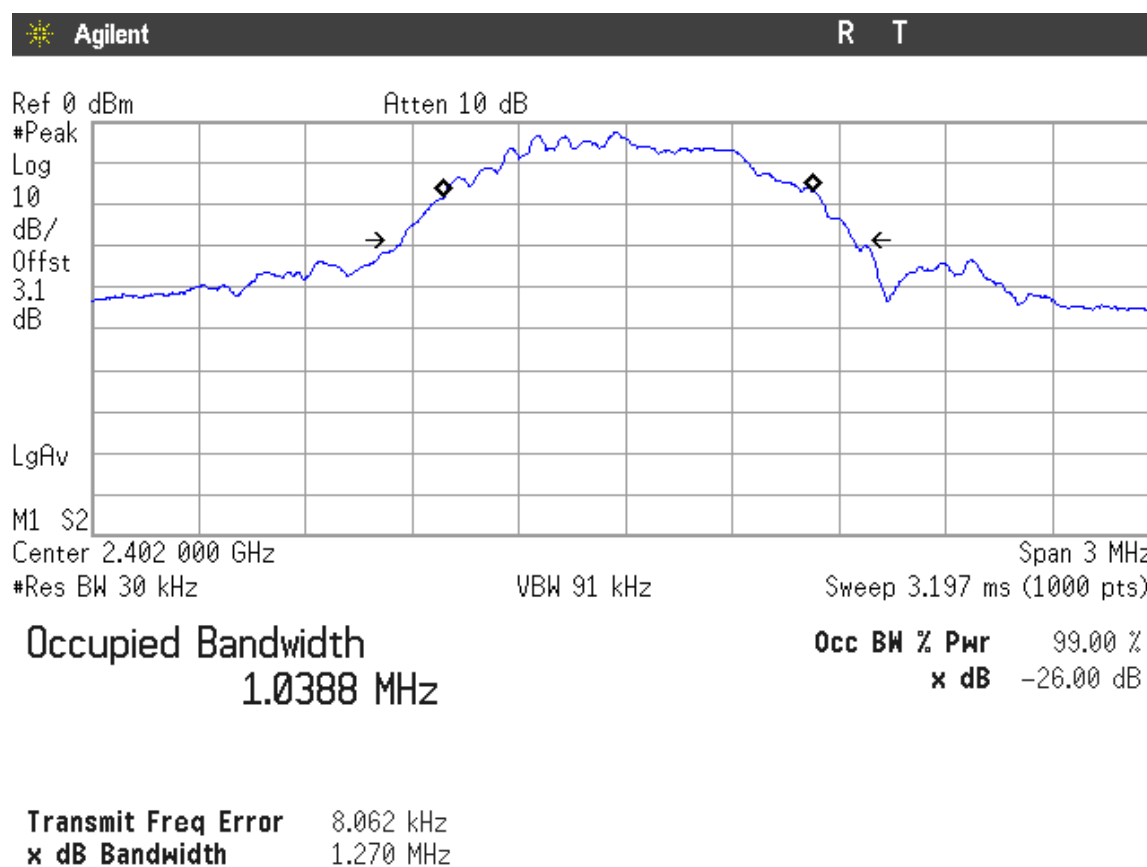

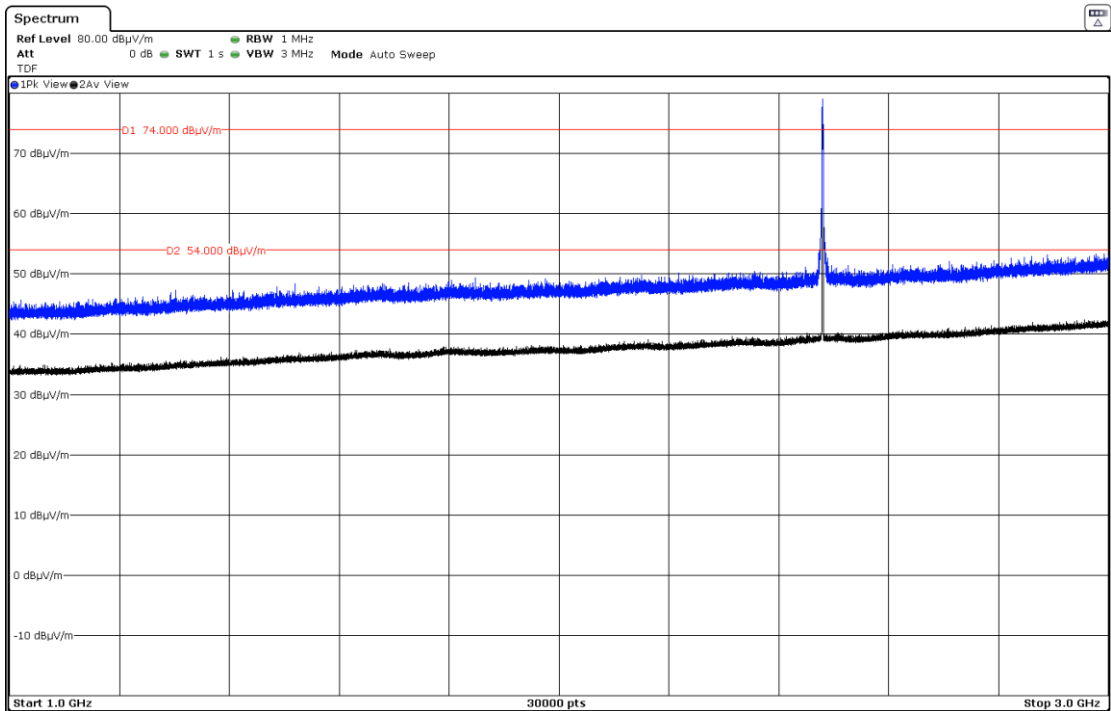

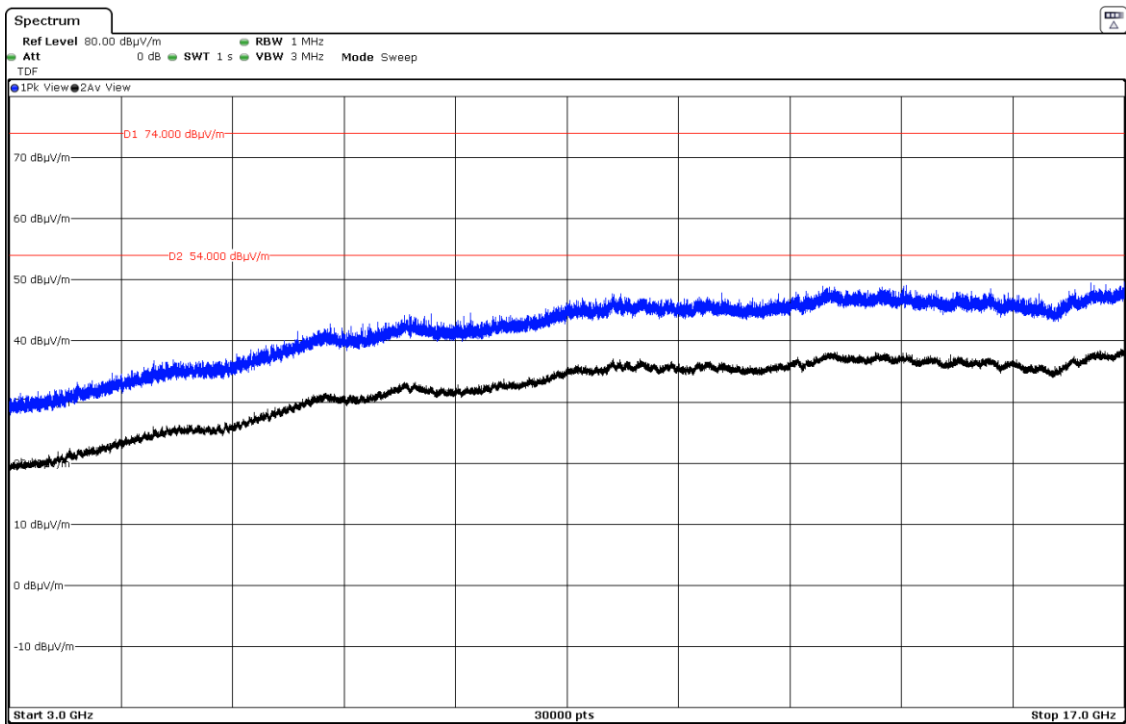

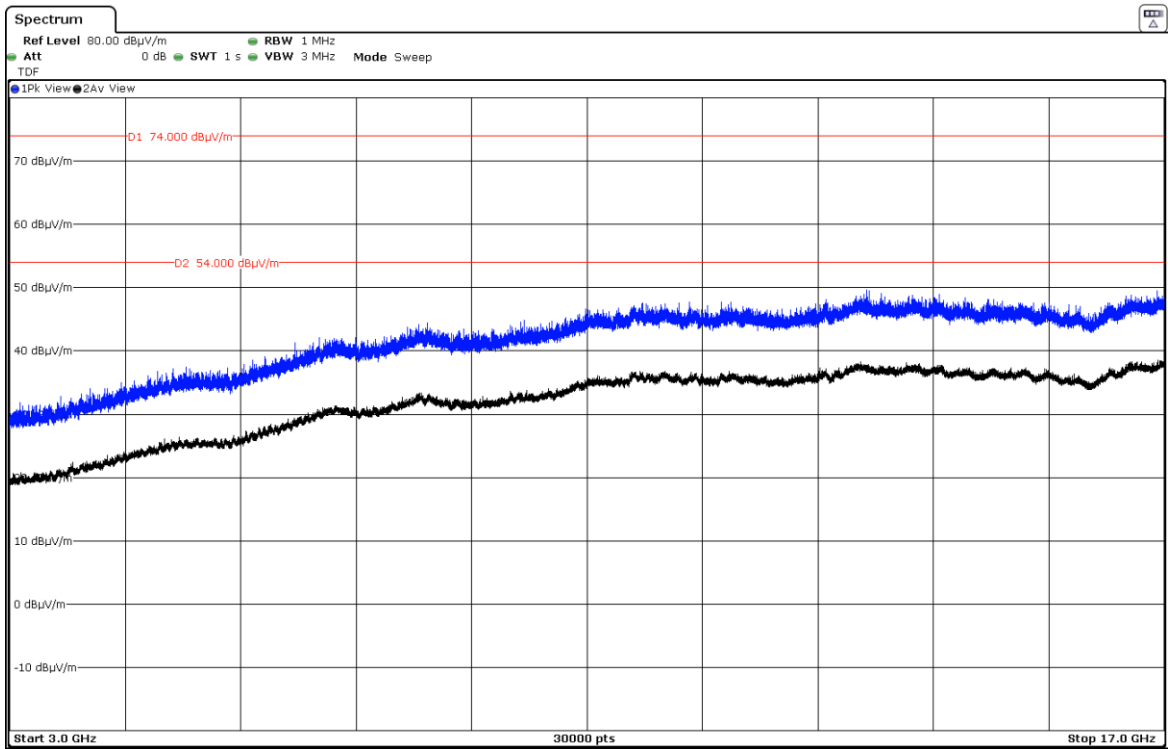

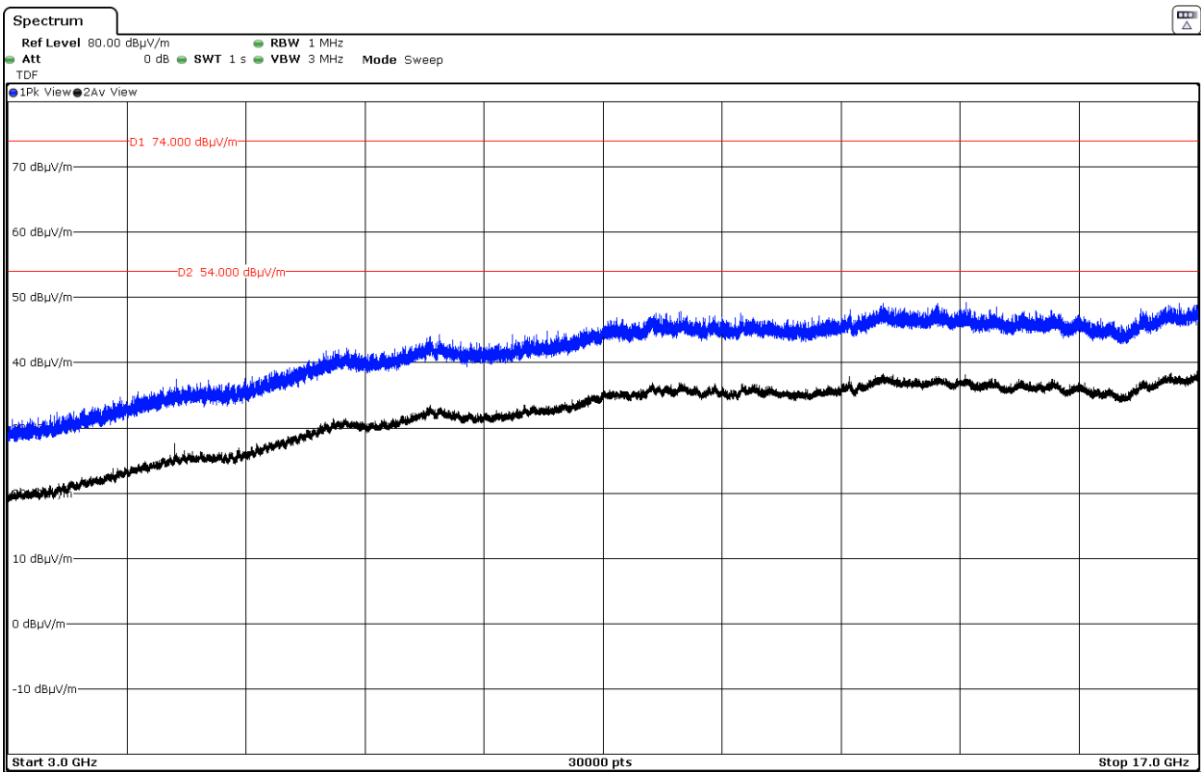

