Using your ASUS Transformer Book Trio



This ASUS Transformer Book Trio should only be used in environments with ambient temperatures between 5°C (41°F) and 35°C (95°F).

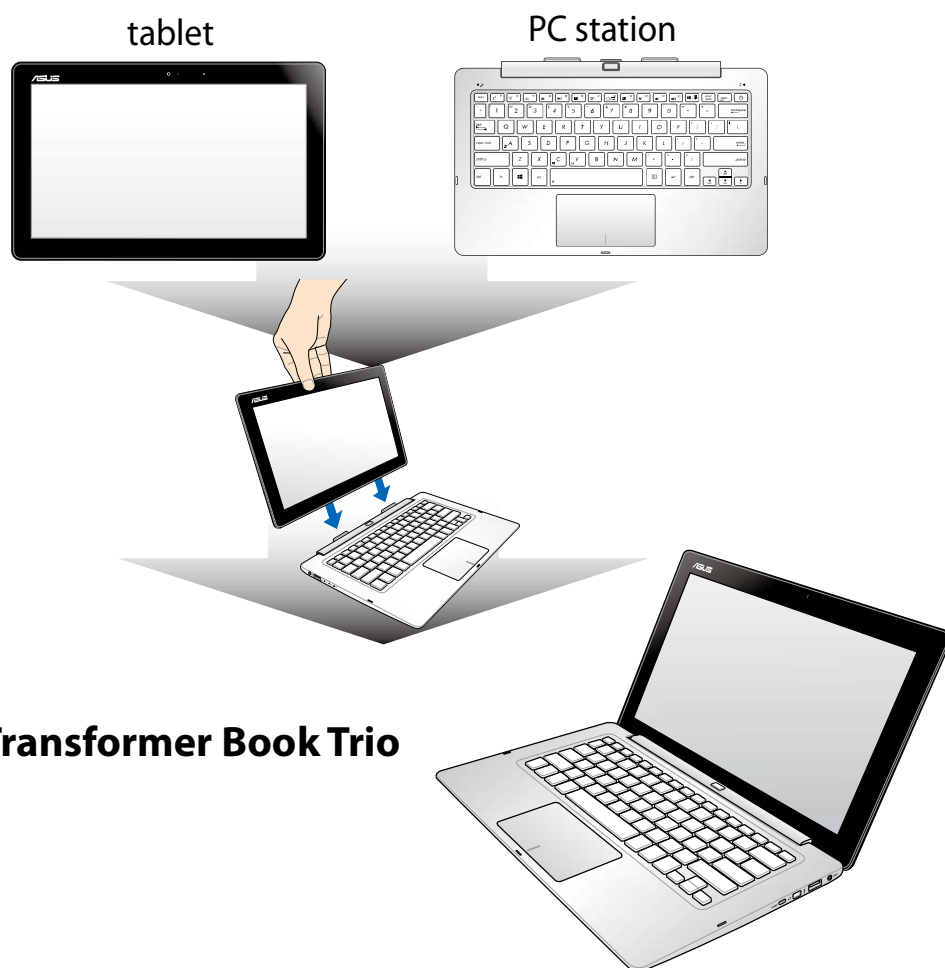
Chapter 1:

Hardware parts

Getting to know your ASUS Transformer Book Trio

Your ASUS Transformer Book Trio is made up of two major devices: the tablet and the PC station. When the tablet is docked on the PC station, both devices can be used as the ASUS Transformer Book Trio.

If the tablet is undocked from the PC station, each can function as individual devices with their own set of features. The tablet contains the Android® operating system while the PC station contains Windows® 8.



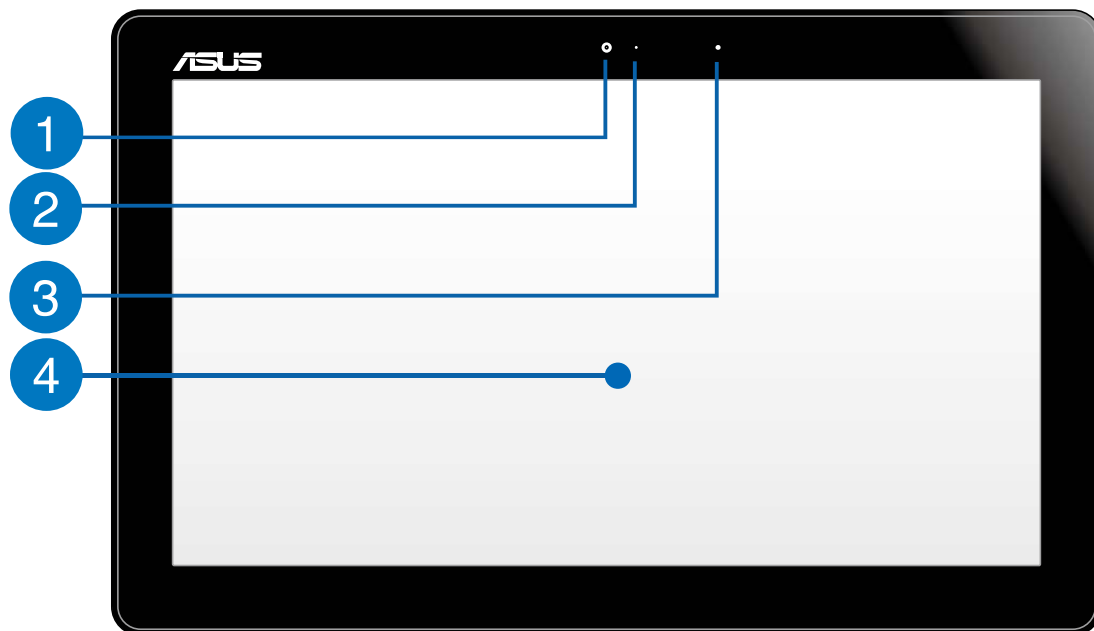
ASUS Transformer Book Trio

NOTE: For more details on connecting or disconnecting the tablet and the PC station, refer to the *Transforming your devices into an ASUS Transformer Book Trio* and the *Undocking the tablet from the PC station* sections in this manual.

Tablet

The tablet of your ASUS Transformer Book Trio allows you to perform touch screen gestures while working on Windows® 8 or Android®. When detached from the PC station, the tablet can be used to work on Android® only.

Top View



- 1 Camera**
The built-in camera allows you to take pictures or record videos using your ASUS Transformer Book Trio.
- 2 Camera indicator**
The camera indicator lights up when the built-in camera is in use.

3 Ambient light sensor

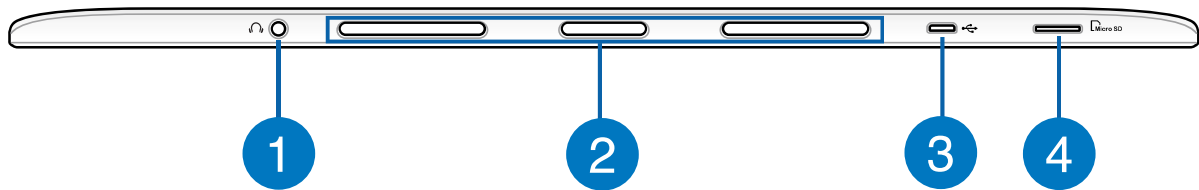
The ambient light sensor detects the amount of ambient light in your environment. It allows the system to automatically adjust the brightness of the display depending on the ambient light condition.

4 Touch screen panel

This high-definition touch screen panel provides excellent viewing features for photos, videos, and other multimedia files on your ASUS Transformer Book Trio or tablet. It also allows you to operate your tablet using touch gestures.

NOTE: For more details, refer to the *Gestures for the touch screen panel and touchpad* section in this manual.

Ports and slot



1 Headphone output jack port (for Android® only)

This port allows you to connect your ASUS Transformer Book Trio to headphones while working on Android®. You can also use this port to connect your ASUS Transformer Book Trio to an external microphone.

2 PC station slots

These slots are magnetic and align conveniently with the magnetic PC station tabs to securely attach the tablet.

WARNING!

- The PC station tabs are magnetized, please keep them out of children's reach.
 - Magnetic fields generated by mobile devices may damage data on magnetic storage media, such as credit cards, computer discs or tapes. Do not place your device next to such media.
 - Never expose your device to strong magnetic fields as this may cause temporary malfunction.
 - Magnets can affect functioning pacemakers and implanted defibrillators. Refer to your pacemaker or defibrillator's suggested distance from magnets.

Micro USB 2.0 port (for Android® only)

Connect the bundled micro USB to USB adapter into this micro USB (Universal Serial Bus) 2.0 port to charge the battery or supply power to your tablet. You can use this as a charging port while using the tablet as a separate device.

When the tablet is used separately, you may also use this port to facilitate data transfers from an external device.

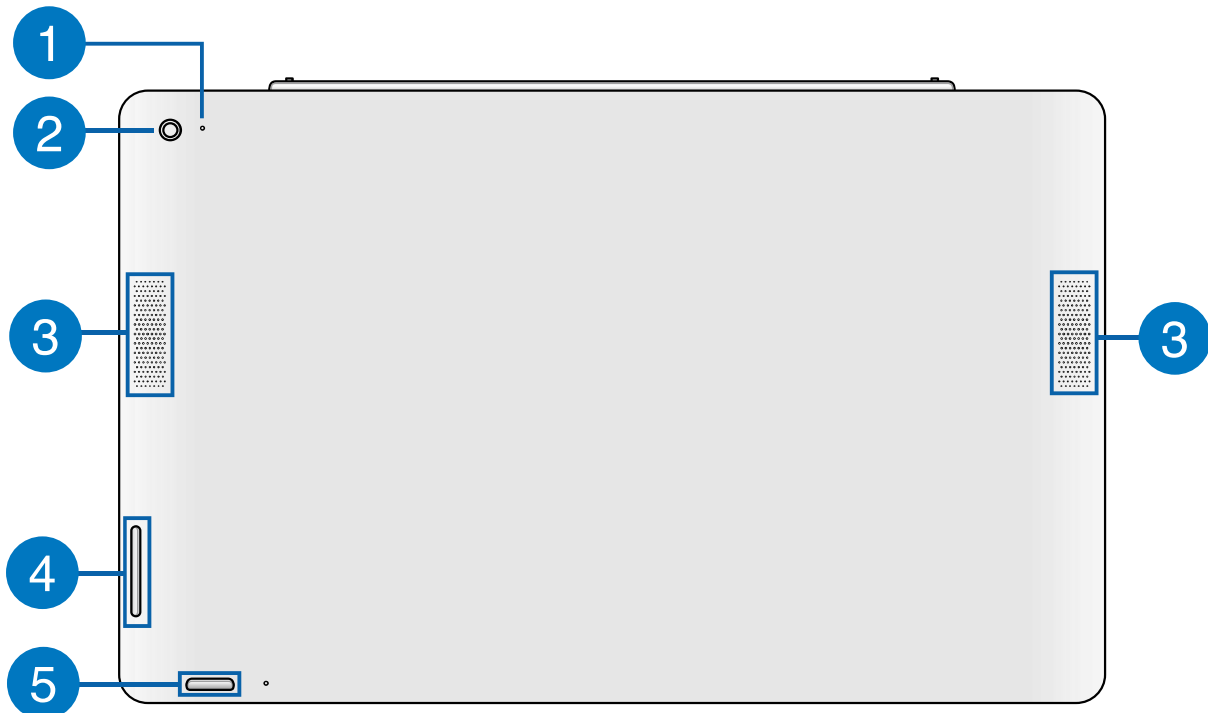
MicroSD card slot

This built-in memory card reader slot supports microSD and microSDHC card formats.

