Test Method:

The sample was placed 0.8m above the ground plane on the OATS *. Measurements in both horizontal and vertical polarities were performed. During the test, each emission was maximized by: having the EUT continuously working, investigate all operating modes, rotated about all 3 axis (X, Y & Z) to obtain worst position, manipulating interconnecting cables, rotating turntable, varying antenna height from 1m to 4m in both horizontal and vertical polarization. The emissions worst-case are shown in Test Results of the following pages.

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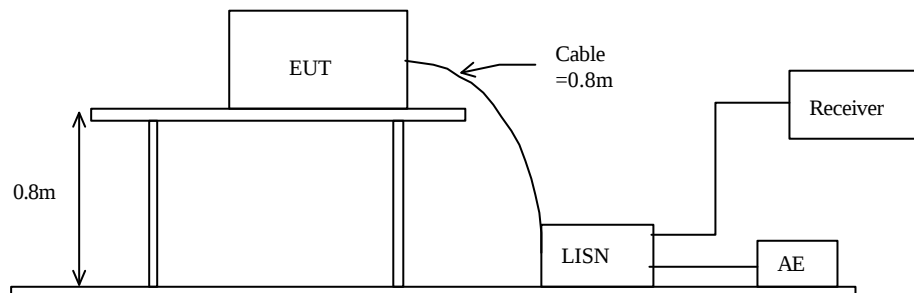

The test was performed in accordance with ANSI C63.4:2000, with the following: an initial measurement was performed in peak and average detection mode on the live line. Any emissions recorded within 30dB of the relevant limit line were re-measured using quasi-peak and average detection on the live and neutral lines with the worst case recorded in the table of results.

The bandwidth is measured at an amplitude level reduced from the reference level by a specified ratio. The reference level is the level of the highest amplitude signal observed from the transmitter at the fundamental frequency. Once the reference level is established, the equipment is conditioned with typical modulating signal to produce the worst-case (i.e. the widest) bandwidth.

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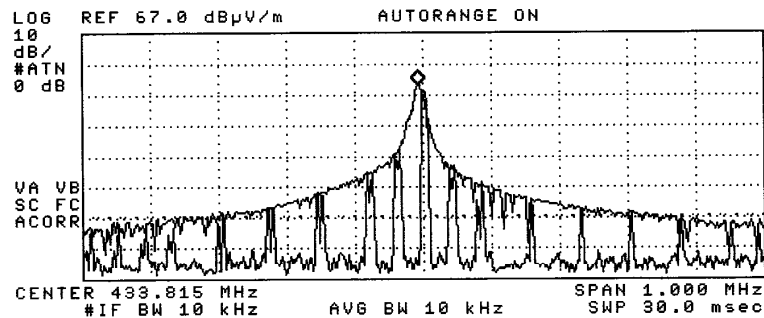

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Appendix B**Duty Cycle Correction During 100msec**

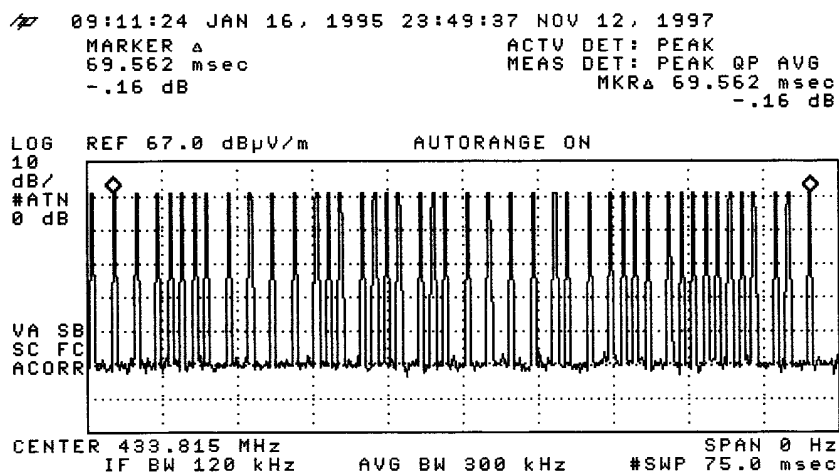
Each function key sends a different series of characters, but each packet period (69.562msec) never exceeds a series of 42 long or short (250µsec) pules. Assuming any combination of short and long pules may be obtained due to encoding the worse case transmit duty cycle would be considered $42 \times 250\mu\text{sec}$ per 69.562msec=15% duty cycle. Figure A through C show the characteristics of the pulse train for one of these function.

