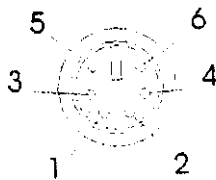

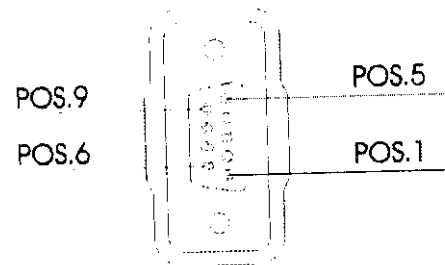
CABLE, ADAPTER&CONNECTORS:

The serial mouse cable is 5 ft long coiler cable. Ther mouse cable is corected to computer host unit through a 9-pin D-subminiature comector. If you have a ps/2 port, you can connect an adapter on the 9-pin D-subminiature connector to change the serial mouse as a ps/2 mouse. The following figure lists the connector pins and their signals.