NOTE: When working on Windows® 8, you need to ensure that the Android® system is also running.

IMPORTANT! Battery time varies by usage and by the specifications for this ASUS Transformer Book Trio. The battery pack cannot be disassembled.



- 1 Microphone**

The built-in microphone can be used for video conferencing, voice narrations, or simple audio recording.
- 2 Camera (for Android® only)**

The built-in camera allows you to take pictures or record videos while working on Android®.
- 3 Audio speakers**

The built-in audio speakers allow you to hear audios straight from your tablet. Audio features are software controlled.

4 Volume button

Press this button to increase or decrease the volume.

5 Power button

The power button turns on your tablet, boots up Android®, and also resets your tablet when needed. Refer to the following scenarios when using your PC station's power button:

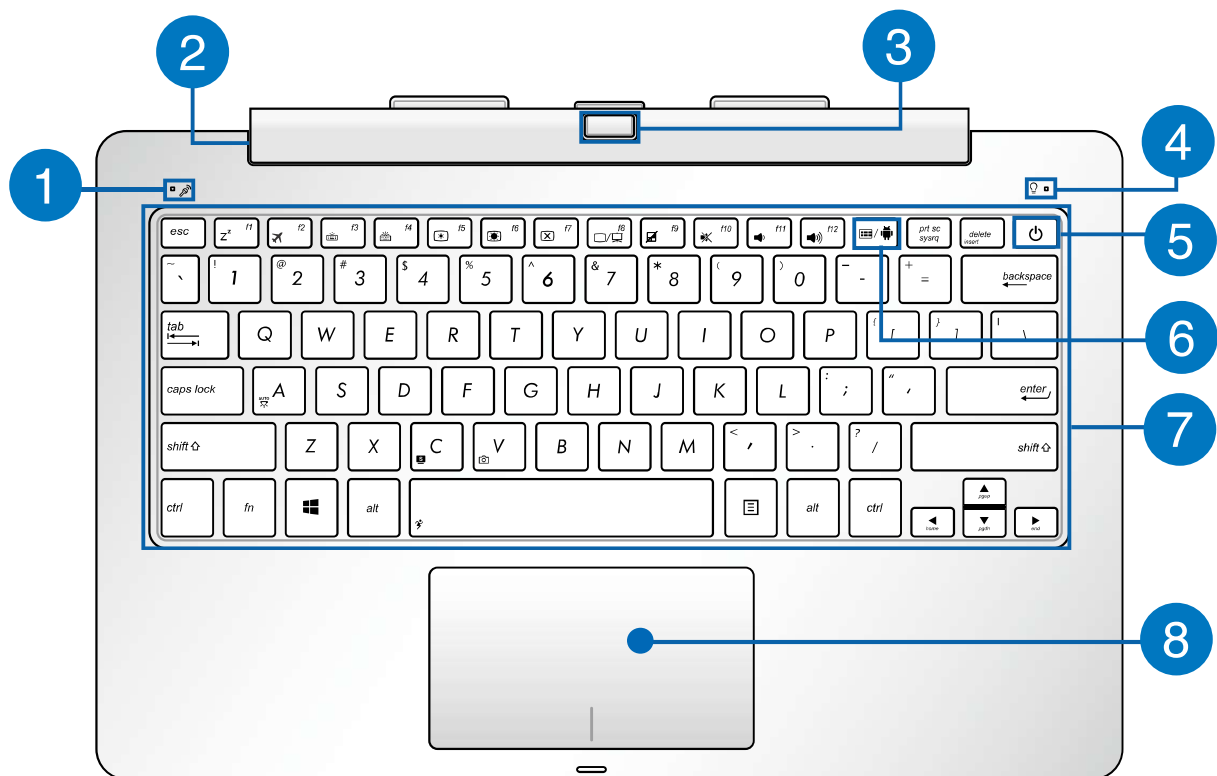
- Press the power button to turn on your tablet and boot up Android®.
- While working on your tablet, you can press the power button to put your tablet to sleep or wake it up from sleep mode.
- In the event that your tablet becomes unresponsive, press and hold the power button for about seven (7) seconds until your tablet shuts down.

PC station

The PC station serves as an input device for your ASUS Transformer Book Trio via its keyboard and touchpad. It also provides access to Windows® 8 when the tablet is docked on it or while using an external display.

Top View

NOTE: The keyboard's layout may vary per model, region, or country.



1 Microphone

The built-in microphone can be used for video conferencing, voice narrations, or simple audio recording.

2 PC station hinge

This hinge allows you to connect the tablet to the PC station. It also holds the tablet in place as you adjust it to different viewing angles.

3 Tablet release button

Press this button all the way in until the hinge unlocks the tablet from the PC station.

4 Power indicator

The power indicator lights up when the PC station is turned on and running Windows® 8. It also blinks slowly when the PC station is in sleep mode.

5 Power button

The power button turns on your PC station, boots up the Windows® 8 system, and also resets your PC station when needed. Refer to the following scenarios when using your PC station's power button:

- Press the power button to turn on your PC station and boot up Windows®8.
- While working on your PC station, you can press the power button to put your PC station to sleep or wake it up from sleep mode.
- In the event that your PC station becomes unresponsive, press and hold the power button for about four (4) seconds until your PC station shuts down.

Operating system (OS) switch key

The OS switch key is a special button on the PC station that allows you to conveniently switch between the Windows® 8 and Android® operating systems.

This key only works when the tablet and PC station are connected and used as an ASUS Transformer Book Trio.

NOTE: For more details, refer to the *Using the operating system (OS) switch key* section in this manual.

Keyboard

The keyboard provides full-sized QWERTY keys with a comfortable travel depth for typing while working on either Windows® 8 or Android®. It also enables you to use the function keys, allows quick access to Windows®, and controls other multimedia functions.

NOTE: The keyboard layout differs by model or territory.

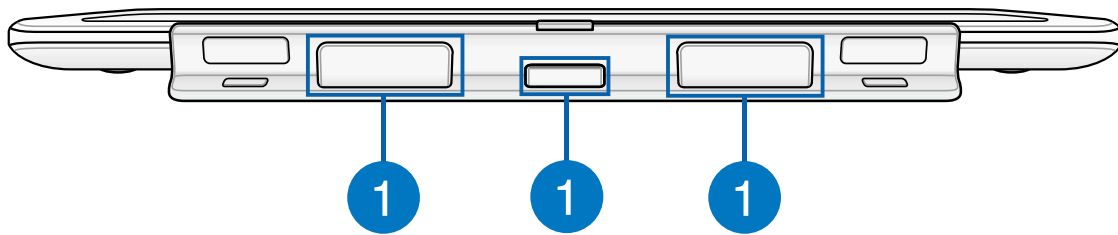

Touchpad

The touchpad allows the use of multi-gestures to navigate onscreen, providing an intuitive user experience while working on Windows® 8 and Android®. It also simulates the functions of a regular mouse.

NOTE: For more details, refer to the *Gestures for the touchpad* section in this manual.

1 PC station tabs

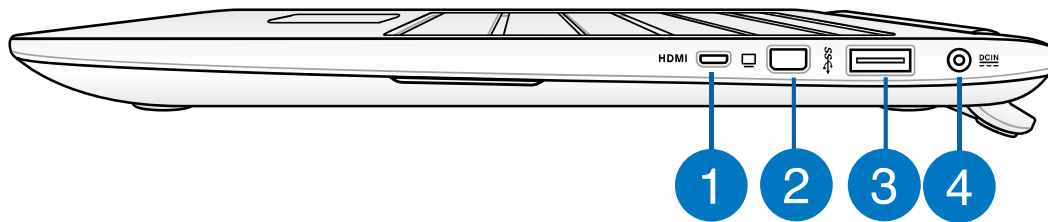
The magnetic PC station tabs securely attach the tablet to the PC station.

Attach the tablet to the PC dock by aligning the PC station slots on top of these tabs. Once attached, you can adjust the tablet according to your preferred viewing angle.

WARNING!

- The PC station tabs are magnetic, please keep them out of children's reach.
 - Magnetic fields generated by mobile devices may damage data on magnetic storage media, such as credit cards, computer discs or tapes. Do not place your device next to such media.
 - Never expose your device to strong magnetic fields as this may cause temporary malfunction.
 - Magnets can affect functioning pacemakers and implanted defibrillators. Refer to your pacemaker or defibrillator's suggested distance from magnets.

NOTE: The following ports can only be used in Windows® 8.

- 1 Micro HDMI port (for Windows® 8 only)**

This port is for the micro HDMI (High-Definition Multimedia Interface) connector and is HDCP compliant for HD DVD, Blu-ray, and other protected content playback.
- 2 Mini DisplayPort port (for Windows® 8 only)**

Use this port to connect your ASUS Transformer Book Trio to a DisplayPort or VGA, DVI, or HDMI external display.

3 USB 3.0 port with USB Charger+* (for Windows® 8 only)

This USB 3.0 port with the ⚡ icon comes with the USB Charger+ feature. USB Charger+ allows you to quick-charge mobile devices and can be used even while your ASUS Transformer Book Trio is on sleep, hibernate, or shutdown mode*.