Remarks:

$$\text{Duty Cycle Correction} = 20\text{Log}(0.15) = -16.4\text{dB}$$

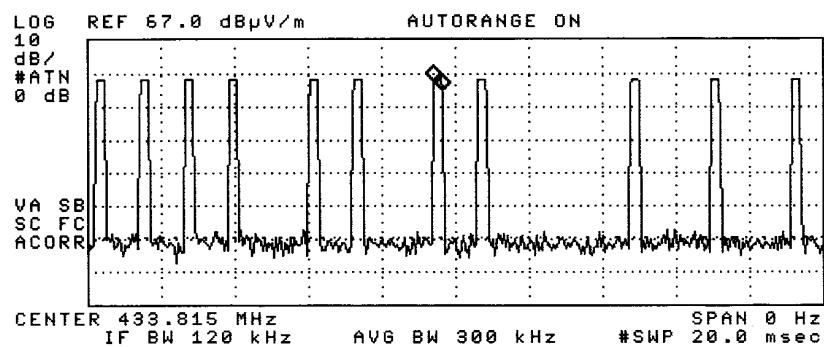
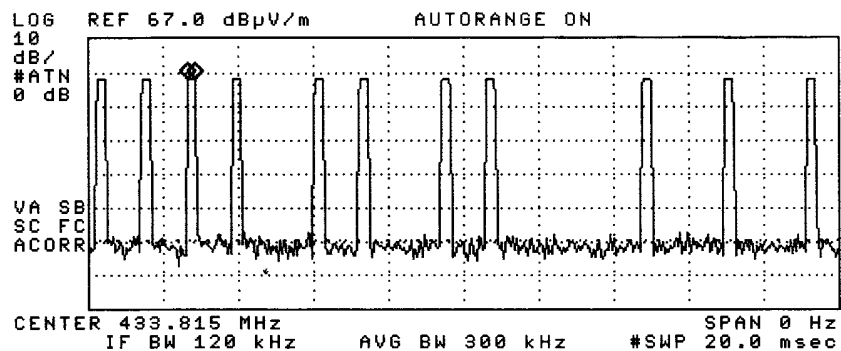


Figure C [Short Pulse]

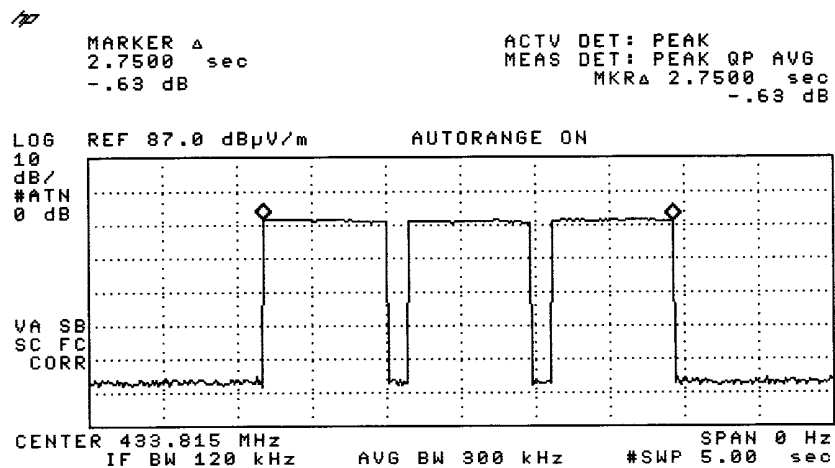

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Periodic Operation [FCC 47CFR 15.231a]

According to FCC 47CFR15.231a. A transmitter manually activated must automatically deactivate within not more than 5 seconds of being released. The transmitter is a 1 button transmitter for registration. The EUT to transmit while button is being pressed. The EUT to transmission 2.75 seconds upon being released and appears to finish the current packet being transmitted. 2.75 seconds as shown in Figure D.