CHANNEL: Middle (2440 MHz).

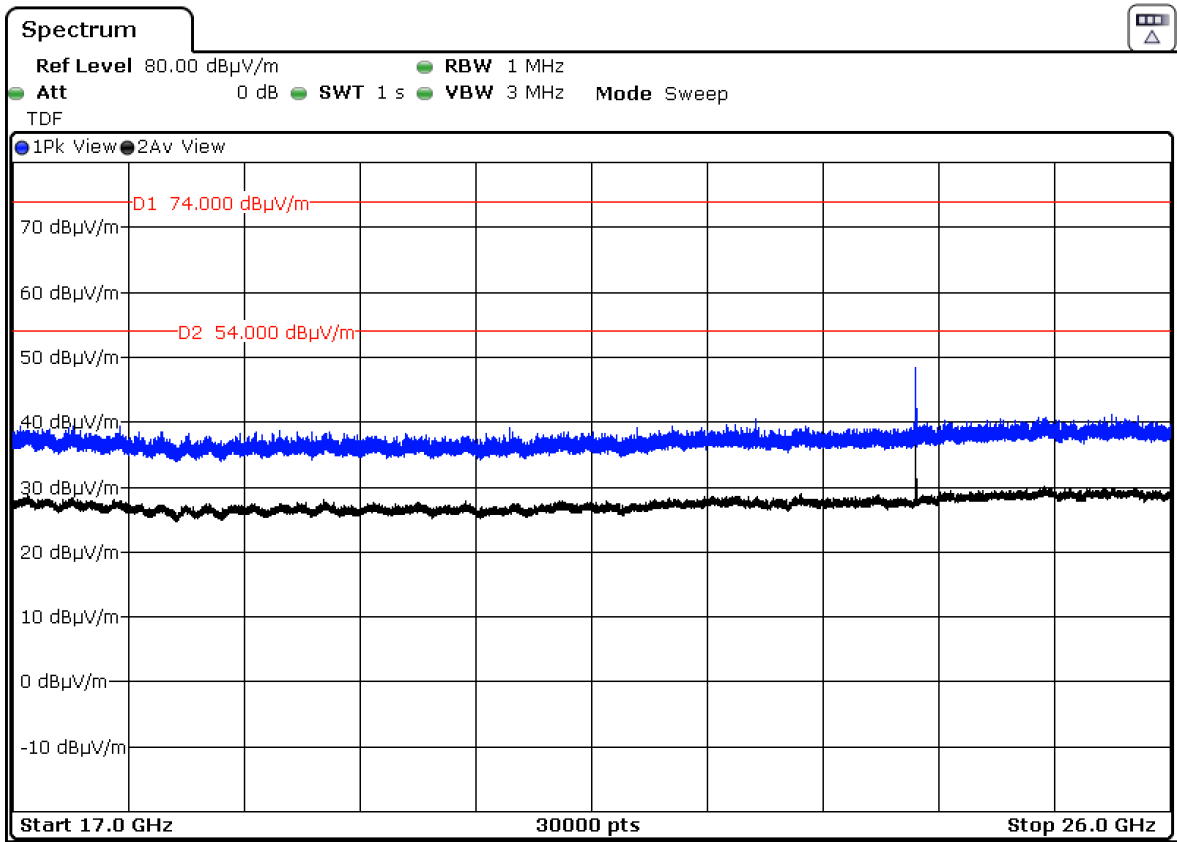


CHANNEL: Highest (2480 MHz).

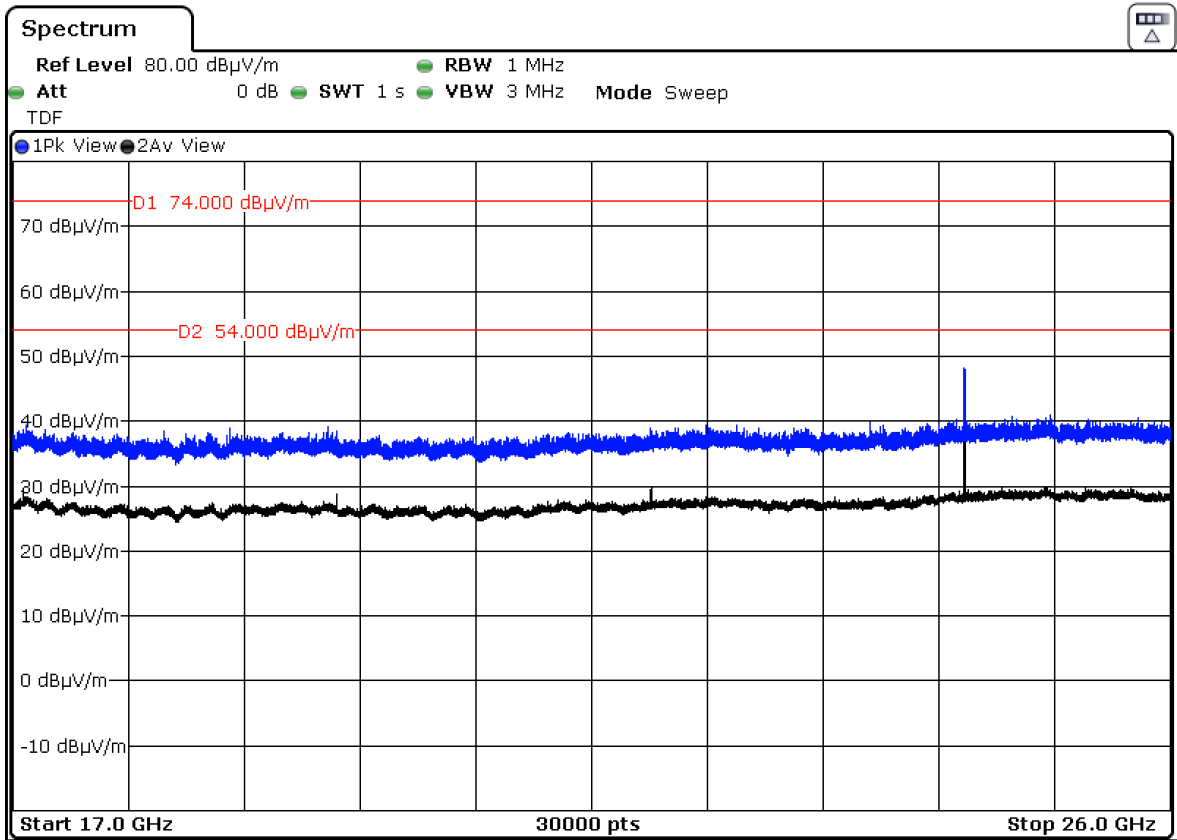


FREQUENCY RANGE 17 GHz to 26 GHz.