4 Power (DC) input port (for Windows® 8 only)

Insert the bundled power adapter into this port to charge the battery pack and supply power to your PC station.

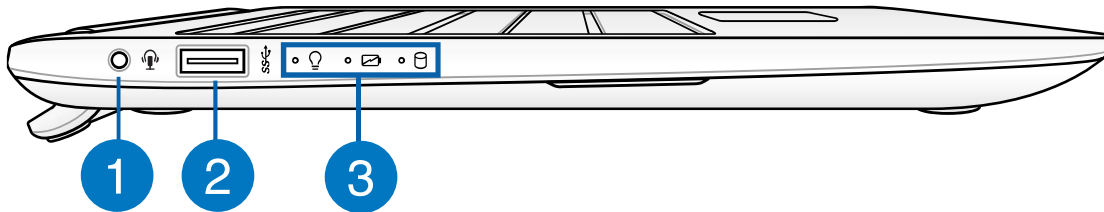
When running your ASUS Transformer Book Trio in power adapter mode, both the PC station and tablet's battery can be charged through this port.

WARNING! The adapter may become warm to hot while in use. Ensure not to cover the adapter and keep it away from your body while it is connected to a power source.

IMPORTANT! Use only the bundled power adapter to connect your PC station with a nearby power outlet.

Left Side



1

Headphone output/microphone input combo jack port

This port allows you to connect your PC station to amplified speakers or headphones. You can also use this port to connect your PC station to an external microphone.

2

USB 3.0 port (for Windows® 8)

This USB (Universal Serial Bus) 3.0 port provides a transfer rate of up to 5 Gbit/s and is backward compatible to USB 2.0.

USB 2.0 port (for Android®)

This USB (Universal Serial Bus) port is compatible with USB 2.0 or USB 1.1 devices such as keyboards, pointing devices, flash disk drives, external HDDs, speakers, cameras and printers.

Status indicators

The status indicators help identify the current hardware status of your PC station.



Power indicator

The power indicator lights up when the PC station is turned on and blinks slowly when the PC station is in sleep mode. It also indicates that Windows® 8 is already booted up.

Two-color battery charge indicator

The two-color LED provides a visual indication of the ASUS Transformer Book Trio's battery charge status. Refer to the **LED Color Table** below for more details.

LED Color Table

Color	Status
Solid Green	The PC station is plugged to a power source, charging its battery, and the battery power is between 95% and 100%.
Solid Orange	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The PC station is plugged to a power source, charging its battery, and the battery power is less than 95%.• The tablet is connected to the PC station, charging its battery, and the tablet's battery power is less than 30%.
<hr/> <p>NOTE: This charging process is automatically enabled even while your system is on sleep mode or turned off.</p> <hr/>	
Blinking Orange	The PC station is running on battery mode and the battery power is less than 10%.
Lights off	The PC station is running on battery mode and the battery power is between 10% to 100%.

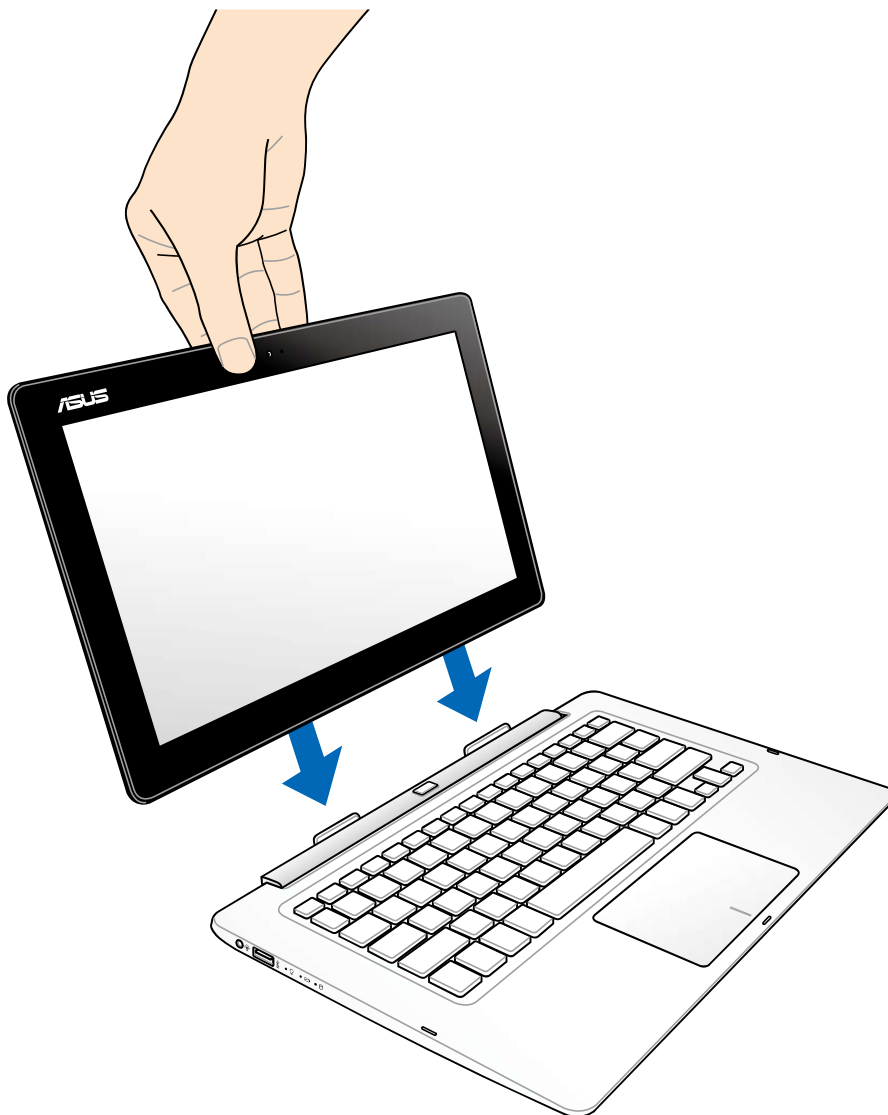
Drive activity indicator

This indicator lights up when your PC station is accessing the internal storage drives.

Transforming your devices into an ASUS Transformer Book Trio

To use both devices as an ASUS Transformer Book Trio, align the tablet with the PC station connectors as illustrated below.

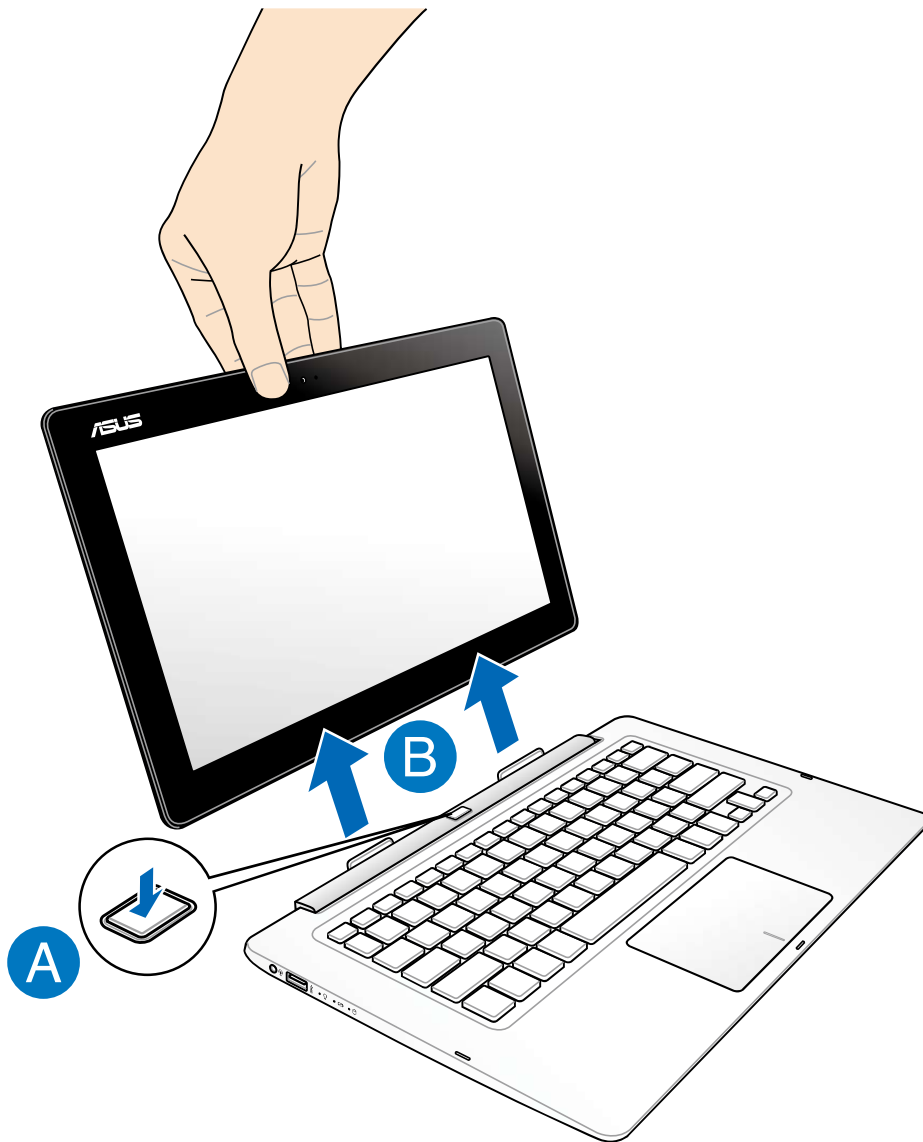
NOTE: The PC station slots and the PC station connectors contain magnetized parts. The pull between these magnets help align the tablet so that it is properly inserted into the PC station hinge.



Undocking the tablet from the PC station

To use your tablet or PC station as separate devices, undock the tablet from the PC station as shown in the illustration below.

- A. Press the tablet release button to detach the tablet from the PC station.
- B. Pull out the tablet from the PC station hinge.