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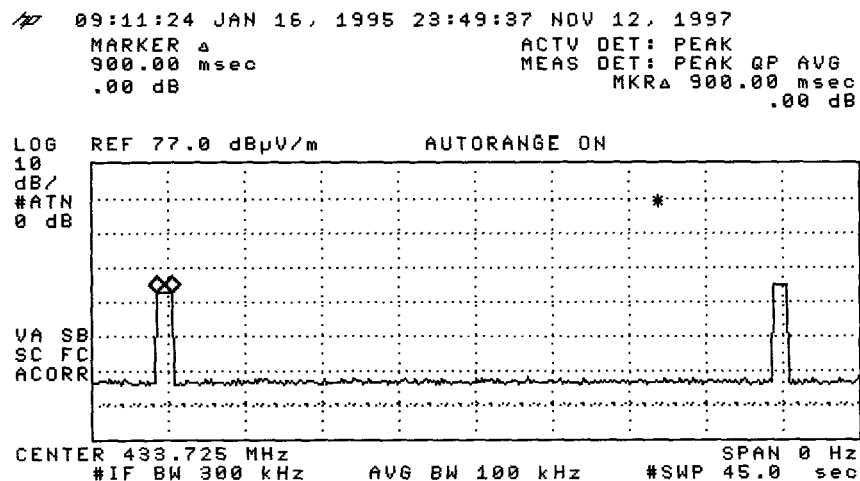
Appendix C**Periodic Operation [FCC 47CFR 15.231e]**

According to FCC 47CFR15.231e. The EUT shall be provided with a means for automatically limiting operation so that the duration of each transmission shall not be greater than one second and the silent period between transmissions shall be at least 30 times the duration of the transmission but in no case less than 10 seconds.

Results:

Since the EUT of each transmission is 900 msec, so the silent period must not less than 27 seconds (900msec x 30).

Figure E [Each transmission]

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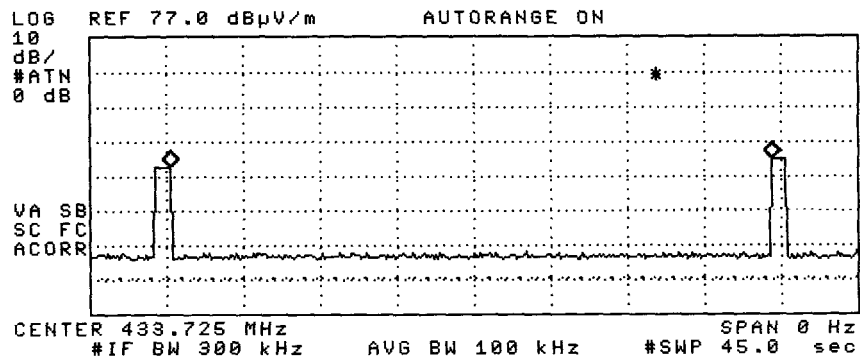

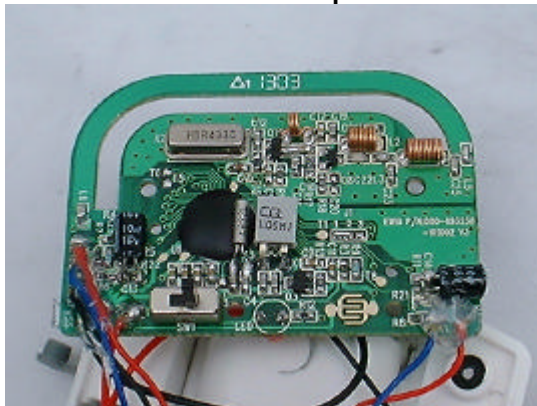
Front View of the product



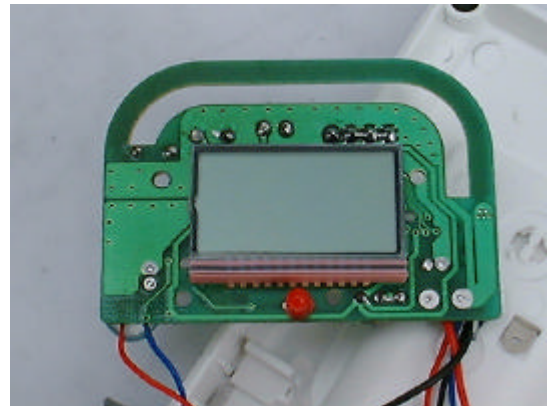
Rear View of the product