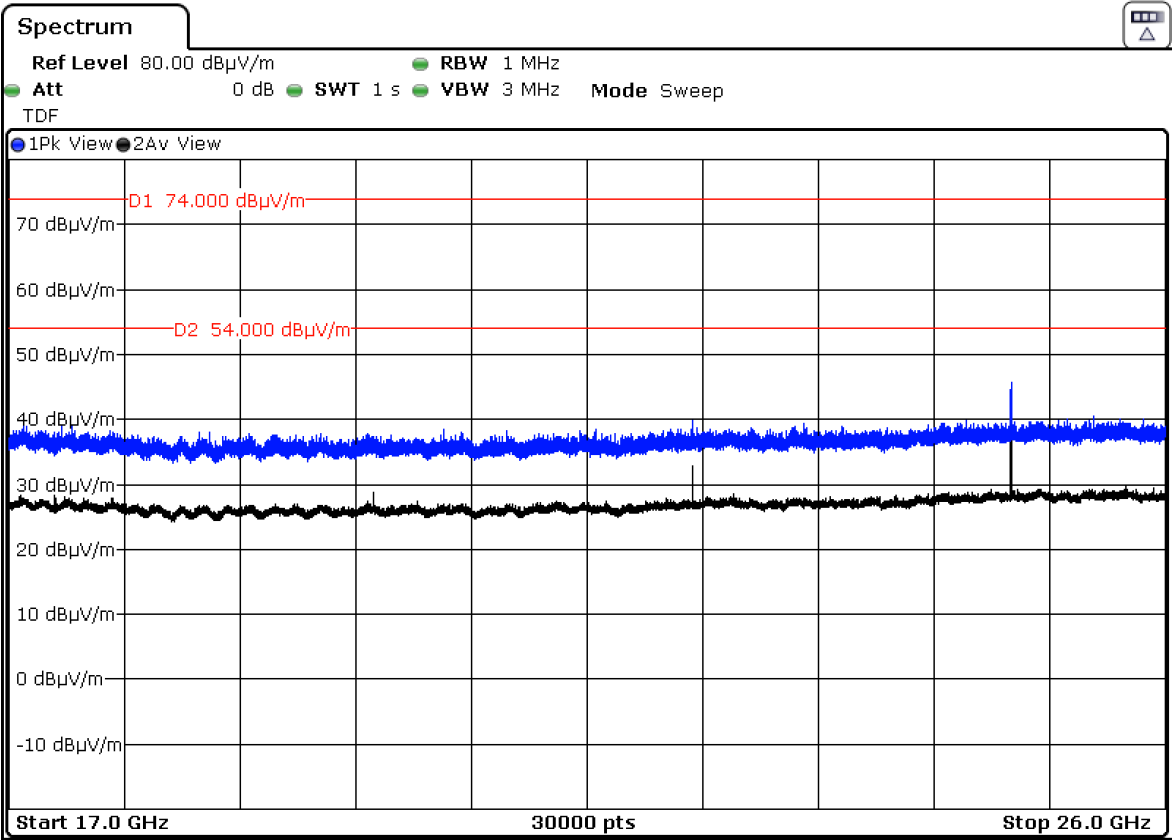

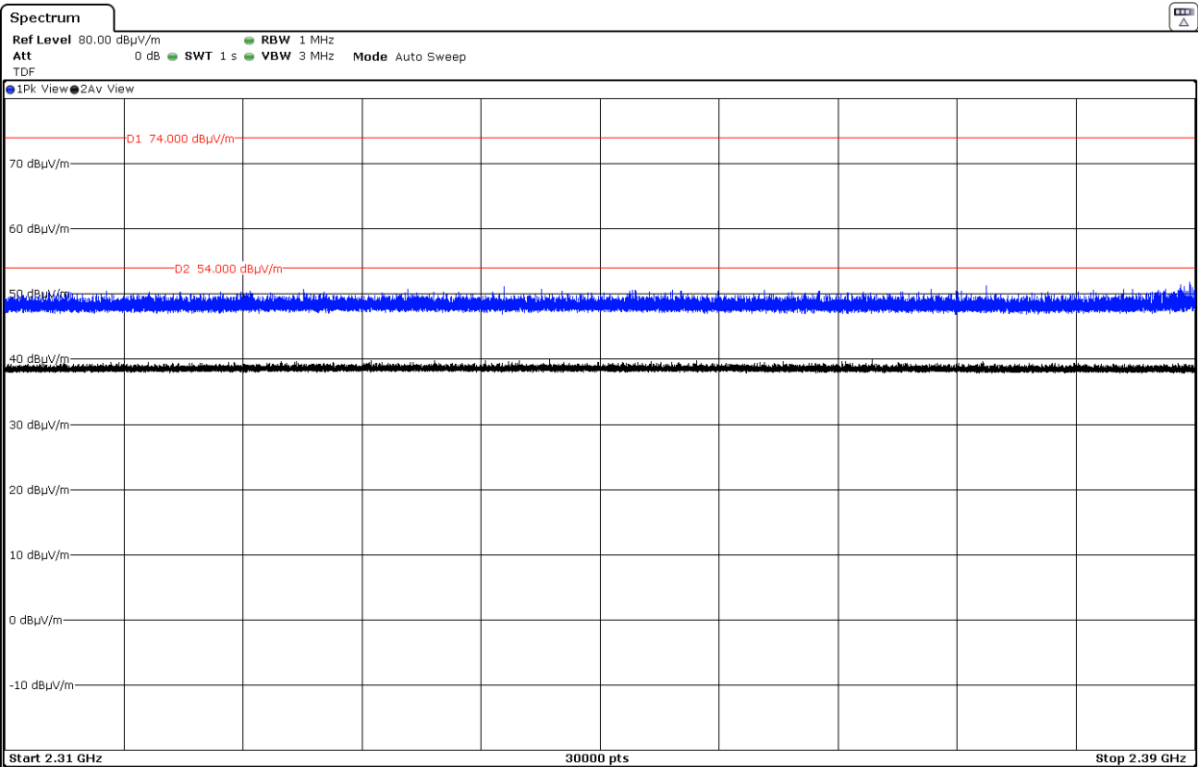

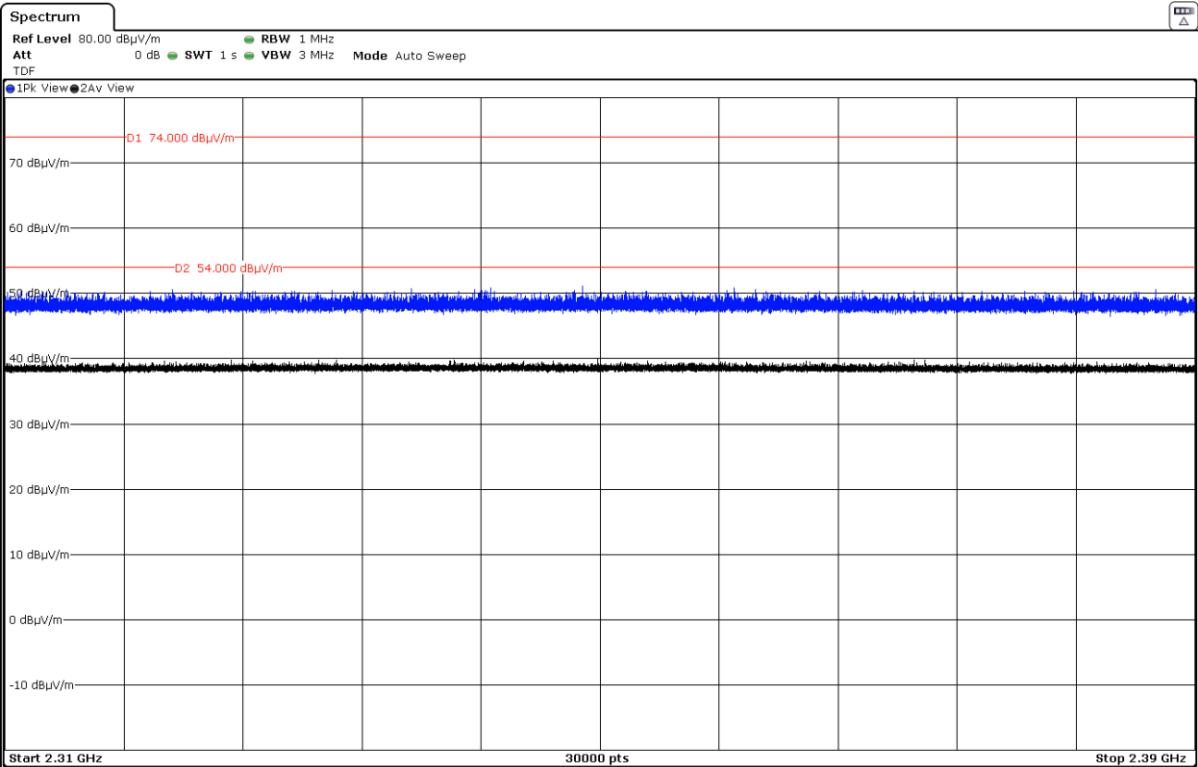


FREQUENCY RANGE 2.31 GHz to 2.39 GHz. (RESTRICTED BAND)