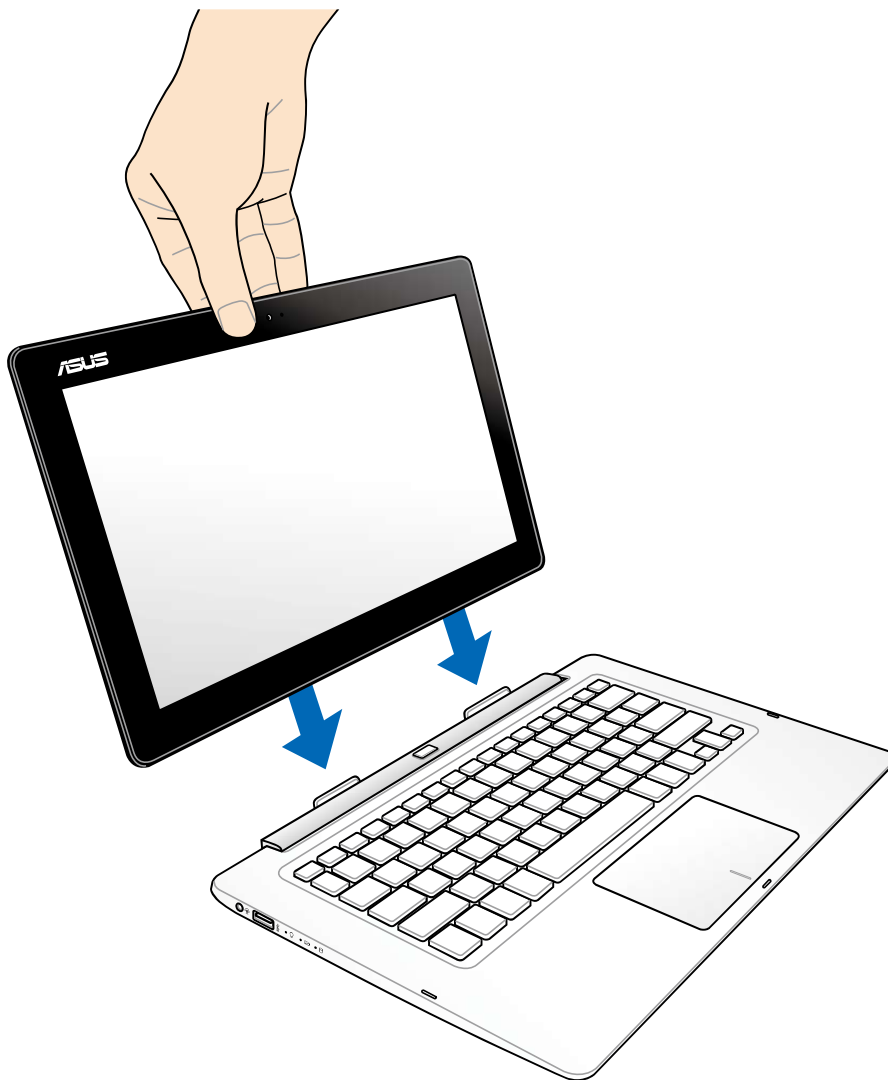
Chapter 2: ***Getting started***

Setting up your device

Using your ASUS Transformer Book Trio

Refer to the following steps when setting up your ASUS Transformer Book Trio.

1. Dock the tablet into the PC station.

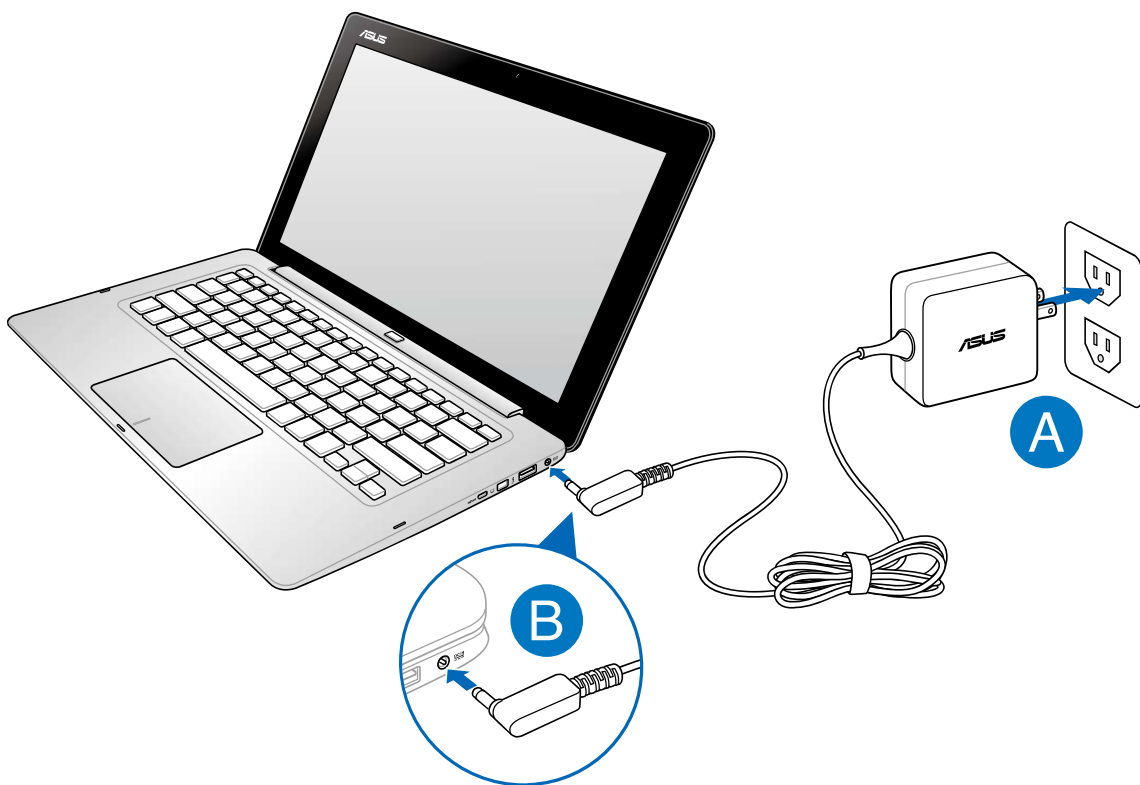


2. Charge your ASUS Transformer Book Trio.
 - A. Plug the AC power adapter into a 100V~240V power source.
 - B. Connect the DC power connector into your ASUS Transformer Book Trio's power (DC) input.



Charge the ASUS Transformer Book Trio for **3 hours** before using it in battery mode for the first time.

NOTE: The power adapter may vary in appearance, depending on models and your region.



IMPORTANT!

- Locate the input/output rating label on your ASUS Transformer Book Trio and ensure that it matches the input/output rating information on your power adapter. Some ASUS Transformer Book Trio models may have multiple rating output currents based on the available SKU.
 - Ensure that your ASUS Transformer Book Trio is connected to the power adapter before turning it on for the first time. We strongly recommend that you use a grounded wall socket while using your ASUS Transformer Book Trio on power adapter mode.
 - The socket outlet must be easily accessible and near your ASUS Transformer Book Trio.
 - To disconnect your ASUS Transformer Book Trio from its main power supply, unplug your ASUS Transformer Book Trio from the power socket.

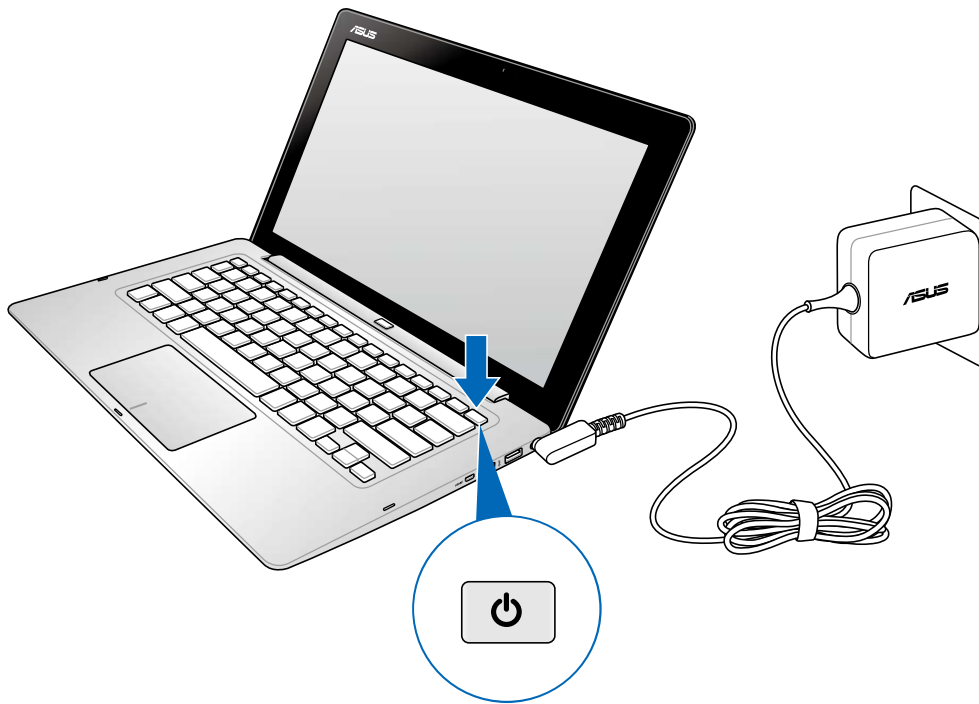

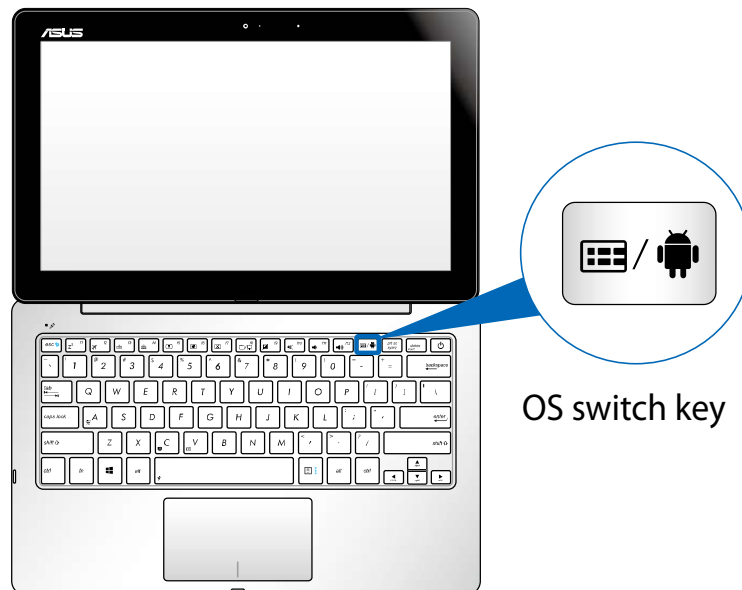
3. Press the power button on your PC station.

IMPORTANT! When using your ASUS Transformer Book Trio for the first time, ensure that the device is running on power adapter mode when you press the power button to unlock the BIOS settings.



Using the operating system (OS) switch key

When the tablet and the PC station are used individually, they run using their respective operating systems. But when both devices are connected and used as an ASUS Transformer Book Trio, you can use Android® or Windows® 8 interchangeably using the operating system (OS) switch key.



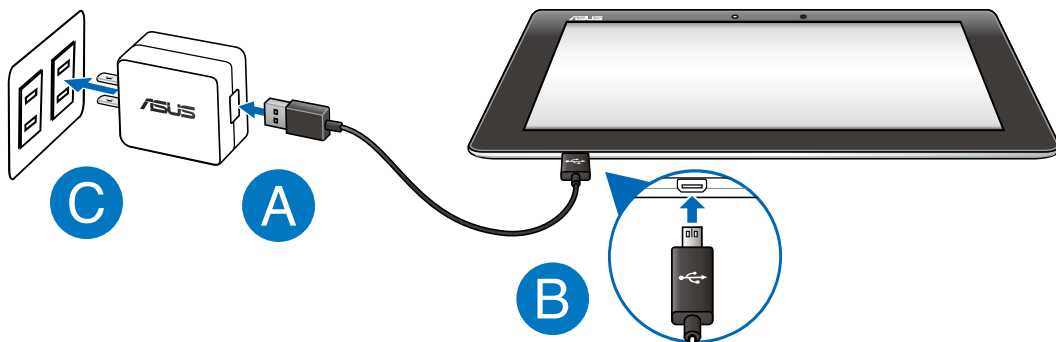
To guide you through the process of switching between Android® or Windows® 8, pop-up menus appear whenever you press the switch key under the following scenarios:

1. Android® is running, Windows®8 is off.
2. Windows® 8 is running, Android®8 is off.
3. Both Android® and Windows® 8 are running

Using the tablet

Refer to the following steps when using the tablet as a separate device.

1. If you need to charge your tablet, connect it to a power source through the following:
 - A. Connect the micro USB cable to the power adapter.
 - B. Plug the micro USB connector into your tablet.
 - C. Plug the power adapter into a grounded power outlet.



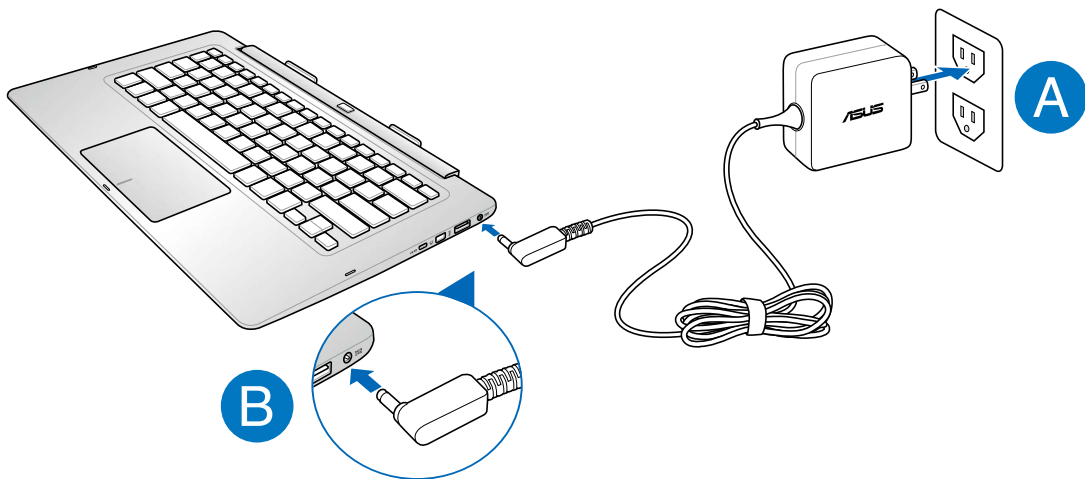
2. Press the power button on your tablet.



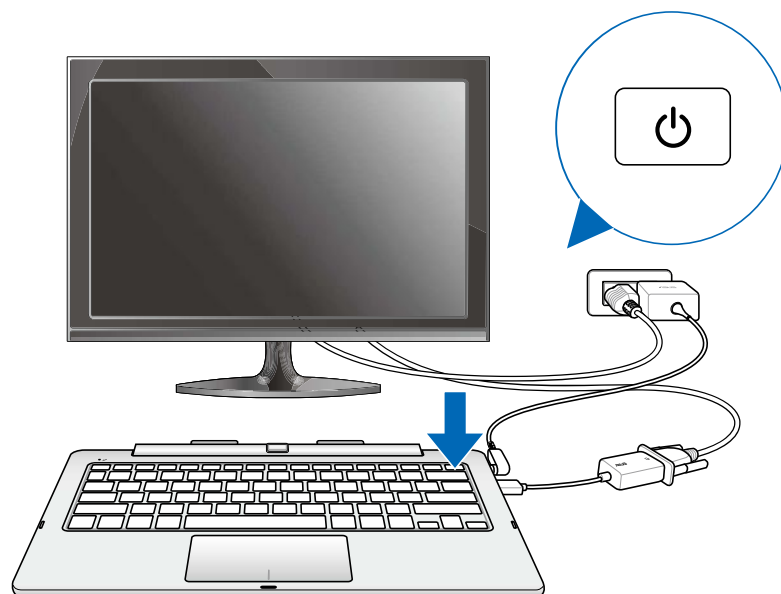
Using the PC station

Refer to the following steps when using your PC station as a separate device.

1. Connect your PC station to an external display.
2. Connect your PC station to a power outlet:
 - A. Plug the AC power adapter into a 100V~240V power source.
 - B. Connect the DC power connector into your PC station's power (DC) input port.



3. Press the power button on your PC station.



Gestures for the touch screen panel and touchpad

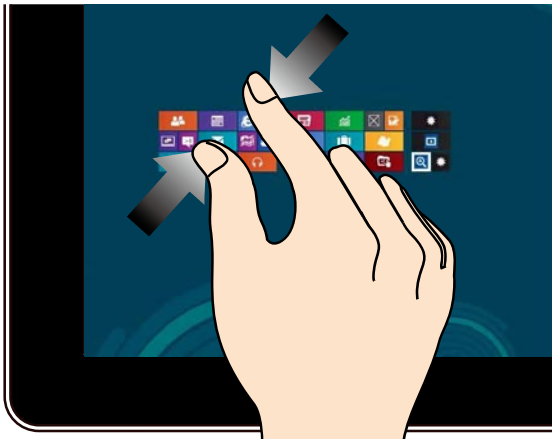

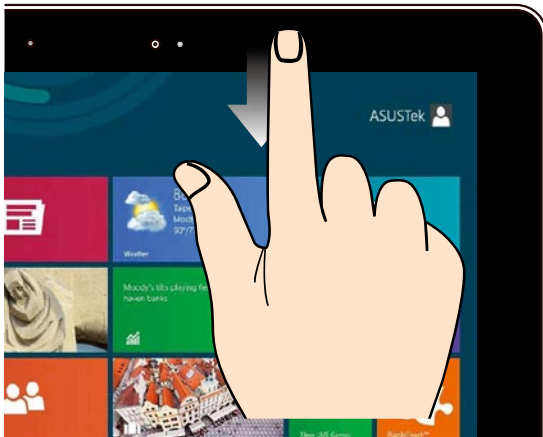

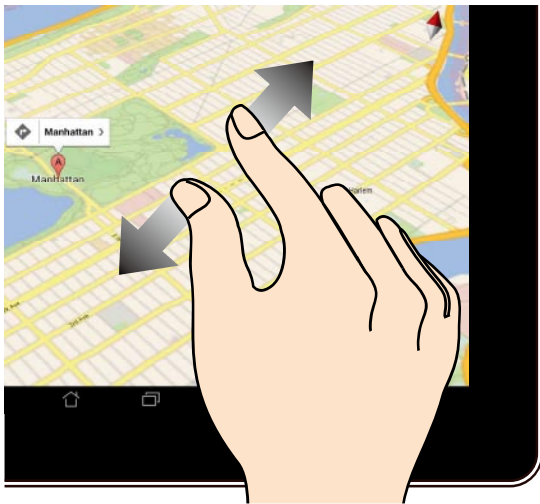
Drag/Tap and hold/Long press

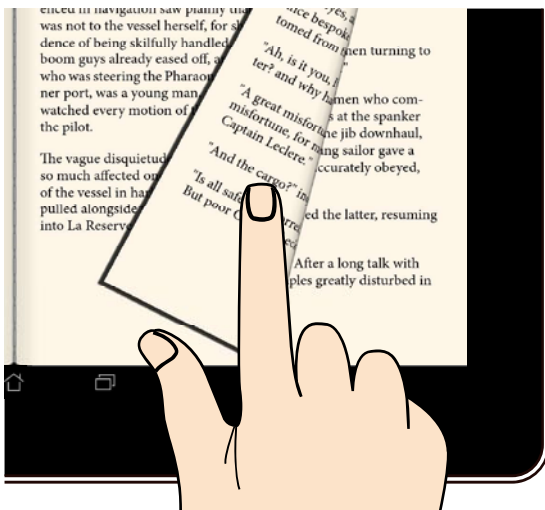

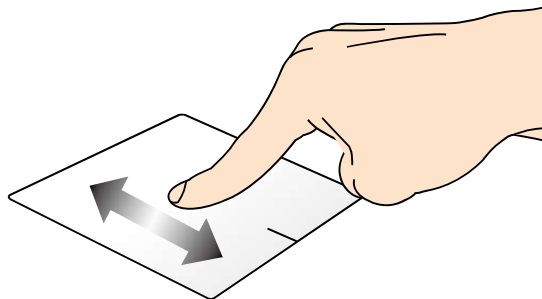

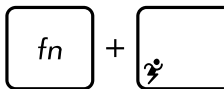

Windows® 8 keys

There are two special Windows® keys on your ASUS Transformer Book Trio's keyboard used as below:



Press this key to go back to the Start screen. If you are already in the Start screen, press this key to go back to the last app you opened.