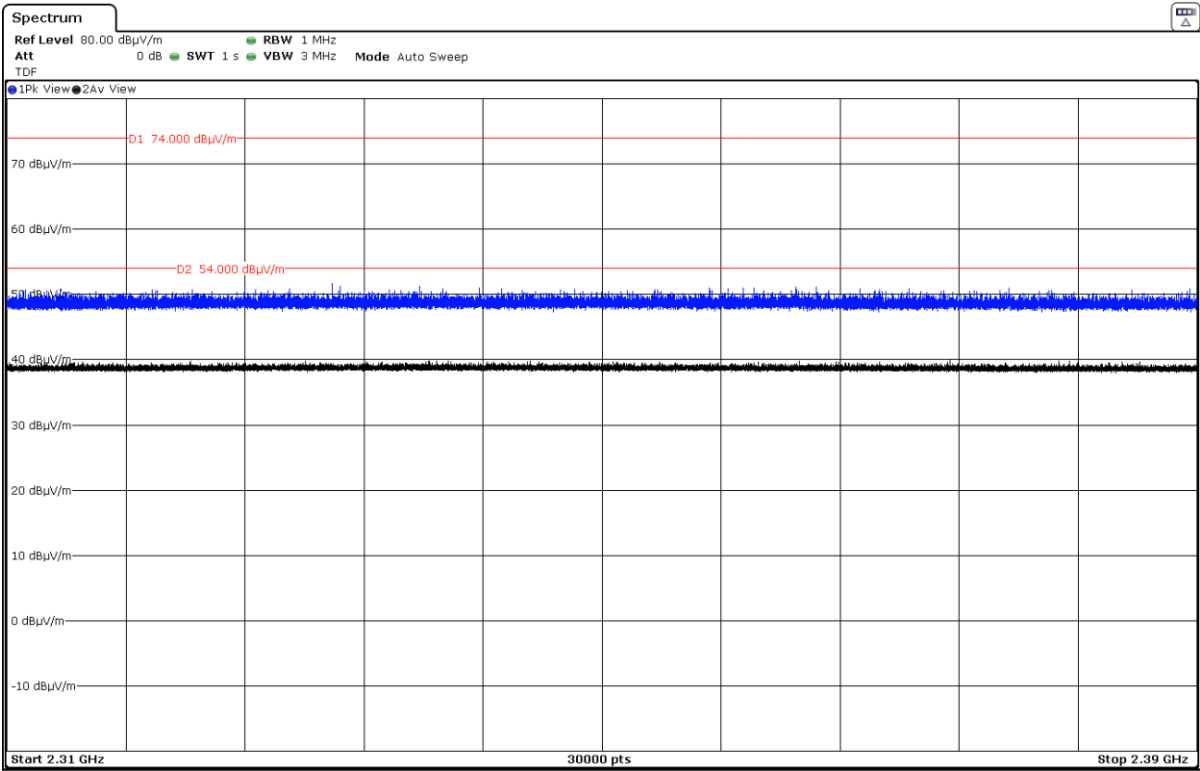

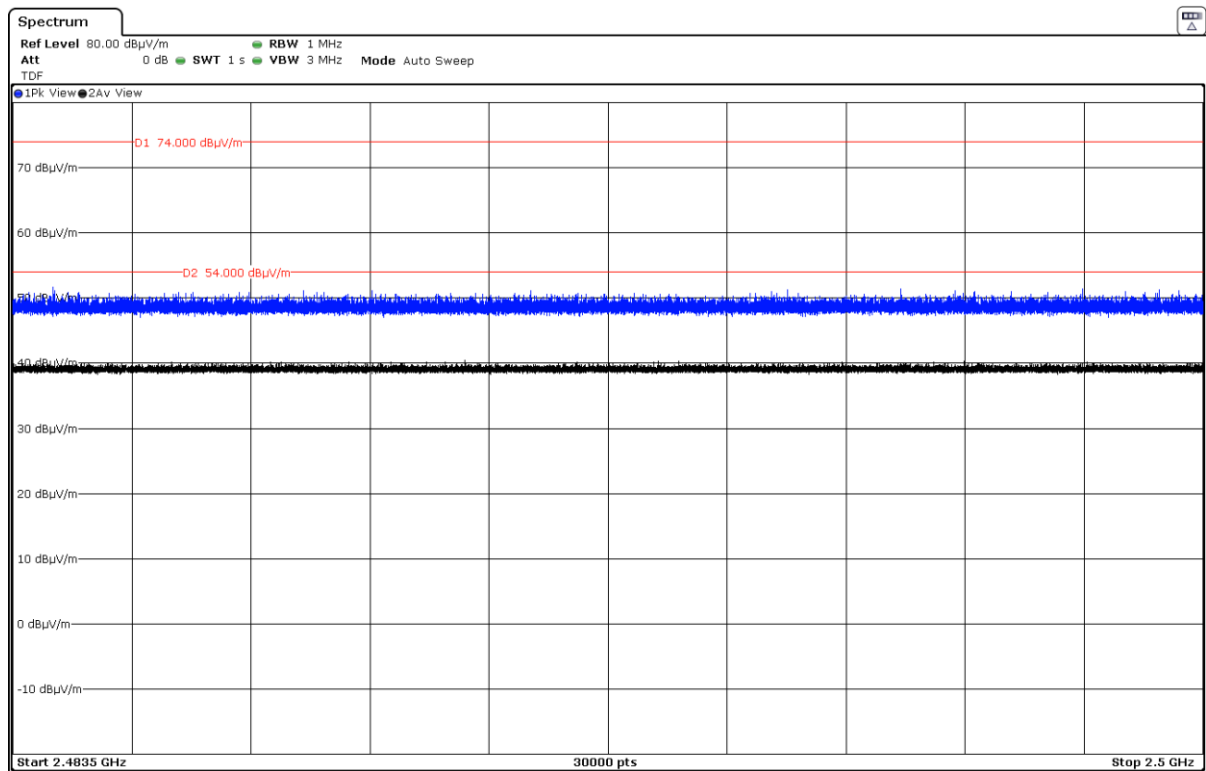

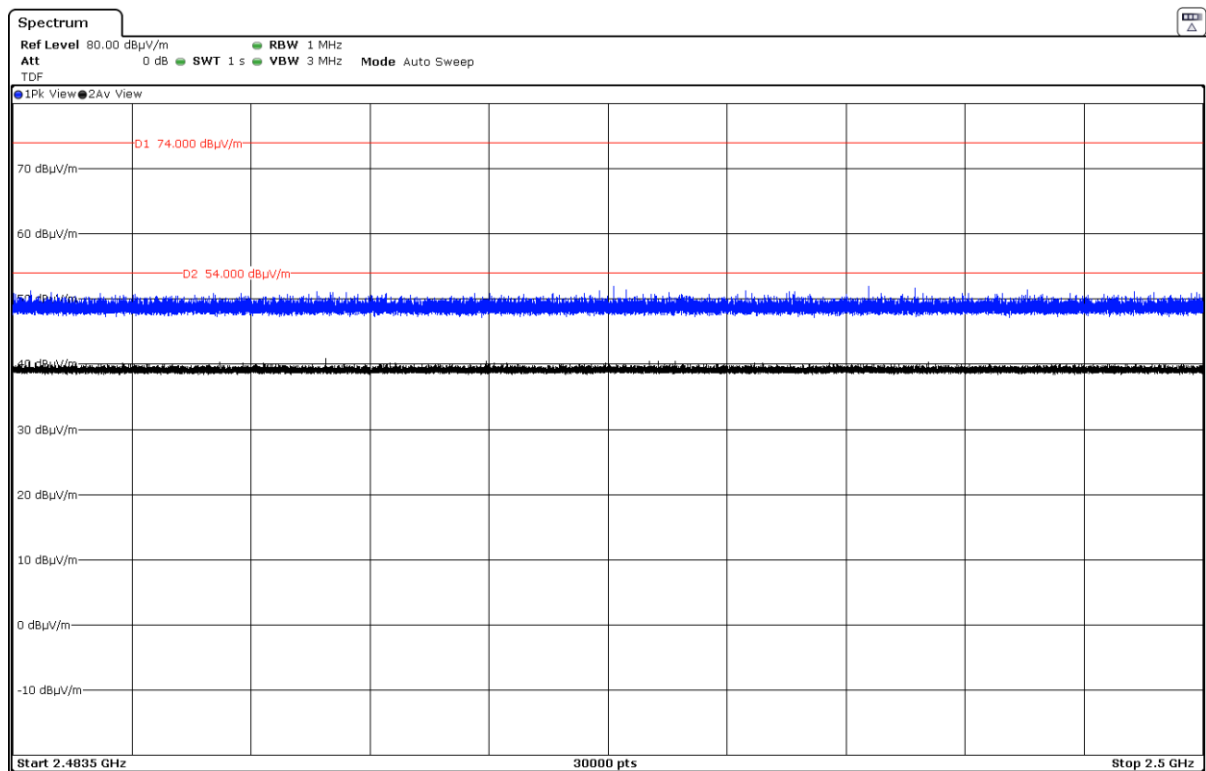


FREQUENCY RANGE 2.4835 GHz to 2.5 GHz. (RESTRICTED BAND)