Press this key to simulate the right-click functions.

Chapter 3: ***Working with Windows® 8***

Starting for the first time

When you start your computer for the first time, a series of screens appear to guide you in configuring the basic settings of the Windows® 8 operating system.

To start your Windows® 8 for the first time:

1. Press the power button on your PC station. Wait for a few minutes until the setup screen appears.
2. From the setup screen, pick a language to use on your ASUS Transformer Book Trio.
3. Carefully read the License Terms. Tick **I accept the terms for using Windows** then click **Accept**.
4. Follow the onscreen instructions to configure the following basic items:
 - Keep your PC secure
 - Personalize
 - Wireless
 - Settings
 - Sign in to your PC
5. After configuring the basic items, the Windows®8 tutorial appears. Watch this to learn more about Windows®8 functionalities.

Windows® 8 lock screen

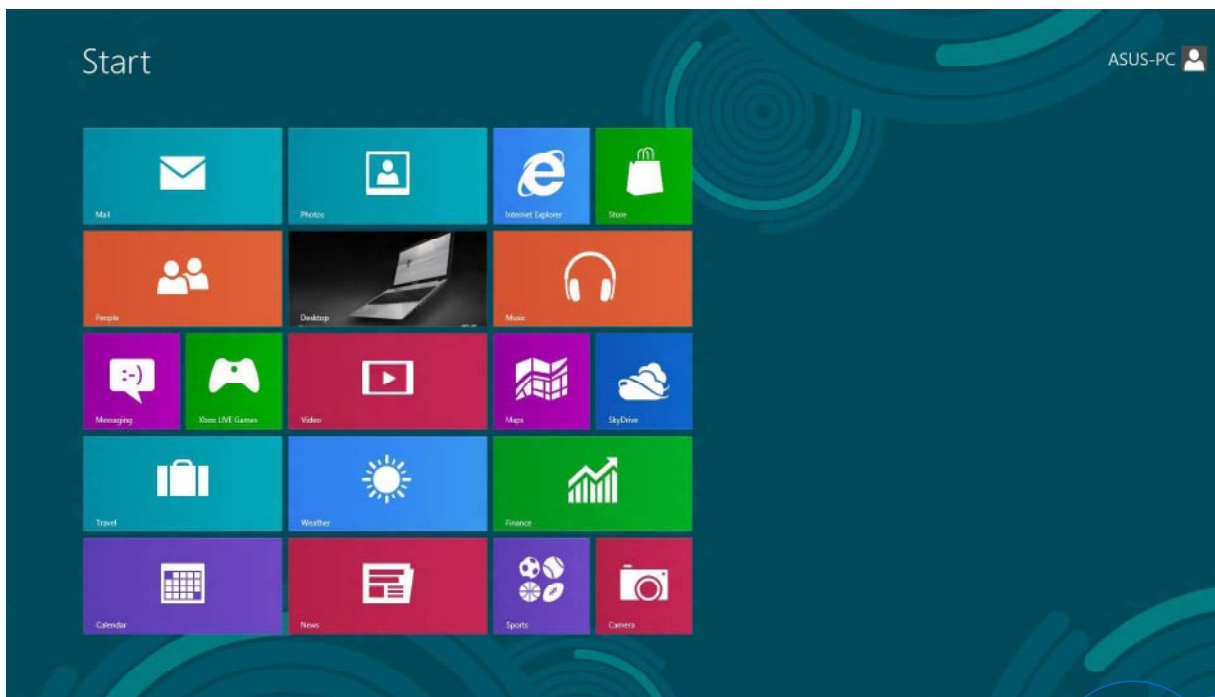
The Windows®8 lock screen may appear when your ASUS Transformer Book Trio enters the Windows®8 operating system. To proceed, tap on the lock screen or press any key on your PC station's keyboard.

Windows® UI

Windows® 8 comes with a tile-based user interface (UI) which allows you to organize and easily access Windows® apps from the Start screen. It also includes the following features that you can use while working on your ASUS Transformer Book Trio.

Start screen

The Start screen appears after successfully signing in to your user account. It helps organize all the applications you need in just one place.

Windows® Apps

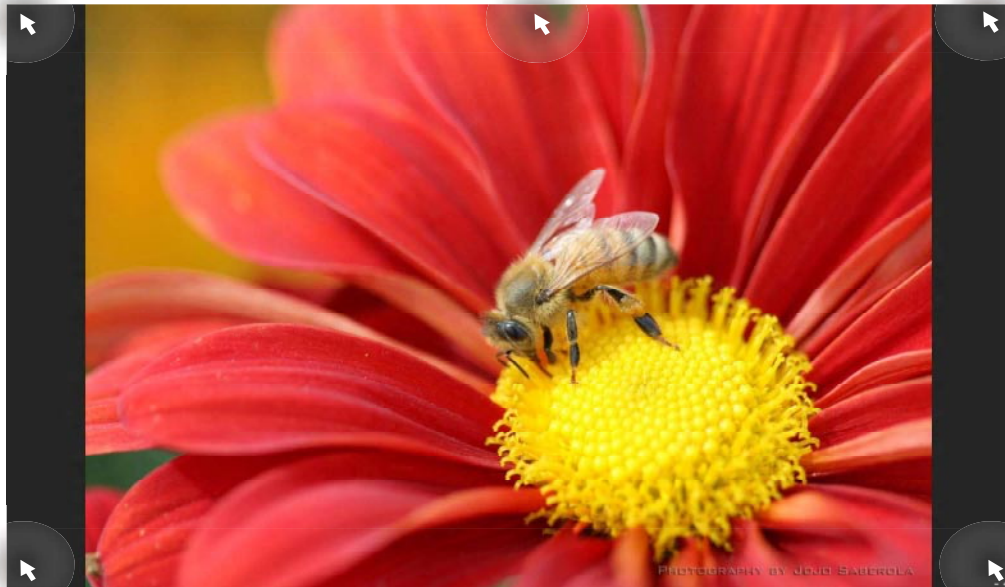
These are apps pinned on the Start screen and displayed on tiled-format for easy access.

NOTE: Some apps require signing in to your Microsoft account before they are fully launched.

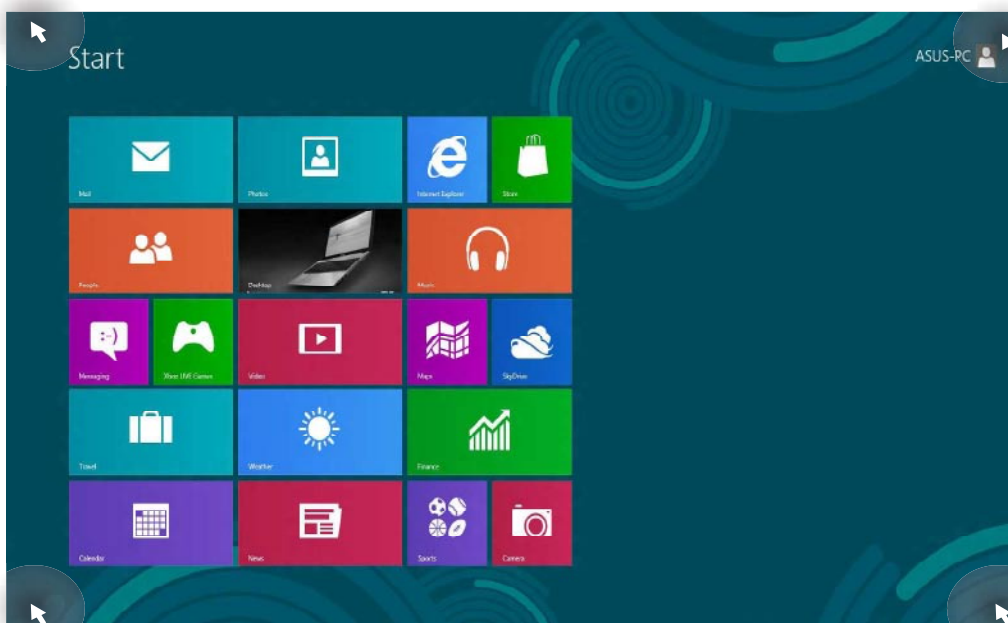
Hotspots

Starting up for the first time

When you turn on your tablet for the first time, a series of steps appear to guide you in configuring the basic settings of your Android® operating system.

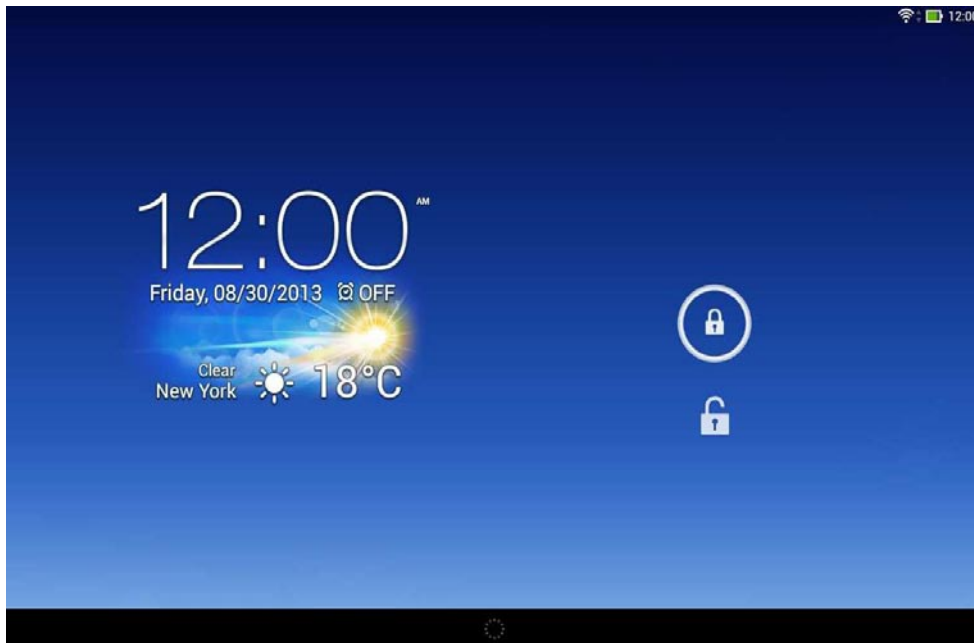
To start your tablet for the first time:

1. Turn your tablet on.
2. Choose a language, then tap .
3. Select an input method or keyboard format, then tap .
4. From the list of available Wi-Fi networks, tap a network name then tap . To skip connecting to a network, tap .

NOTE: Some Wi-Fi networks may prompt you to key in a passcode.

5. Select the data synchronization, then tap .
6. Set up the account you want to use for accessing email, social networking sites, and downloading content to your device by tapping **Add account**. Follow the succeeding instructions then tap .
7. Enable the settings for Google Location then tap .
8. Set the date and time then tap  to enter the home screen.

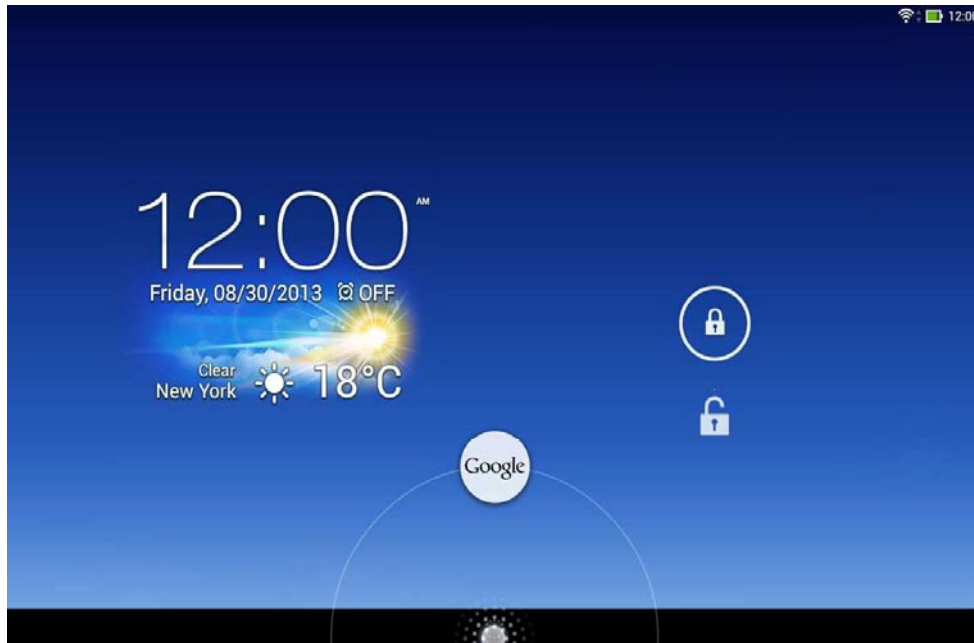

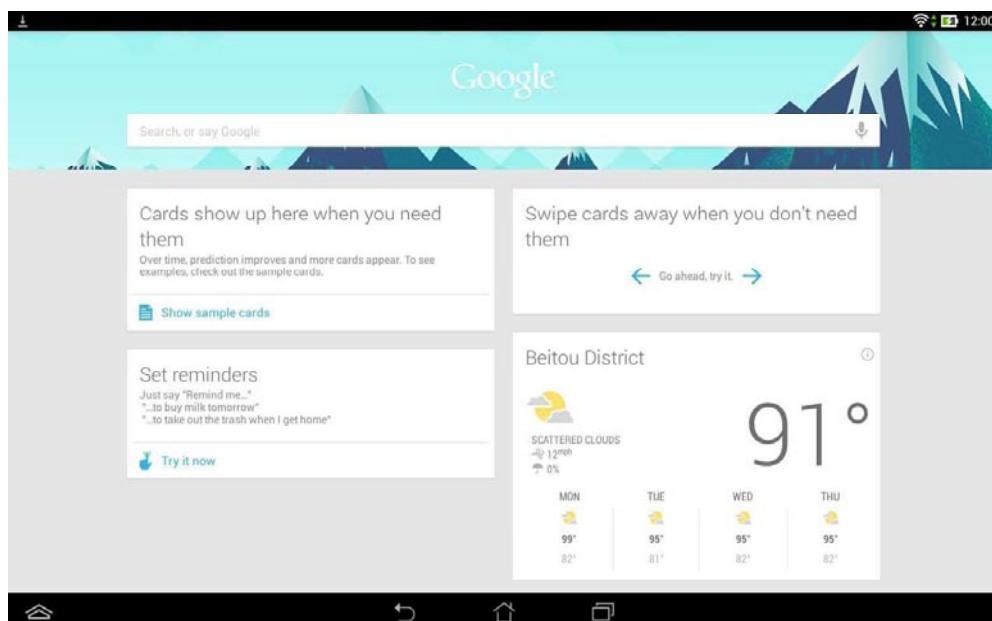

The built-in gravity-sensor of your ASUS Transformer Book Trio enables automatic screen rotations depending on how you hold it. You can quickly switch between a landscape or portrait view by steering your ASUS Transformer Book Trio to the left or to the right.

Locking the screen orientation

By default, your ASUS Transformer Book Trio screen automatically changes its orientation from portrait mode to landscape mode or vice-versa, depending on the way you hold your device.

You can disable the auto-rotate screen function by following these steps:

1. Tap  on the Home Screen to open All Apps screen.
2. Tap  > **Accessibility** then tap **Auto-rotate screen** to deselect.

NOTE: You can also enable or disable this function from the ASUS Quick Settings. Refer to section **Settings** for more details.



Connecting to the world

Connecting to Wi-Fi networks

Wi-Fi wireless networking technology allows you to exchange data wirelessly over a network. To use Wi-Fi, enable the Wi-Fi feature in your ASUS Transformer Book Trio and connect to a wireless network. Some wireless networks are secured with a key or protected with digital certificates and requires additional steps to set up; others are open and you can easily connect to them.

NOTE: Turn Wi-Fi off when you are not using it to help save battery power.

To enable Wi-Fi and connect to a Wi-Fi network:

1. Tap  to go to the All Apps screen then tap  .
Settings
2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to ON. When enabled, your ASUS Transformer Book Trio scans for available Wi-Fi networks.
3. Tap a network name to connect to it. If the network is secured or protected, you are prompted to key in a password or key in other credentials.

NOTE: If your ASUS Transformer Book Trio finds a network that you have connected to previously, it automatically connects to it.

Using Bluetooth

Enabling or disabling Bluetooth in your device




Bluetooth is a wireless standard used for exchanging data over short distances. Bluetooth exists in many products, such as smartphones, computers, tablet devices, and headsets.

Bluetooth is very useful when transferring data between two or more devices that are near each other.

The first time you connect to a Bluetooth device, you must pair it with your ASUS Transformer Book Trio.

NOTE: Turn Bluetooth off when you are not using it to help save battery power.



To enable or disable Bluetooth in your ASUS Transformer Book Trio, you can do any of the following:

- Tap  to go to the All Apps screen then tap . Slide the Bluetooth switch to **ON**
- Slide down the Notification area to display **ASUS Quick Settings** panel then tap .

Pairing your ASUS Transformer Book Trio with a Bluetooth device

Before you can connect to a Bluetooth device, you must first pair your ASUS Transformer Book Trio to that device. The devices stay paired, unless you remove the paired connection between them.

To pair your ASUS Transformer Book Trio to a device:

1. Tap  to go to the All Apps screen then tap . Slide the Bluetooth switch to **ON**.
2. Tap **Bluetooth** to display all available Bluetooth devices within range.

NOTES:



- If the device you want to pair with is not in the list, ensure that its Bluetooth feature is turned ON and set as Discoverable.
 - See the technical documentation that came with the device to learn how to turn its Bluetooth ON and how to set it to discoverable.

3. If your ASUS Transformer Book Trio has finished scanning before your Bluetooth device is ready, tap **SEARCH FOR DEVICES**.
4. In the list of available devices, tap the Bluetooth device that you want to pair with. Follow the succeeding screen instructions to complete the pairing. If necessary, refer to the technical documentation that came with the device.

Connecting your ASUS Transformer Book Trio to a Bluetooth device




After you have paired your ASUS Transformer Book Trio to a Bluetooth device, you can easily reconnect to it manually, after it is back in range.

To connect to a Bluetooth device:

1. Tap  to go to the All Apps screen then tap . Slide the Bluetooth switch to **ON**.
2. In the list of PAIRED DEVICES, tap the name of the paired device.

Unpairing and configuring a Bluetooth device

To unpair or configure a Bluetooth device:


1. Tap  to go to the All Apps screen then tap . Slide the Bluetooth switch to **ON**.
2. Tap **Bluetooth** then tap beside the connected Bluetooth device that you want to unpair or configure.
3. From Paired Bluetooth device screen, you can do any of the following:
 - Tap **Unpair** to unpair the device.
 - Tap **Rename** to rename the Bluetooth device.
 - Tap any of the listed profiles to enable or disable a profile.
4. Tap  on the system bar to go back to previous screen.

Managing Apps

Creating app shortcuts

Get easy access to some of your favorite applications by creating app shortcuts on your Home Screen.

To create app shortcuts:

1. Tap  to go to the All Apps screen.
2. From the All Apps screen, tap and hold the app's icon then drag it to the Home Screen.

Removing an app from the Home Screen

Free up space for new app shortcuts by removing existing app shortcuts on your Home Screen.

To remove app shortcuts:

1. Tap and hold an app until the **X Remove** appears on top of the screen.
2. Drag the app to **X Remove** to remove it from the Home Screen.



Viewing app info

You can view the detailed app information while creating a shortcut for the app. While holding an app on the All Apps screen, the display switches to Home Screen and the **App info** will appear on the top of the Home Screen display. Drag the app to **App info** to display its detailed information.



Creating app folder

You can create folders to organize shortcuts on your Home Screen.

To create an app folder:

1. On the Home Screen, tap and drag an app or shortcut onto another app until a black circle appears.

NOTES:

- The created folder is shown in a black square.
 - You can add multiple apps in your folder.