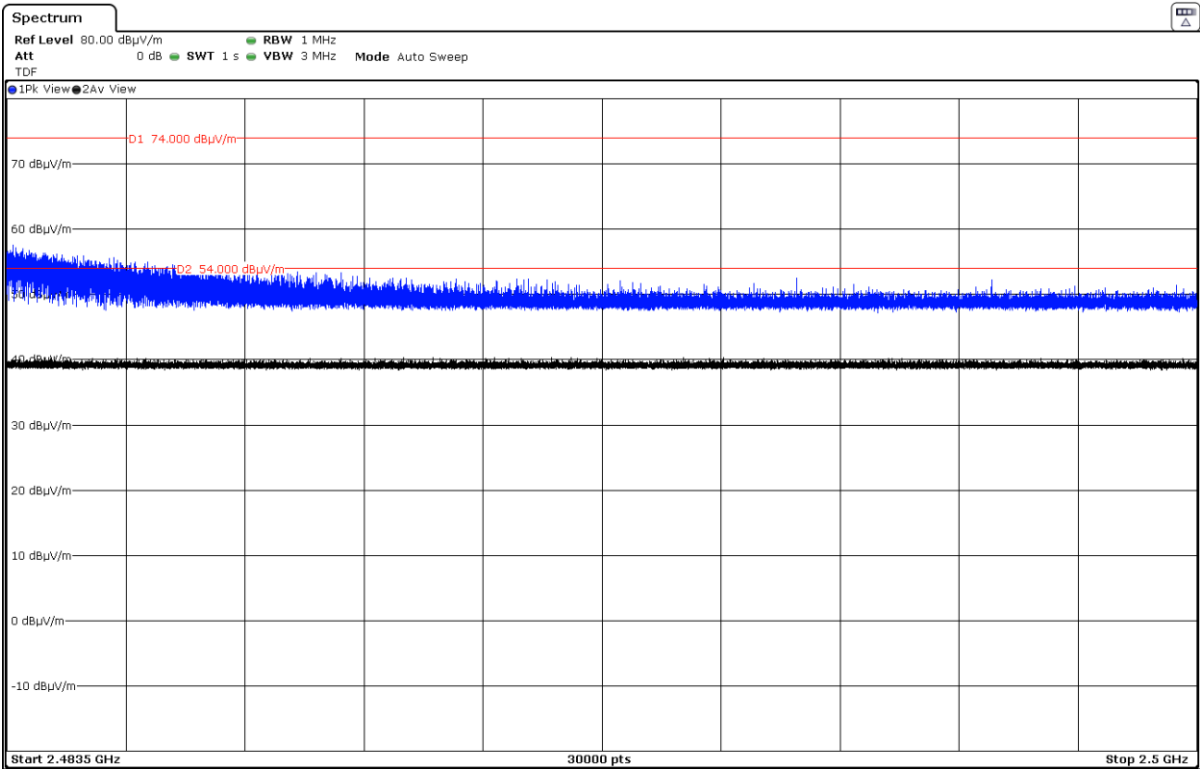

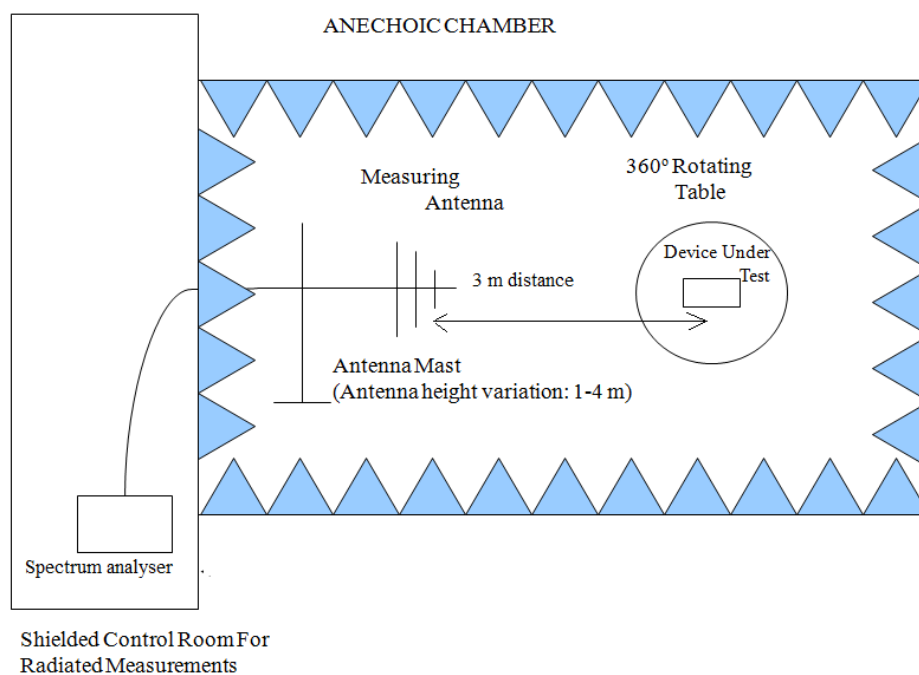

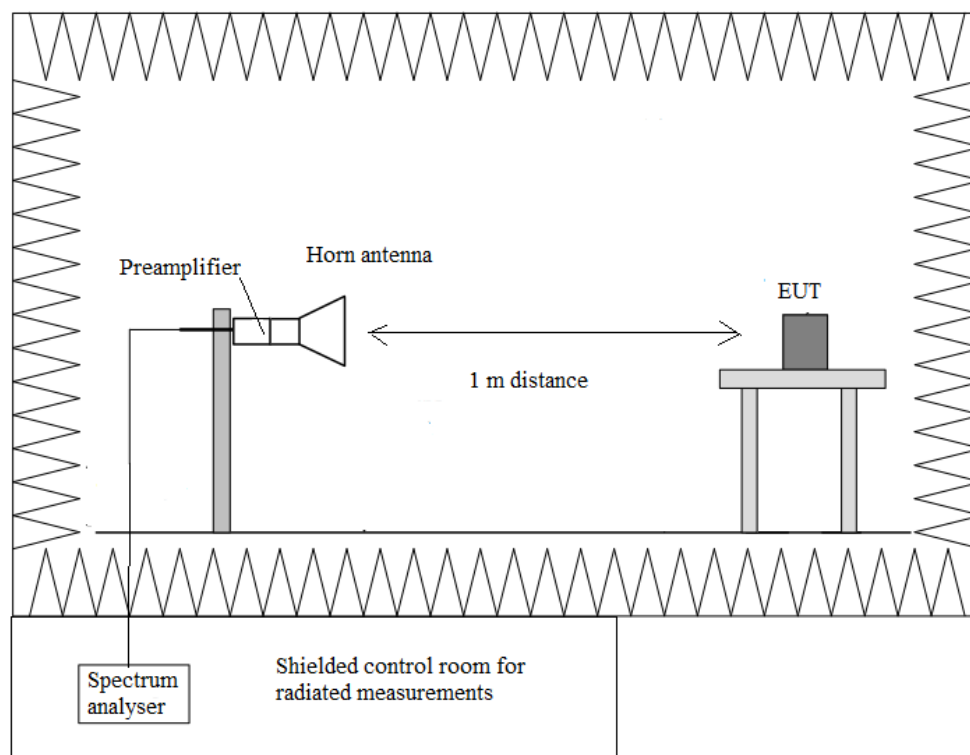

Radiated measurements setup $f > 1$ GHz



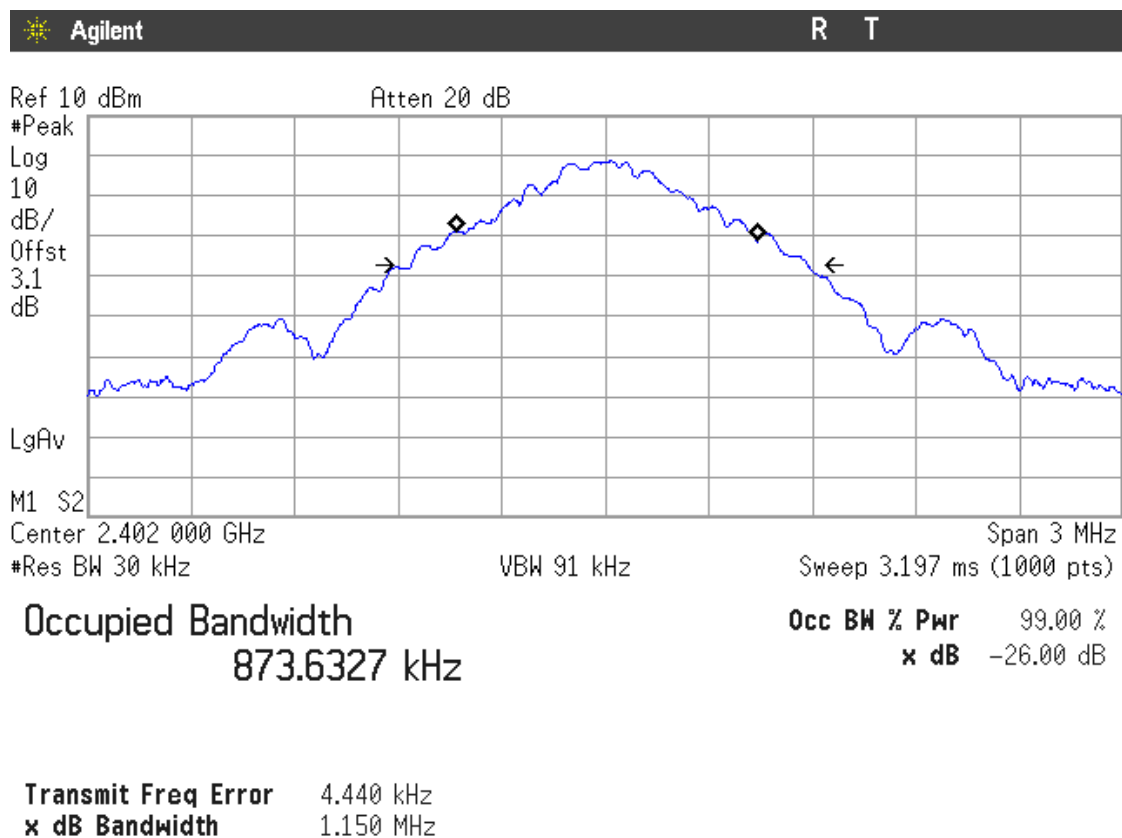

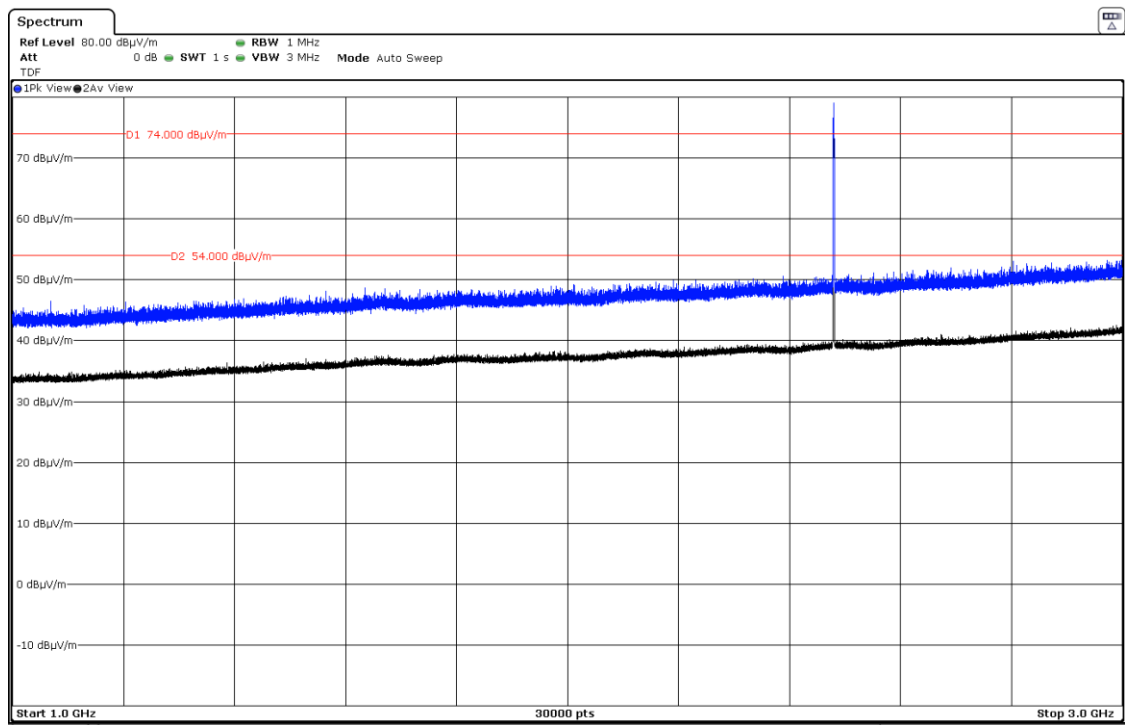

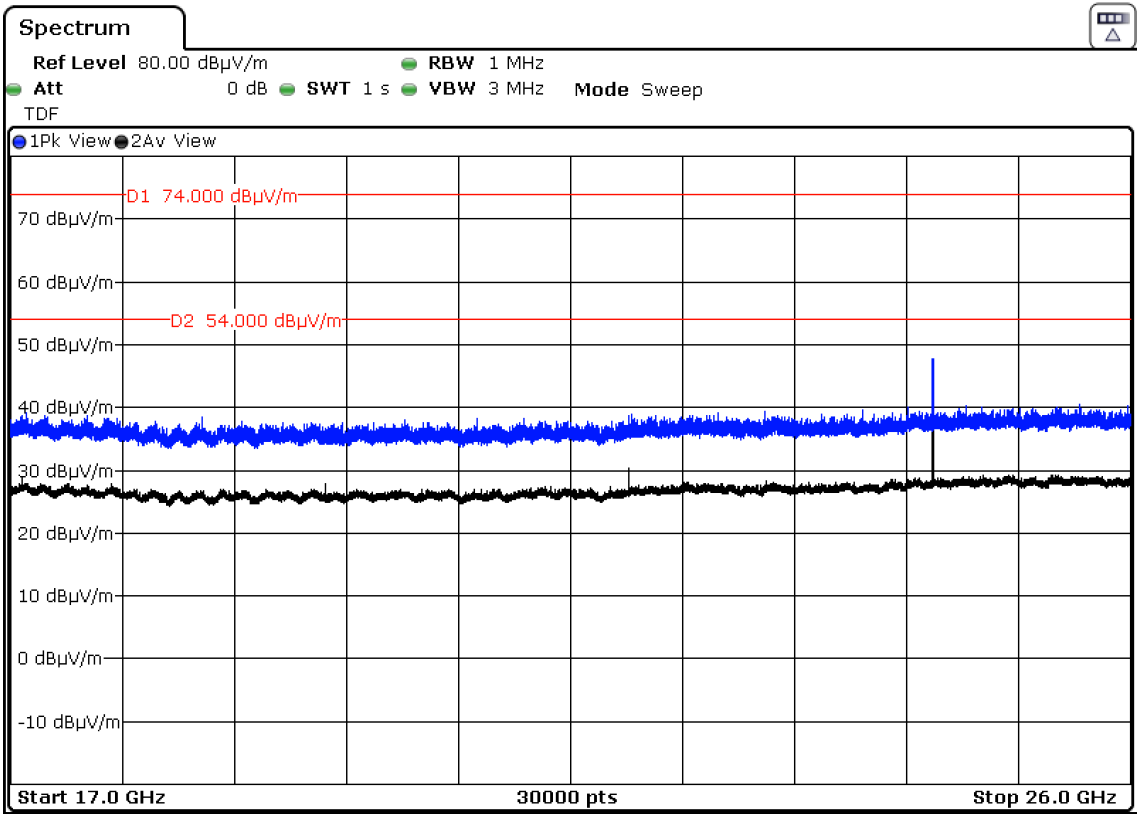


FREQUENCY RANGE 17 GHz to 26 GHz.