2. Tap the folder and tap **Unnamed Folder** to rename the folder.

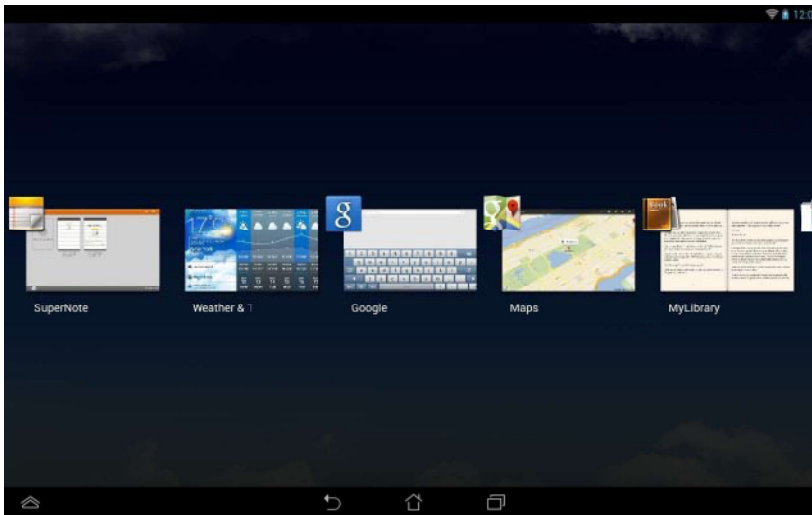


Viewing apps under the Recents screen

The Recents screen allows you to view a list of app shortcuts based from your recently launched apps. Using the Recents screen, you can easily go back to or switch between the apps you recently launched.

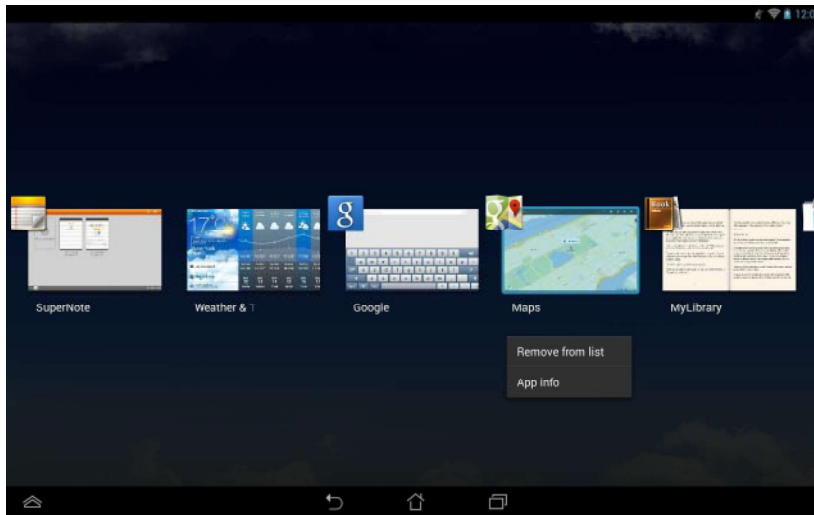
To access the Recents screen:

1. Tap  on the system bar.
2. A list shows up to display all of your recently launched apps. Tap on the app you want to launch.



To view a recent app's menu:

1. Tap and hold a recent app to display its menu.
2. To remove the app from the list, select **Remove from list**. To view its information, select **App info**.




NOTE: You can also remove a recent app from the list by swiping it up or down.

Task Manager

ASUS Task Manager displays a list of currently running utilities and applications, including their usages in percentages, on your ASUS Transformer Book Trio. You can also open and close the running apps individually or close all apps and utilities at once using the **One-click Clean** function.


To manage Task Manager:

1. Tap  to go to the All Apps screen then tap **WIDGETS** to display the Widgets menu.
2. Tap and hold **ASUS Task Manager** to display the ASUS Task Manager box on the Home Screen.



3. Swipe the list up and down to view all launched apps.






4. Tap  beside the running app to close it. Tap **One-click Clean** to close all running apps at once.

File Manager

File Manager allows you to easily locate and manage your data either on the internal storage or the connected external storage devices.



Accessing the internal storage

To access the internal storage:

1. Tap  to go to the All Apps screen.
2. Tap  > **Internal Storage** on the left panel to view the contents of your ASUS Transformer Book Trio then tap an item to select. If a microSD card is inserted, tap **MicroSD** to view the contents of your microSD card.
3. Tap  to return to the root directory of My Storage.

Accessing the external storage device

To access the external storage device:

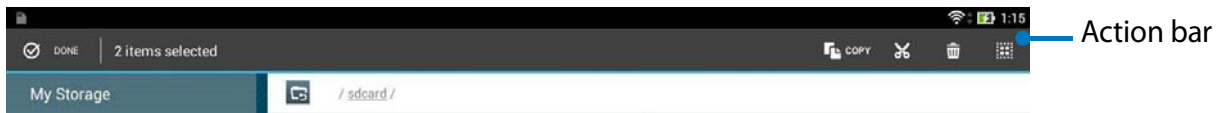

Settings screen allows you to configure the system settings of your ASUS Transformer Book Trio. With this system app, you can configure your ASUS Transformer Book Trio's wireless connectivity, hardware, personal, account and system settings.

There are two ways to launch the Settings screen.

1. From the All Apps screen, tap  to display the menu.

2. Swipe down the notification bar on top of the screen to display **ASUS Quick Settings** panel then tap .

Turning Android® off

You can shut down your Android® operating system by doing any of the following:

NOTE: The following steps also shuts down your tablet. However, the PC station should be turned off separately when the tablet is docked and used as part of your ASUS Notebook Trio.

- Press the power button for about two (2) seconds and when prompted, tap **Power Off** then tap **OK**.
- If your tablet is unresponsive, press and hold the power button for about seven (7) seconds until your ASUS Transformer Book Trio turns off. This will also reset your Android® OS.

IMPORTANT! Forcing the system to shut down may result to data loss. Ensure that you back up your data regularly.

When you turn on your tablet after resetting, the Setup Wizard would automatically show up and guide you through the process of setting up Android®.

Putting your tablet to sleep

To put your tablet to sleep, press the power button once.

Chapter 5:

Power-on Self Test (POST)

The Power-On SelfTest (POST)

The Power-On Self-Test (POST) is a series of software-controlled diagnostic tests that run when you turn on or restart your ASUS Transformer Book Trio. The software that controls the POST is installed as a permanent part of the ASUS Transformer Book Trio's architecture.

Using POST to access BIOS and Troubleshoot

During POST, you can access the BIOS settings or run troubleshooting options using the function keys of your ASUS Transformer Book Trio. You may refer to the following information for more details.

BIOS

The Basic Input and Output System (BIOS) stores system hardware settings that are needed for system startup in the ASUS Transformer Book Trio.


The default BIOS settings apply to most conditions of your ASUS Transformer Book Trio. Do not change the default BIOS settings except in the following circumstances:

- An error message appears onscreen during system bootup and requests you to run the BIOS Setup.
- You have installed a new system component that requires further BIOS settings or updates.

WARNING: Using inappropriate BIOS settings may result to system instability or boot failure. We strongly recommend that you change the BIOS settings only with the help of a trained service personnel.

Hardware FAQs

1. **A black dot, or sometimes a colored dot, appears onscreen when I turn on the ASUS Transformer Book Trio. What should I do?**

Although these dots normally appear onscreen, they will not affect your system. If the incident continues and subsequently affects system performance, consult an authorized ASUS service center.

2. **My display panel has an uneven color and brightness. How can I fix this?**

The color and brightness of your display panel may be affected by the angle and current position of your ASUS Transformer Book Trio. The brightness and color tone of your ASUS Transformer Book Trio may also vary per model. You may use the function keys or the display settings in your operating system to adjust the appearance of your display panel.

3. **How can I maximize my ASUS Transformer Book Trio 's battery life?**



You can try doing any of the following suggestions:

- Use **Battery Mode** under Power4Gear.
- Use the function keys to adjust the display brightness.
- Enable **Battery Saving** mode under Instant On.




2. What should I do when my screen displays this message: "Remove disks or other media. Press any key to restart."?

You can try doing any of the following suggestions:

DVD-ROM Drive Information (on selected models)

The DVD-ROM drive allows you to view and create your own CDs and DVDs. You can purchase an optional DVD viewer software to view DVD titles.

Regional Playback Information

Playback of DVD movie titles involves decoding MPEG2 video, digital AC3 audio and decryption of CSS protected content. CSS (sometimes called copy guard) is the name given to the content protection scheme adopted by the motion picture industry to satisfy a need to protect against unlawful content duplication.

Although the design rules imposed on CSS licensors are many, one rule that is most relevant is playback restrictions on regionalized content. In order to facilitate geographically staggered movie releases, DVD video titles are released for specific geographic regions as defined in "Region Definitions" below. Copyright laws require that all DVD movies be limited to a particular region (usually coded to the region at which it is sold). While DVD movie content may be released for multiple regions, CSS design rules require that any system capable of playing CSS encrypted content must only be capable of playing one region.

IMPORTANT! The region setting may be changed up to five times using the viewer software, then it can only play DVD movies for the last region setting. Changing the region code after that will require factory resetting which is not covered by warranty. If resetting is desired, shipping and resetting costs will be at the expense of the user.

Internal Modem Compliancy

The ASUS Transformer Book Trio with internal modem model complies with JATE (Japan), FCC (US, Canada, Korea, Taiwan), and CTR21. The internal modem has been approved in accordance with Council Decision 98/482/EC for pan-European single terminal connection to the public switched telephone network (PSTN). However due to differences between the individual PSTNs provided in different countries, the approval does not, of itself, give an unconditional assurance of successful operation on every PSTN network termination point. Overview

On 4th August 1998 the European Council Decision regarding the CTR 21 has been published in the Official Journal of the EC. The CTR 21 applies to all non voice terminal equipment with DTMF-dialling which is intended to be connected to the analogue PSTN (Public Switched Telephone Network).

CTR 21 (Common Technical Regulation) for the attachment requirements for connection to the analogue public switched telephone networks of terminal equipment (excluding terminal equipment supporting the voice telephony justified case service) in which network addressing, if provided, is by means of dual tone multifrequency signalling.

Network Compatibility Declaration

Statement to be made by the manufacturer to the Notified Body and the vendor: "This declaration will indicate the networks with which the equipment is designed to work and any notified networks with which the equipment may have inter-working difficulties."

Answering machines and loud-speaking telephones can be eligible as well as modems, fax machines, auto-dialers and alarm systems. Equipment in which the end-to-end quality of speech is controlled by regulations (e.g. handset telephones and in some countries also cordless telephones) is excluded.