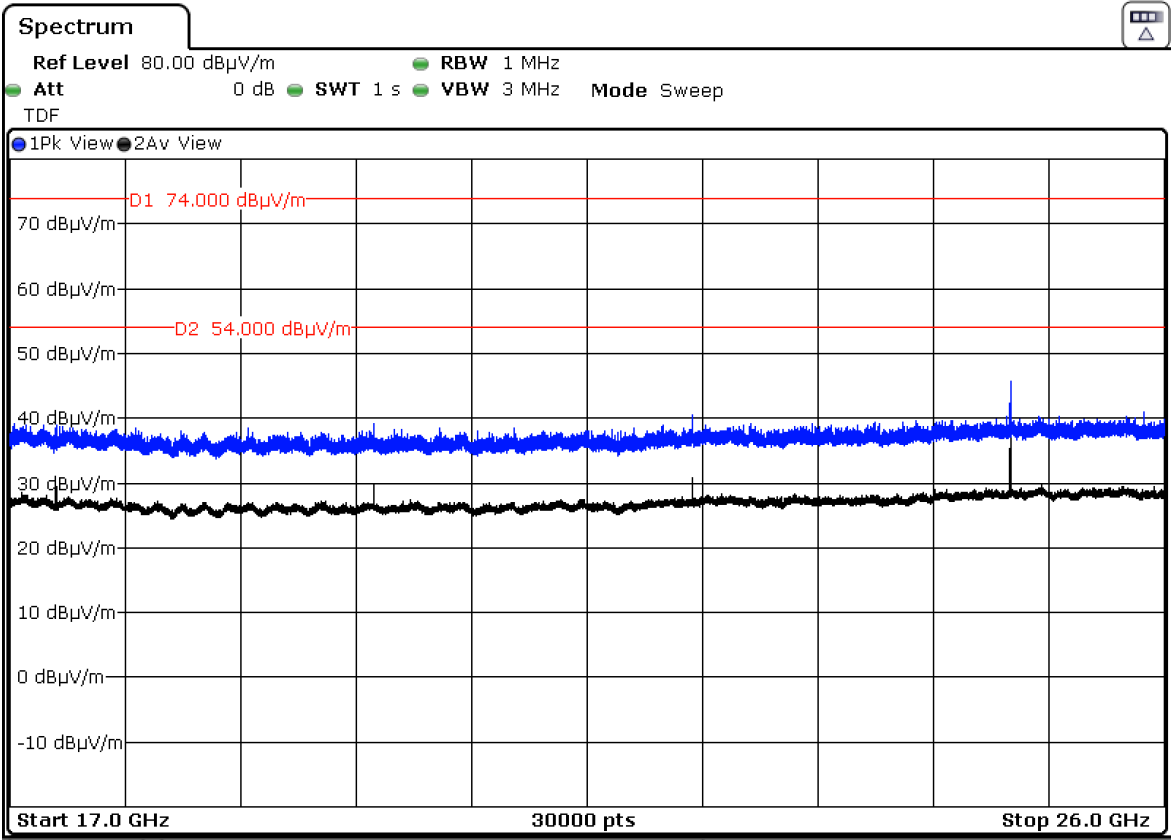

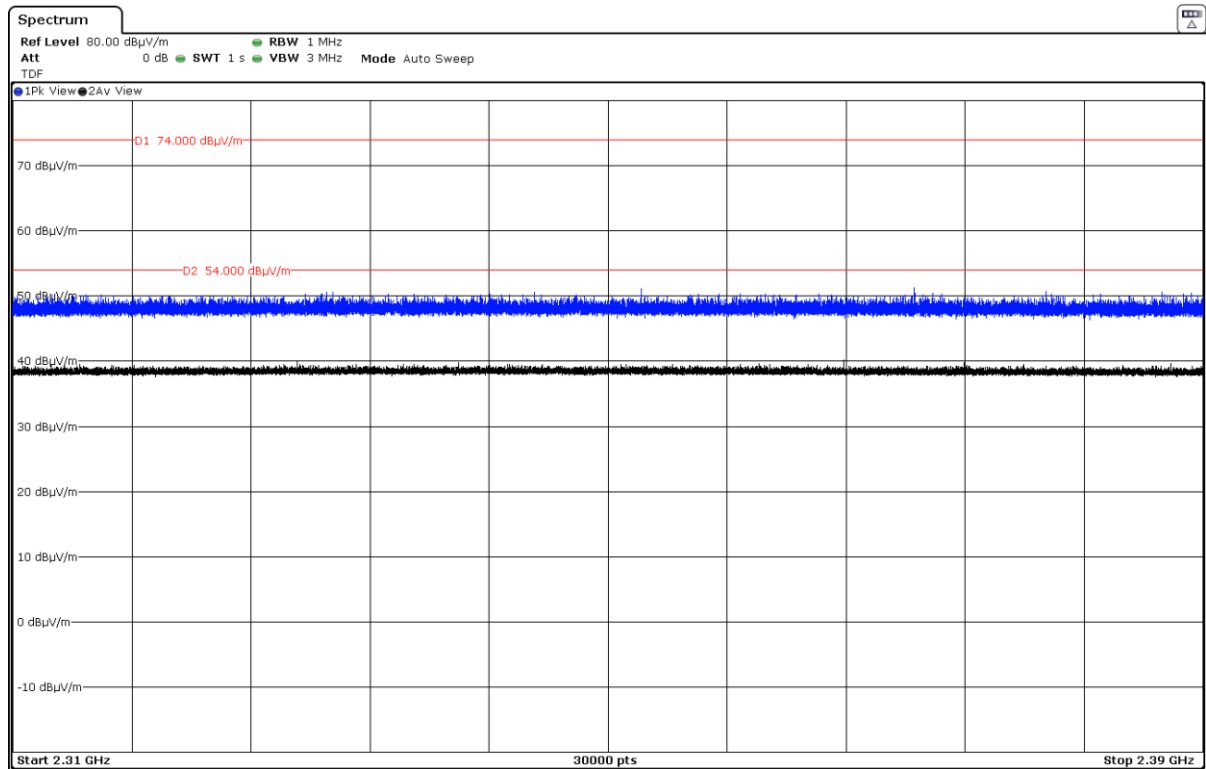

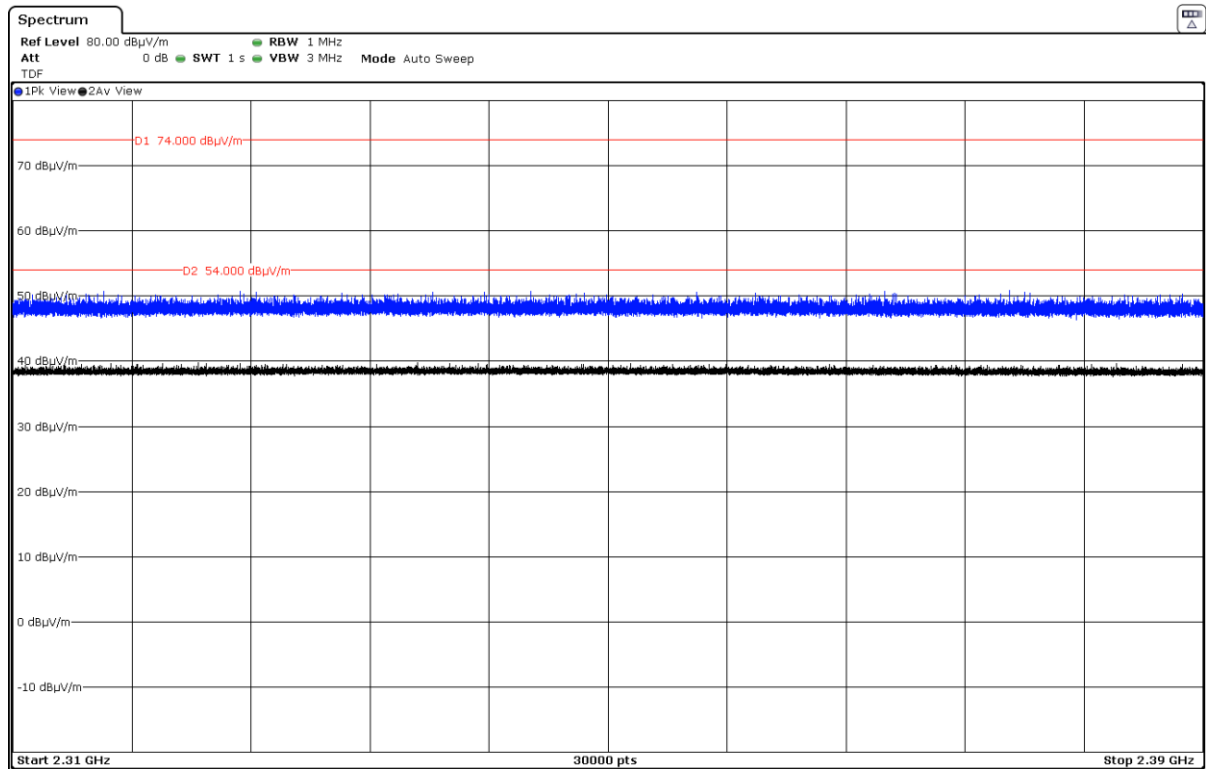


FREQUENCY RANGE 2.31 GHz to 2.39 GHz. (RESTRICTED BAND)

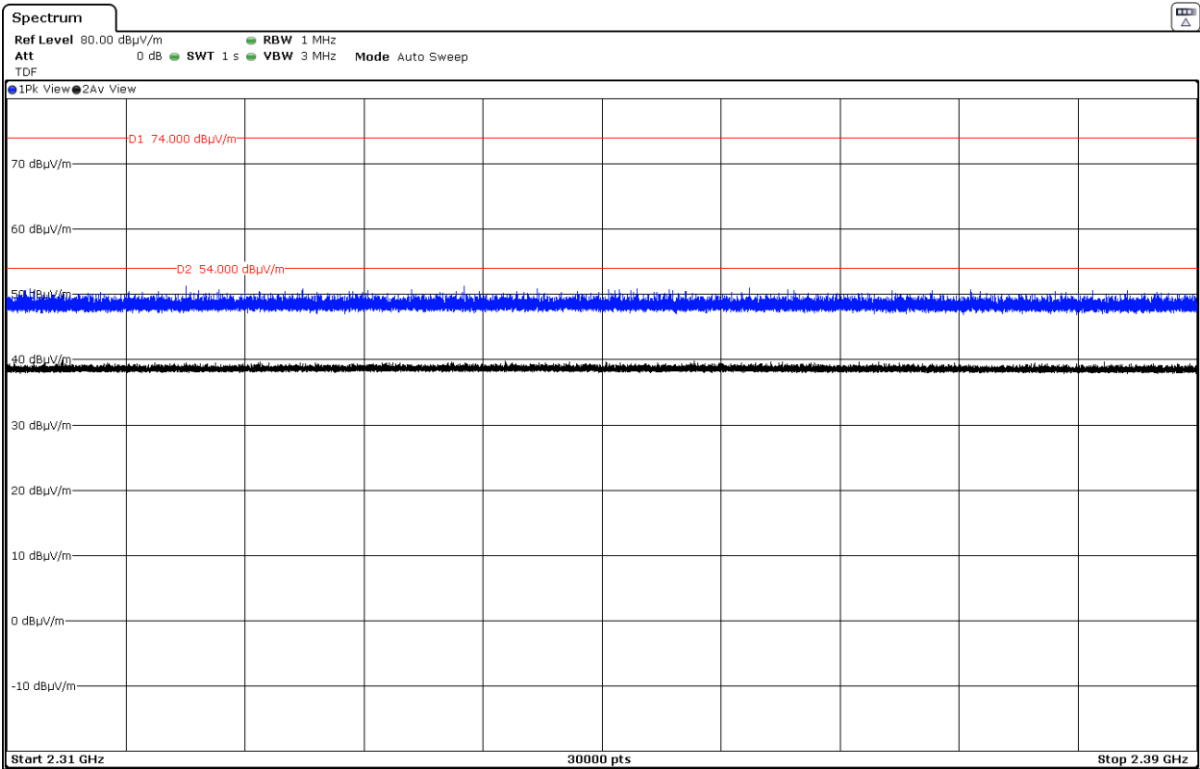

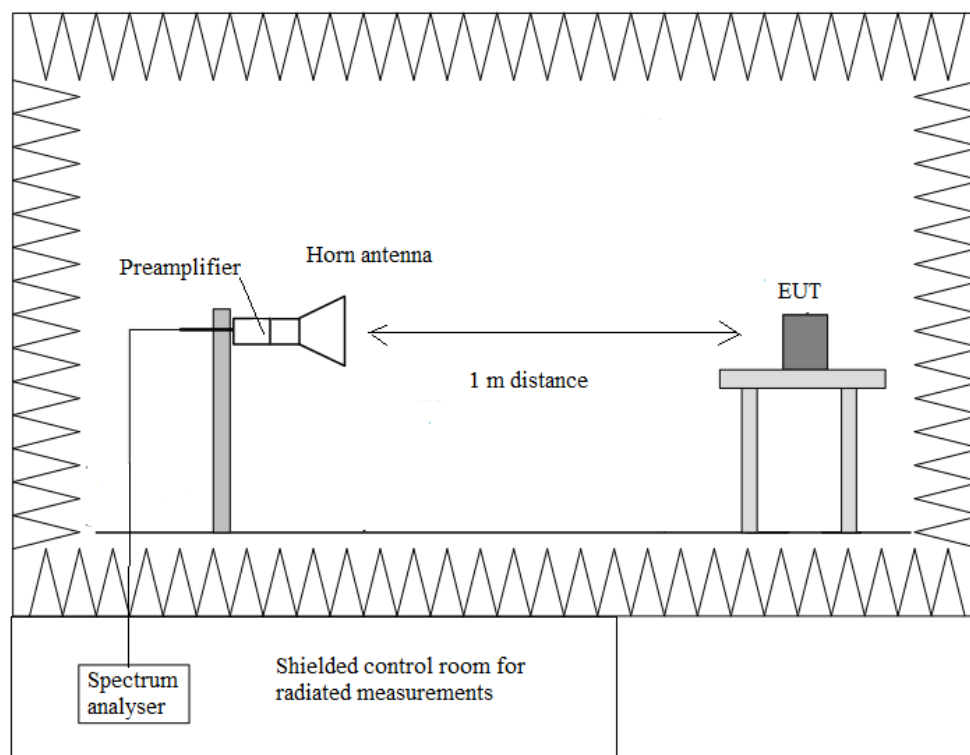

Radiated measurements setup $f > 1$ GHz



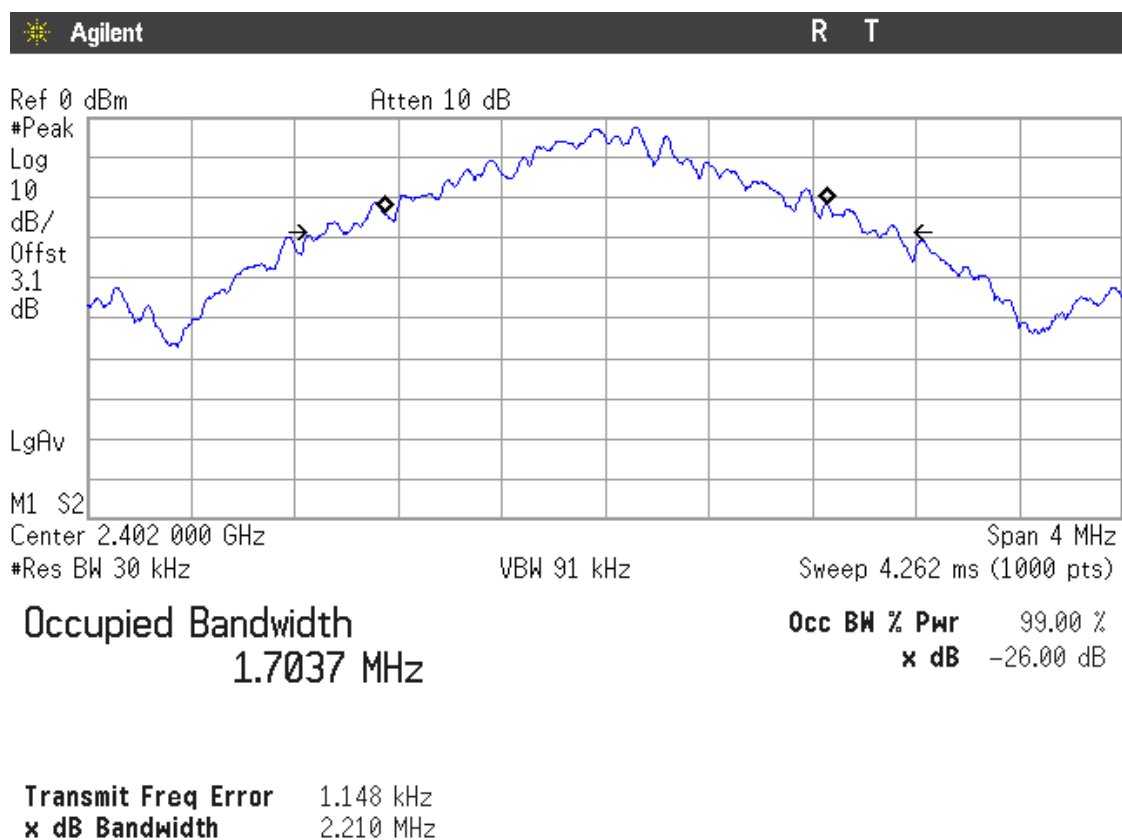

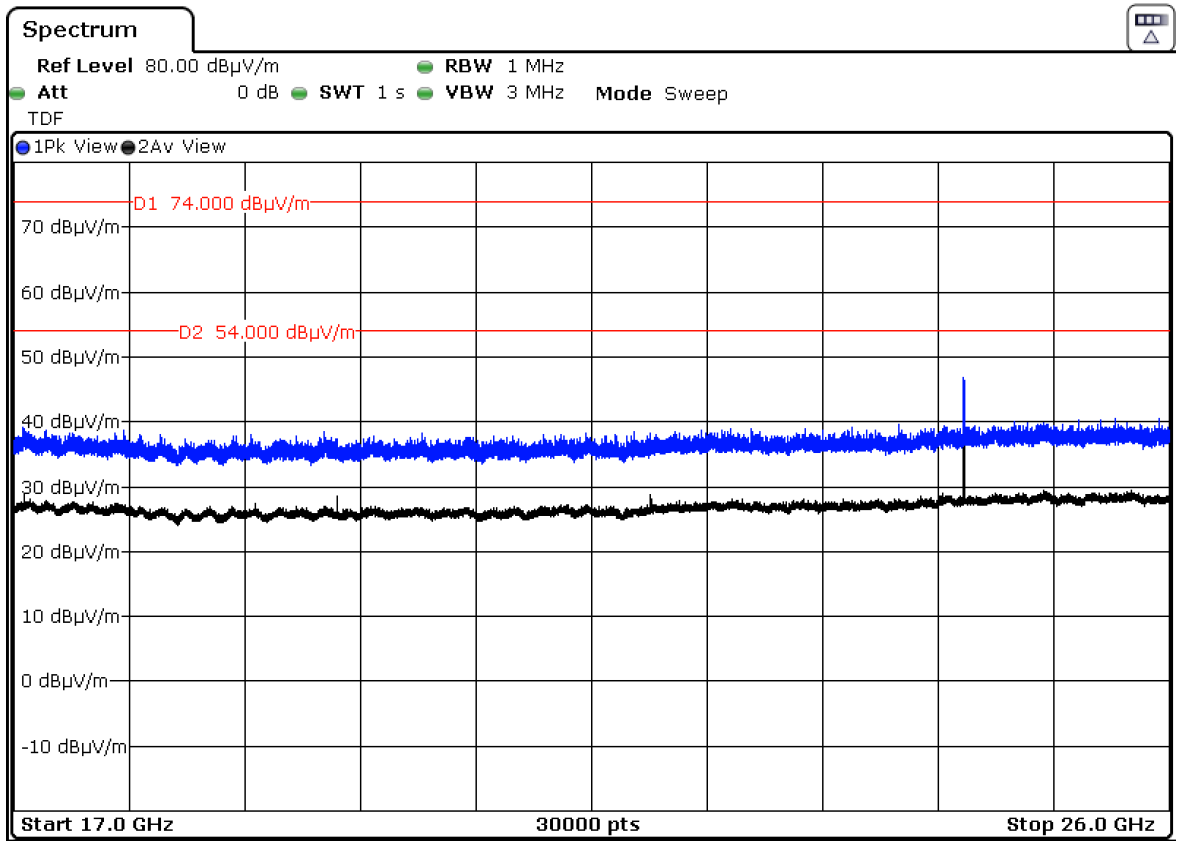


FREQUENCY RANGE 17 GHz to 26 GHz.

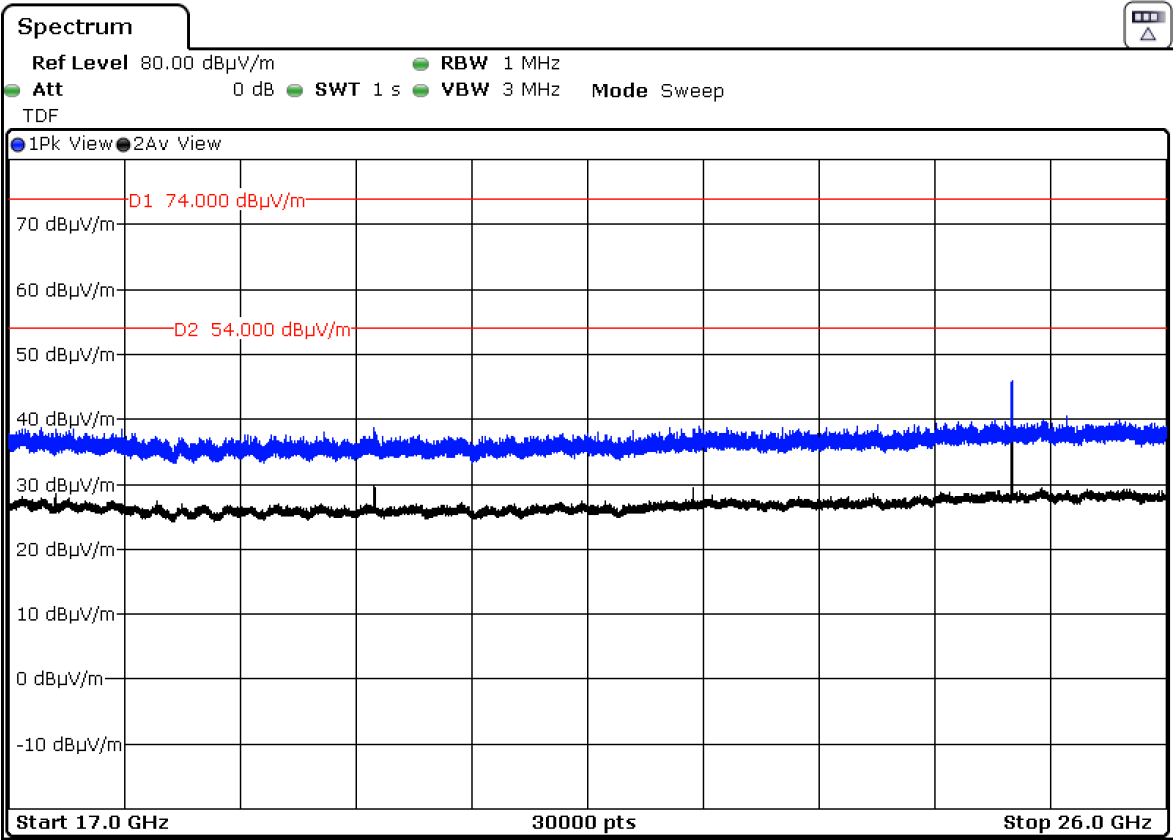

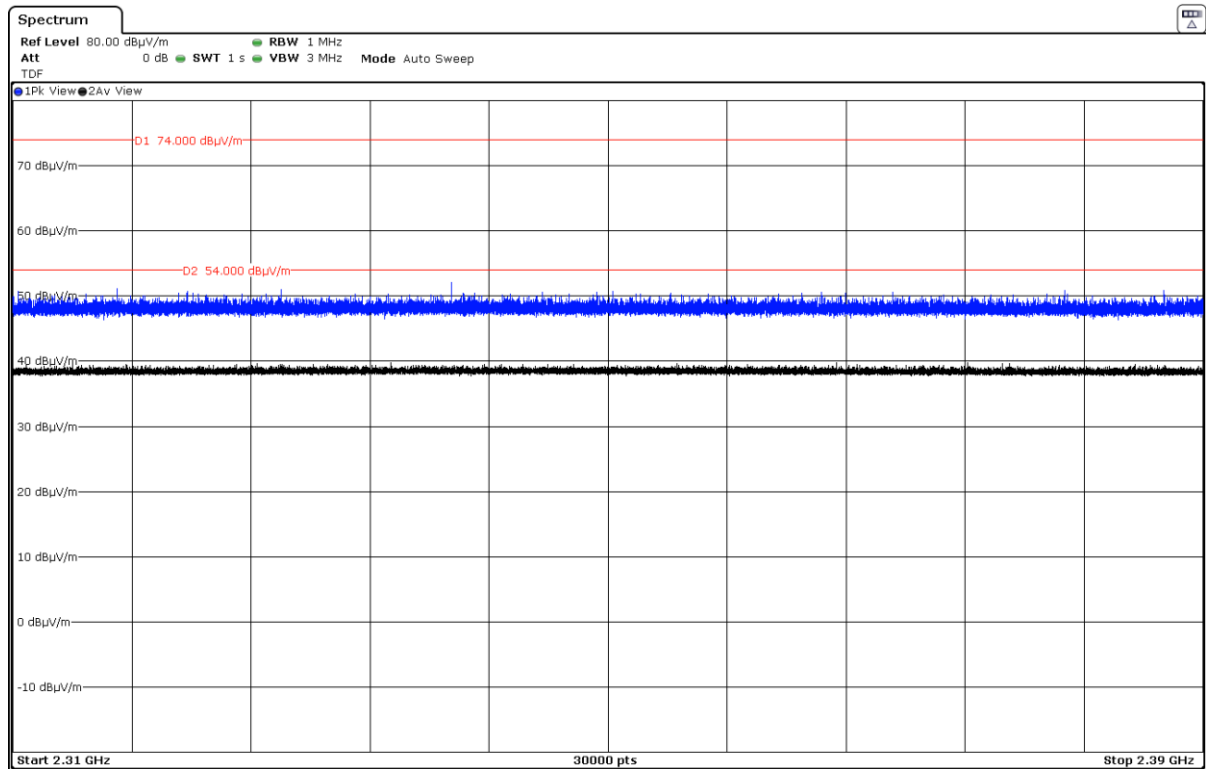

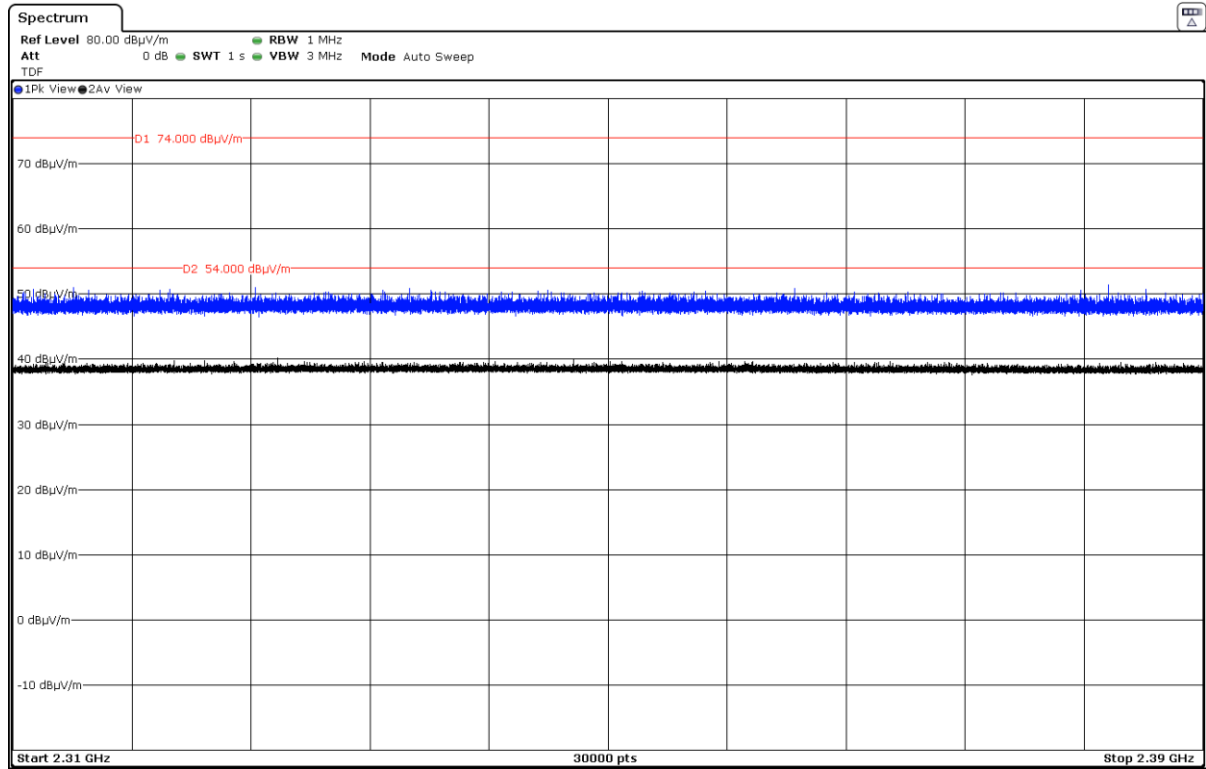


FREQUENCY RANGE 2.31 GHz to 2.39 GHz. (RESTRICTED BAND)

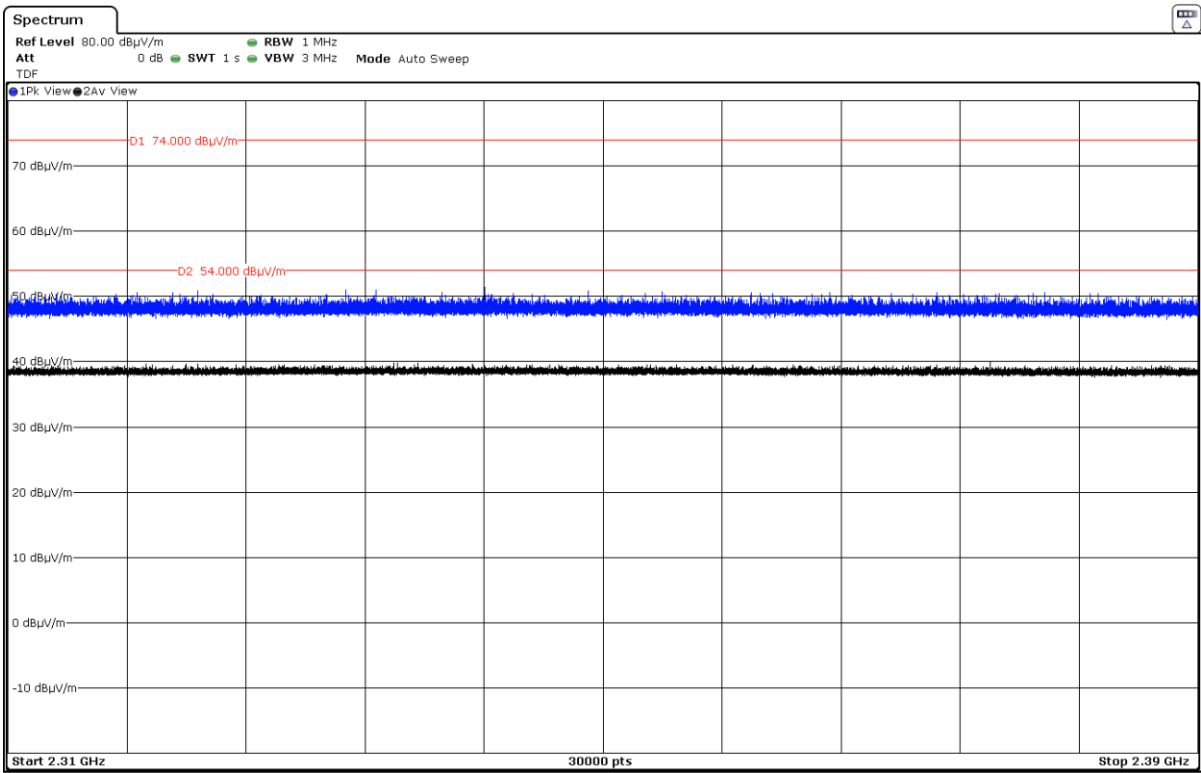

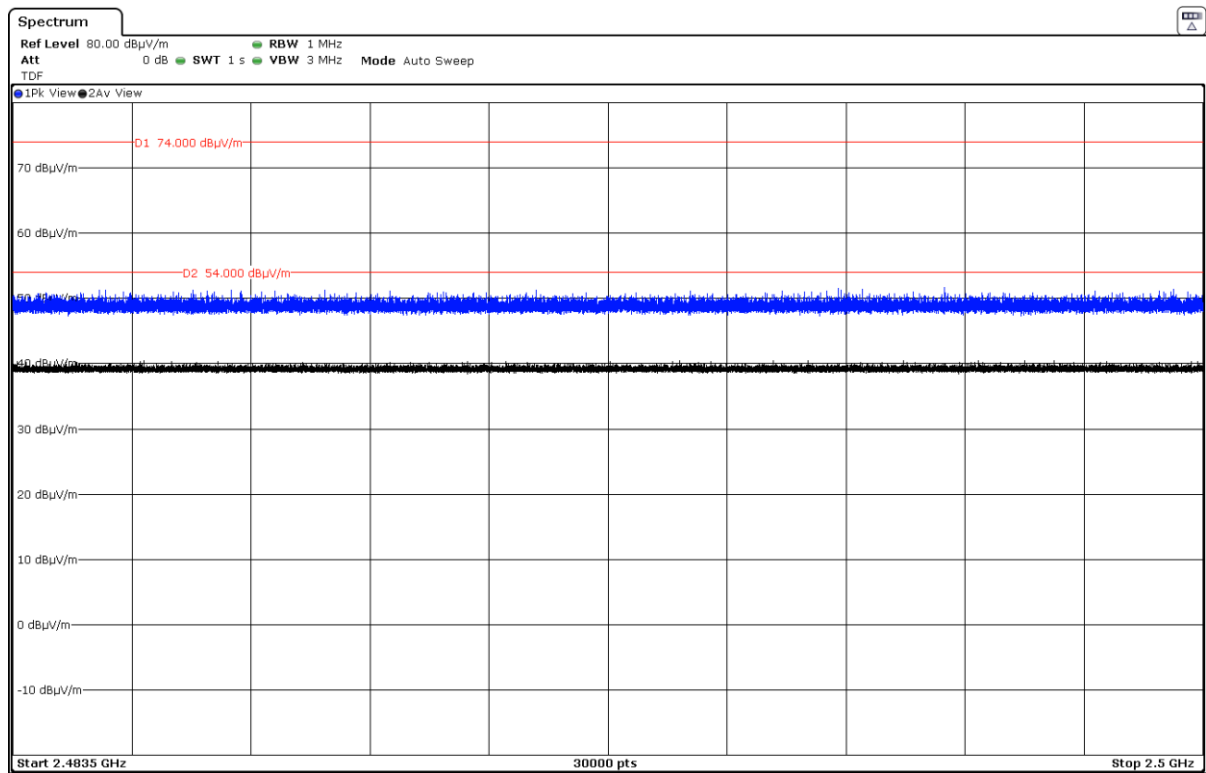

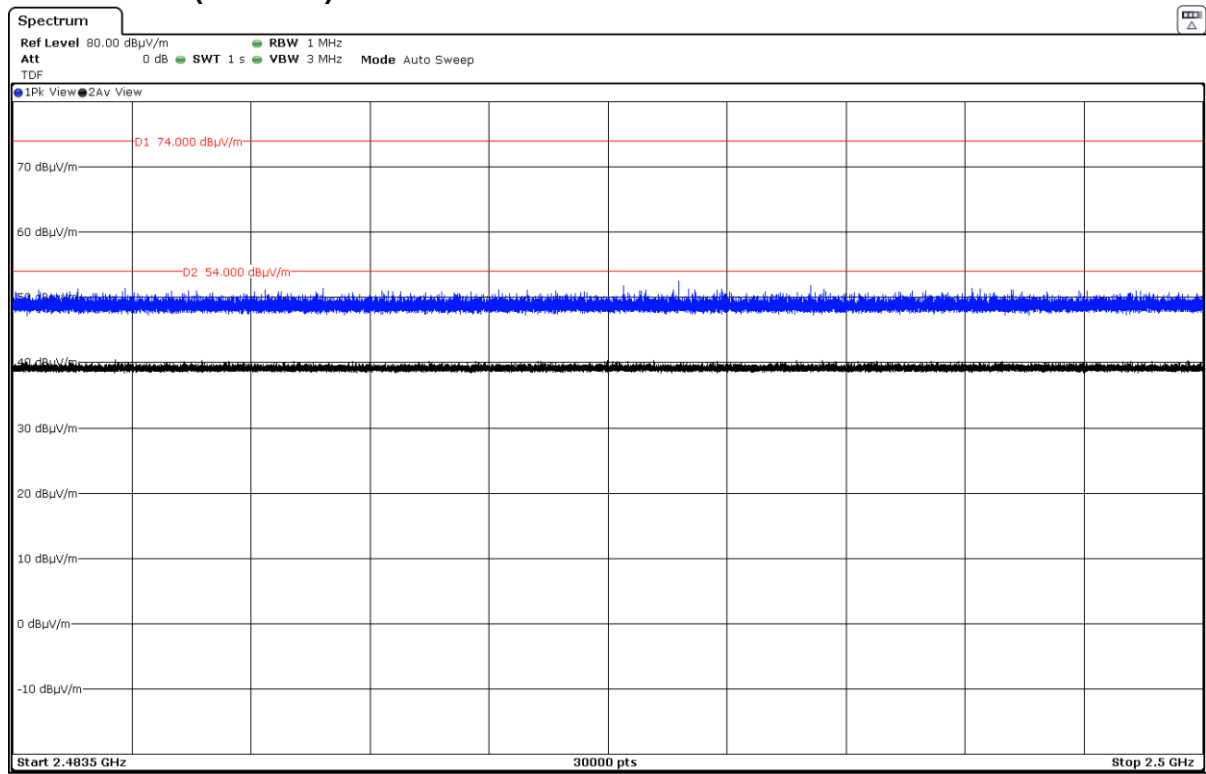
